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Clearing The Air

We are required by law to bring our vehicles and pass a test for carbon emissions here in Illinois, otherwise vou wouldn't be able to renew your vehicles registration. If you don't, you'll have your drivers license suspended and be fined. Mind you, there are NO testing facilities in the City of Chicago, where there are over 2 million registered vehicles! There are only 2 facilities outside of Chicago that are 4 miles or more from the city, which means hours on the road, contributing to emissions.

I recently had my "check engine" light come on, and had to get it fixed in order to pass the test. Now get this, it was fixed, but mechanic told me I had to drive 75 miles before the emissions facility would allow it to be tested, because the engine light gets reset after the work, and it's brought back to zero mileage. Meanwhile, the biggest offenders to emissions in our atmosphere are those who are jetting across the globe, leaving tonnes of CO2 carbon emissions in the air each and every day, which I can imagine would be more than all the cars emissions combined the world for a month, a year or perhaps more!

While climate change demands a shift towards sustainable practices, some celebrities continue to jet-set around the globe in luxurious private planes, leaving a significant carbon footprint in their wake. Here's a look at top US entertainers and their impact on the environment the most:

TAYLOR SWIFT: Her plane, dubbed "The Falcon," topped the 2023 list by Yard for emitting

a staggering 22,923 tonnes of CO2, equivalent to roughly 1,779 average Americans'



annual emissions. Critics argue this reflects frequent loaning, but the figure raises environmental concerns nonetheless.

FLOYD MAYWEATHER: This boxing



legend's jet logged the most flights (177) in 2023, emitting 7,076.8 tonnes of CO2. Notably, one recorded flight lasted just 10 minutes, highlighting the issue of short, unnecessary trips.

JAY-Z: His Puma-owned jet generated 6,981.3 tonnes of CO2 due to 136 flights. While Puma claims the jet benefits athletes, the rapper's personal usage contributes significantly to emissions.

Private jets emit far more CO2 per passenger than commercial flights, making their environmental



impact disproportionately high. For example, the Mayweather's single 10minute flight mentioned above produced as much CO2 as the

average person emits in an entire year. These short hops, often within the same state, raise questions about the necessity of private jets for short distances.

The issue goes beyond mere statistics. These celebrities, with their immense influence, could be leading by example, promoting sustainable travel choices and advocating for climate action. Instead, their frequent private jet use sends a conflicting message, undermining their potential to be positive environmental role models.

While celebrities have the right to choose their travel options, public awareness of the environmental consequences of



private jet use is crucial. Holding them accountable and encouraging them to make more sustainable choices, even for business or leisure, can push the needle toward a greener future. Ultimately, celebrities have the power to influence societal norms and set a positive example for environmentally conscious living.

Clearing The Air

Alongside the previously mentioned jetsetters, several other US entertainers and high-profile personalities contribute significantly to private jet emissions. Here are more names on the top of the list.

KYLIE JENNER: The youngest Kardashian-Jenner sister notoriously logged 174 flights on her Global 7500 aircraft in 2023, emitting an estimated



4,465 tonnes of CO2. Many flights covered short distances, like one 12-minute hop from Van Nuys, California to Camarillo, California. This reality TV star and makeup mogul's jet, nicknamed "Kylie Air," came under fire in 2019 for taking a 17-minute flight, highlighting the issue of extremely short trips with

immense environmental impact. Her estimated annual CO2 emissions from private jet travel are around 4,465 tonnes.

TRAVIS SCOTT: Kylie's partner, rapper Travis Scott, also makes frequent use of private jets,

with his Gulfstream G650 generating 3,975.5 tonnes of CO2 from 130 flights in 2023. Similar to boxing super star Mayweather, some flights clocked in at under 30 minutes. The rapper's jet, dubbed



"Cactus Jack," logged 153 flights in 2023.

DRAKE: This Canadian rapper's Boeing 737 "Air Drake" is a behemoth in the sky, contributing an

estimated 3,590.3 tonnes of CO2 from 109 flights in 2023. While Drake justifies the jet for touring and business needs, its sheer size and



frequent usage remain an environmental concern. While details on specific flights are limited, Drake's frequent global travel undeniably adds to the overall carbon footprint of celebrity private jet usage.

KIM KARDASHIAN: Keeping up with the family's jet-setting ways, Kim Kardashian's Gulfstream



G650 emitted 3,430.5 tonnes of CO2 from 142 flights in 2023. Notably, the reality TV star and businesswoman often uses the jet for personal trips, highlighting the issue of luxury travel's environmental impact. The reality TV star and

entrepreneur's jet, dubbed "Kim Air," involve frequent private jet trips, contributing to the environmental burden.

OPRAH WINFREY: Even media mogul Oprah Winfrey isn't immune to the allure of private jets.

Her Global Express XRS emitted 3,295.4 tonnes of CO2 from 94 flights in 2023. While known for her philanthropic efforts, Oprah's jet, dubbed



"Oprah's Gulfstream," adds to celebrity emissions.

Of course, these are just a few that are seemingly the worst offenders from data collected from various sources, and doesn't get to the hard core facts. I can only imaging that by digging deeper, professional researched data would uncover a lot more than the tips of the iceberg that we see. The objective here is to raise awareness about the issue and encourage a broader conversation about sustainable travel choices, even among the elite.

There are ways for celebrities and high-profile individuals

to mitigate the environmental impact of their private jet travel. These include offsetting their carbon emissions by Investing in renewable energy projects or



carbon capture technologies can help compensate for the CO2 generated by their flights. They also can choose the best fuelefficient jets and opting for newer models with lower emissions can make a significant difference.

Another way is by flying strategically. Meaning combining trips, avoiding unnecessary short hops, and maximizing passenger capacity can reduce the environmental footprint.

Ultimately, the responsibility for promoting sustainable travel lies with everyone, celebrities and elites included. By making conscious choices and advocating for environmentally responsible practices, we can all contribute to a greener future for our planet.

THE GOOD

There are usually a handful of bands that specialize in recreating the original group. To my knowledge, there are quite a few Steely Dan cover bands but I was impressed with these 13 talented musicians.



All heavy weights in the music industry. We were in for quite an evening as popular hits such as "Black Cow", "Do It Again", "Aja" were played. There were a few jam sessions allowing for the legendary Chicago bassist, Richard Patterson (played with Miles Davis, Michael McDonald, and Boz Scaggs) to display his expertise as well

The group performed "Josie" and "Kid Charlegmane". So much talent in one band but hats of to the female trio/singers. **Ebonie Taylo**r, who belted out a rendition of the **Staple Singer's** "I'll Take You There", **Pamela Rose** who belted out **Ami Stewart's** "Knock On Wood," and **Sally Blandon** singing **Amy Winehouse**.

Now you can look for "Trax Records First Official Podcast," on just about any digital platform! I personally prefer written word like this column. However, I would encourage others to try podcasting if they have been thinking about it. If you have the gift of gab and can just let it flow, then this is easier. No editing required, unless you want to.

Now what's crazy is that you're literally uncensored. I feel that It's liberating being completely uncensored, both here and in the podcast. Believe me, I've been completely and thoroughly warned not to do either of these things. In spite of the warnings, I went ahead anyway. I just got sick of everyone trying to censor me, especially because of legal gag orders. Luckily those on the other side who have disregarded their gag orders are free game. Sometimes I name names, other times I drop hints, but we're the information age, where the truth will eventually come out.

All the big boys say we can't, but we've been here doing it for many years.



Ok we aren't rich, but somehow everyone literally wants to take what we have, or change the way we do things completely! However, it wouldn't be fair not to mention supporters like DJ ThadX, label manager, and fantastic producer, and Mark, my counterpart, who prefers not to be named because he's behind the scenes person that likes his privacy. He is very grounded and a good business professional. He reminds me everyday that Jorge and I are not normal. He also reminds me that we do not live in the real world, but regardless, he respects our creativity and the fact that we won't let anyone stop us.

Speaking of "big boys," let's talk about TaP Music. They do management and publishing. TaP's management roster includes such artists as Caroline Polachek, Lana Del Rey and Ellie Goulding, while its publishing roster boasts Yaeji and Dermot Kennedy and others.

Before TaP launched a massive lawsuit against me, they were managing Dua Lipa and others I mentioned above. TaP's music cofounder, CEO and manager **Ben Mawson**, was also involved with the BBC's Eurovision participation, the United Kingdom's song contest. He also is involved in Sports Management and has offices around the world.

Well the first thing TaP did was contact my attorney. They asked if I would be interested in selling TRAX Records. They said they "would make me a very rich woman," but I would have to step aside. Much to everyones surprise, I simply said no! My husband and other associates could not believe that I did not ask them "how rich and how far!" I am crazy, but I don't give a damn, because it's not about the money! Now when you tell rich and powerful people no, they aren't used to hearing it. So since I didn't sell out, their next course of action was to launch a lawsuit and use Larry Heard and Robert Owens against us! I don't blame the artists, we are all just pawns in the game of big business.

It's how Rockefeller got so rich by buying up the little guys, or crushing them to eliminate the competition. Capitalism 101.

So, they couldn't buy me out, now game was to sue me for copyright infringement and take the ENTIRE COMPANY! At one point during our meeting, they said I could keep proceeds from 50%, if I would just step away... I told them that my answer was again, NO! I wasn't around when those guys signed their contracts, but I imagine and knew what was in them.



Ok, at one point when they told me they wanted their music back, I said YES IMMEDIATELY! That wasn't enough, big boss Mr. Mawson said "if I didn't sell the entire company, he would never stop litigation!" So the playbook strategy for those who don't sell out is to sue them, tie them up in litigation involving them with a long and costly legal battle, until ultimately they run out of money. Look up "predatory practice," the game plan is big no secret!

I asked Mr. Mawson why someone as big as him wanted to take away my little company? He managed Dua Lipa, and she was one of the biggest pop stars in the world. I told him that my new artists and I were happy the way we were. He said "we have a better way." Well like Jorge said, "who the hell are they and what do they do?"

Have you heard of 211? It's a free hotline connecting people to everyday services and are working to make connecting with health and social service support easier. 211 Metro Chicago is a free 24-hour helpline that serves Chicago and the suburban Cook County area. It's essentially a referral service with an extensive database of organizations and businesses. It's a partnership between United Way, the city of Chicago and Cook County.

The service is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. "There's bilingual services in English and Spanish, but whatever language you call in, we will find someone who can translate for you.

The 211 hotline has assisted more than 100,000 people across Cook County. The service is free, and you can reach them by calling, texting or asking a question through the 211 Metro Chicago website.

Here is a list of (x)11 numbers reserved for special purposes:

211 - Community services

Where available, 211 services provide free and confidential services that help people across North America. Questions about human trafficking, disaster assistance, food, health, housing utilities, as well as jobs and support for veterans or some of the services offered.

311 - Municipal government services

Many large cities have deployed 311 services to offload non-emergency requests from citizens. Without 311, quite often cause of this nature end up at already over-burdened 911 centers, creating further congestion, and potentially blocking emergency call traffic. By deploying a 311 Center, constituents are able to inquire about any service, from trash collection to reporting graffiti, or a pothole requiring street repair. Also, Social Media text messages from Twitter allows citizens to establish an interactive, multimedia touch point that promotes goodwill with citizens young and old. T

411 - Often used for directory services

Even though the phone company published a printed copy of the telephone book, 411 information services are often established to provide directory assistance or local information. With pay phones decreasing and cellular services in, usage has declined.

511 - Traffic information services

511 has been established for road and weather information as the transportation and traffic information telephone hotline. Where available, mobile and landline travelers can dial 511 for information and updates about their location.

611 - Reserved (local telephone company repair) Like 411 services, 611 has been reserved in the NANP but not specifically assigned to a particular use. In some areas, 611 was historically used as a test code for linemen on the street

711 - Telephone Device for the Deaf (TDD) and relay services
Every telephone company must connect persons who dial 711 to a Telephone Relay Service (TRS) from a device on a working number. This rule was extended to include all VoIP telephones in July 2007 by the Federal Communications Commission.

811 - Call before you dig service In March of 2005, the FCC established 811 as the universal number that would coordinate location services for underground public utilities.

911 - Emergencie Services

Single-number access for all emergency services, including police, fire and medical.




