Each week we have a special Children's Conversation during worship. Children ages 6 and under are welcome to go to the nursery following this time or remain in the sanctuary.

Older kids are encouraged to stay in worship with their grown ups. Special bulletins which follow the theme of the worship service are available to help them stay engaged.

Praise Team





PS - yes we have already checked - no football games are scheduled for this night - your calendar is clear!




MEN'S BREAKFAST MARCH 1 AT 8AM
