MISSION & PURPOSE

MedShare is a 501c(3) humanitarian aid organization dedicated to improving the quality of life of people, communities and our planet by sourcing and directly delivering surplus medical supplies and equipment to communities in need around the world.

MedShare helps increase health system capacity and drives sustainability by providing biomedical equipment training and service to healthcare organizations and medical professionals serving populations in need.

MedShare's delivery of vital medical supplies and equipment have decreased our nation's carbon footprint and brought health, healing and the promise of better lives to 117 countries and millions of people.

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CEO AND BOARD CHAIR

Dear Friends,

The impact of COVID-19 is still being felt, particularly in the marginalized communities we serve, where it has weakened already vulnerable health systems in the US and around the world. Now more than ever, MedShare's programs and services will play a critical role in bolstering these health systems and addressing the primary threats to health equity.

The crisis in Ukraine presented yet another test of MedShare's response readiness. Immediately following the initial attacks in late February, MedShare distributed \$1,515,286 in aid in four short months to Ukraine and surrounding countries in the form of critical PPE, wound care, first aid, hygiene, primary care and surgical supplies. And MedShare is committed to continuing to support the country's efforts to care for its affected citizens and devastated health system for the long run.

All told, MedShare's Disaster Relief efforts reached more than 450,000 million people in FY22, with over \$3.1 million in supplies and equipment donated to recovery efforts in 10 countries. This included our response to the 7.2 magnitude earthquake in southwest Haiti, which killed more than 2,200 people and left the island's delicate healthcare infrastructure in shambles.

On a happy note, it's heartening to see the smiling faces of our many dedicated volunteers back on campus. Though we're not quite back to the numbers we were seeing prior to the pandemic, our volunteers are once again making a tremendous impact on our ability to fulfill our mission. While MedShare volunteers helped us put 10,300 Clean Birthing Kits in the hands of women's health facilities, maternity wards, and midwifery teams in marginalized communities across 58 counties and territories in FY22, we were also able to donate \$715,000 in supplies and equip 3,100 health care professionals through our Maternal & Child Health Program.

Another \$13 million in supplies and equipment were donated through our Primary Care Program, allowing us to serve over 1 million more at-risk men, women and children. And many of our efforts to further address healthcare disparities involved our support of Free and Safety-net Clinics in the US struggling to bridge gaps in care and other inequities prevalent in underserved communities. MedShare provided over \$208,000 in aid to support these invaluable clinics and made the commitment to expand the network of US clinics we serve in FY23. Additionally, over \$1.9 million in aid was provided to Medical Mission Teams that helped fill the gaps in care for under-resourced health systems in underserved communities outside of the US.

We thank you, as always, for your support of our mission and invite you to read more about how we're serving our global community as we continue to work to improve the quality of life of people and our planet.

MATERNAL & CHILD HEALTH PROGRAM

MedShare's Maternal & Child Health Program intends to improve the quality of healthcare for mothers and children in the medically-underserved countries we serve; thereby reducing the number of deaths associated with childbirth.

2022 IMPACT Nigeria and Côte d'Ivoire

As part of MedShare's Maternal and Child Health Program. in partnership with The Coca-Cola Company, the Safe Birth Initiative (SBI) was designed as to improve health outcomes for expectant mothers and newborn children in Nigeria and Cote d'Ivoire. Our work this past year focused on Centre Hospitalier Universitaire (CHU), one of Cote d'Ivoire's largest healthcare institutions.

With Cote d'Ivoire reporting a maternal mortality rate of 617 deaths per 100,000 live births, and an infant mortality rate of 58 deaths per 1,000 live births (compared to a maternal mortality rate of 23.8 and an infant mortality rate of 5.68 in the United States), the risks associated with giving birth in these low-resourced countries are incredibly disproportionate.





DISASTER RELIEF PROGRAM

MedShare is poised to respond efficiently by partnering with local organizations and governments to provide immediate aid and support long-term recovery, empowering healthcare workers to provide quality care following a disaster.

2022 IMPACT Ukraine

Working in sync with a wide array of partner relief organizations that maintain a communitybased presence on the ground in Ukraine and surrounding countries, MedShare bolstered the herculean efforts of Convoy of Hope, Feed the Hungry, Salesian Missions, Razom for Ukraine, and NOVA Ukraine, among others, in the delivery of aid both into Ukraine and to Ukrainian refugees. MedShare has also provisioned 37 medical mission teams.

MedShare's partnership-powered relief efforts have thus far resulted in the distribution of tons of critical PPE, wound care, first aid, hygiene, primary care and surgical supplies generously provided by Owens & Minor, MC Johnson, Johnson & Johnson, DePuy Synthes, Heart to Heart, Clinics Can Help, Sutter Healthcare, Henry Schein, Philips Healthcare, Mizuho OSI, CHOA, Wellstar Health, and logistical support from Airlink and Flexport.

HUMANITARIAN PARTNER SPOTLIGHT RAZOM FOR UKRAINE

Since March, 2022, Razom for Ukraine has served as MedShare's primary partner organization in delivering aid to the people of Ukraine. Continually sharing critical information from the front lines, Razom has worked hard to help MedShare deliver millions of dollars in life-saving medical supplies and equipment to the country.



2022 **IMPACT** Razom for Ukraine

Razom and MedShare have supported each other every step of the way, during the chaotic early stages of the war through our current effort to help rebuild the country's ravaged healthcare system. Most critically for MedShare, Razom has served as a vital sounding board, educating us on how best to support Ukraine, a country our organization had never once sent aid to prior to 2022.



In doing so, we have been able to deliver everything from basic hygiene kits to areas ravaged by warfare, to critical hospital infrastructure providing life-saving surgeries. At this very moment, we have 80,000 pieces of medical supplies and equipment enroute to Ukraine, with plans to build upon this partnership as long as necessary.

MedShare is proud to recognize the herculean efforts of Razom as we continue to work together to deliver medical aid to Ukraine and to Ukrainian refugees by honoring them with the prestigious 2023 Bob Freeman Humanitarian Award.

PRIMARY CARE PROGRAM

Primary healthcare is the foundation of health systems and is central to: providing preventative healthcare; improving women's and children's health; controlling major infectious diseases; managing the burden of non-communicable diseases like heart disease and cancer.

2022 **IMPACT** Hospital Escuela – Honduras

The 403rd Aeromedical Staging Squadron undertook a medical mission and training exercise to Tegucigalpa, Honduras, where a 30-member team partnered with the medical staff at the largest public hospital in Honduras to provide life-saving care to the community.

Over the course of the two-week trip, the team integrated their capabilities with Hospital Escuela to provide critical care and at the same time, train to ensure deployment readiness for future needs.

The team was able to partner with MedShare to secure essential medical supplies they needed for their mission. Through this medical mission trip, this group of Air Force medical reservists was able to positively impact the lives of the patients in the local community, share knowledge and skills with the local medical team, and gain invaluable training for future deployments.

US FREE & SAFETY NET CLINICS

You may be familiar with our work in Nigeria, Guatemala, Haiti, or the Democratic Republic of the Congo. But did you know that MedShare directly supports hundreds of free and safety net clinics throughout the United States?

Families living in disadvantaged and marginalized communities — regardless of the country in which they live — face inequities in virtually every facet of their lives. Which is why MedShare and our many generous and dedicated partners work together to help ensure that this is not the case when it comes to access to health care.

2022 **IMPACT** The Harriet Tubman Women's Clinic

The Harriet Tubman Women's Clinic at the Clarkston (GA) Community Health Center provides quality care for uninsured and underserved women in a welcoming, safe, and culturally sensitive environment.

The HTWC team is made up entirely of volunteer physicians, nurse practitioners, medical, nursing and undergraduate students from the greater Atlanta community and Emory University School of Medicine.

MedShare is proud to be able to support the clinic through our primary care supply center, where clinicians regularly shop for critical medical supplies – saving The Harriet Tubman Women's Clinic thousands of dollars each year that can instead be utilized for direct care.



MEDICAL MISSION TEAMS

Medical mission teams represent an essential component of global health delivery and have long been critical to MedShare's ability to support and strengthen vulnerable healthcare systems in middle and lower-income countries.

A large number of MedShare's health system interventions each year involve supporting medical mission teams traveling to some of the most remote parts of the world to provide primary health care and surgical services for communities with limited access to health care.



2022 **IMPACT** Global Healthcare & Education Initiative

MedShare's longstanding relationship with Global Healthcare & Education Initiative (GHEI) has evolved tremendously over the years. In the days prior to the COVID-19 outbreak in the U.S., MedShare partnered with GHEI to send a team of volunteers to Tanzania, where they provided extensive training for 12 emergency medicine nurses and other qualified health practitioners, covering all aspects of emergency medicine and life-saving techniques. The timing simply couldn't have been more critical, and the intervention resulted in significantly better health outcomes in a region challenged by a lack of access to quality care.

GHEI is a New York-based NGO formed by professionals and volunteers running health care education projects worldwide. They aim to improve the quality of health care and education in underprivileged communities by supporting health care professionals and institutions as well as students pursuing their dream of education.

IN MEMORIAM REMEMBERING HUMANITARIAN TOM ASHER

The legacy left by Tom Asher is beyond measure. Tom was a supporter and advocate of MedShare for over I3 years, having served as a trustee, board chair and leader of a number of committees. 2022 **IMPACT** The Ongoing Battle with COVID-19

MedShare established an Infectious Disease Control and Prevention Program (IDCPP) to bring focus to and gather support for treating communicable diseases in the developing world. The recent COVID-19 pandemic has no doubt increased global awareness of infectious diseases and the devastating impact they can have on vulnerable populations, but there is still much work to be done to ease the burden of these diseases on marginalized communities.

While MedShare provided critically needed face masks, gloves, gowns, and head coverings, as well as life-saving ventilators, to nearly 5 million healthcare professionals and patients during the pandemic, our efforts continue today to provide critical PPE worldwide to communities that are still combatting this devastating disease -- in some cases without the benefit of vaccinations or other protective/treatment measures.

BIOMEDICAL EQUIPMENT TRAINING & REPAIR **PROGRAM**

To address the dilemma of donated medical equipment sitting idle in healthcare facilities, MedShare invests significant time and resources in a state-of-the-art biomedical equipment training and repair service that provides the safest and highest quality medical equipment to our beneficiaries.

2022 **IMPACT** Safe Birth Initiative - Cote d'Ivoire

As part of MedShare's Maternal and Child Health Program, the Safe Birth Initiative (SBI) was designed as to improve health outcomes for expecting mothers and newborn children. Initially rolled out in Nigeria, the multi-year initiative is currently being implemented in Cote d'Ivoire at Centre Hospitalier Universitaire (CHU), one of the country's largest healthcare institutions.

In 2020 Cote d'Ivoire reported a maternal mortality rate of 617 deaths per 100,000 live births, compared to 23.8 for the United States. and an infant mortality rate of 57.9 compared to 5.68 for the United States -- differences which paint a picture of the risk associated with giving birth in a low-resource country. MedShare seeks to reduce these risks by engaging in a long-term, targeted partnership with the Cote d'Ivoire Ministry of Health, funded by our long-time partners at Coca Cola Africa.



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2022 PARTNER SPOTLIGHT

While COVID's impact on US-based hospitals was lessening in late 2021, the pandemic was still having a massive impact on marginalized communities around the world, many of which did not have access to essential medical supplies.

So, in 2022, when 15-year partner Kaiser Permanente found itself with a significant excess of personal protective equipment, MedShare shipped over 2 million face masks, and millions of other gloves, gowns and protective coverings to healthcare organizations in nine countries around the world. This partnership is a precise example of why MedShare exists, in helping to move highly needed, life-saving supplies from a place of excess to a place of need.



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
