Note about this production:

Charles Dickens' readings of *A Christmas Carol* were highly successful one-man shows that he performed on both sides of the Atlantic, beginning in 1853. He adapted the text for stage, performing it with dramatic changes in voice and tone for each character, and initially performed for charity before eventually charging for performances to make a significant portion of his income. He continued giving these readings until his final performance in March 1870.

Cast & Crew Bios
