BETWEEN HITLER AND STALIN

EUROPE'S DARKEST YEARS

From 1930 to 1945, Eastern Europe became the stage of mass violence on an unprecedented scale. In the vast territory comprising Poland, the Baltic states, Belarus, Ukraine, and parts of Russia, the crimes of Nazi Germany and those in the Soviet Union under Joseph Stalin overlap. While the Wehrmacht and the Red Army clashed in brutal battles, the SS and the Soviet secret police spread fear and terror among civilians. Here, two dictatorships unleashed a reign of violence unlike anything seen before. Historians estimate that around 14 million civilians were murdered in this region alone - mainly Jews, Poles, Balts, Belarusians, and Ukrainians. What made Eastern Europe the epicenter of such devastation? To what extent did Stalin's policies of repression pave the way for the German occupiers long before the war began? Based on interviews with contemporary witnesses and extensively researched archive material, the documentary explores the mechanisms of terror, mass murder, and famine.

THE MYTH OF ALBERT AND HELENE SCHWEITZER



The Schweitzers became icons of humanism in the post-war period. In recent years, however, this has been critically questioned. What remains of the Schweitzers' legacy - in Europe and in Gabon? In 1913. Albert and Helene Schweitzer set out to build a hospital in Gabon. Albert went on to become the celebrated "jungle doctor" and Nobel Peace Prize laureate, long regarded as a symbol of humanity and moral responsibility. Far less known is the role of his wife Helene, a teacher and trained nurse who. despite her struggle with tuberculosis, kept the clinic alive through her tireless dedication. The documentary tells the story of Albert and Helene Schweitzer as two extraordinary personalities. At the same time, it explores how their legacy is reinterpreted today - not only through European eyes, but also from African perspective that expose colonial entanglements and paternalistic views.




Looted treasures, shattered terracottas, and the lost city of Atlantis – Africa's forgotten masterpieces resurface. The story follows the Nok terracottas and the Ilé-Ifè bronzes, two of Nigeria's most remarkable archaeological legacies. From illegal excavations and the lost knowledge of the Nok culture to the rise of Ilé-Ifè, the first metropolis of sub-Saharan Africa, the films reveal forgotten riches and confront the impact of colonization. Nigerian and international researchers shed new light on glorious and tragic chapters of Nigeria's past.

In 1766, a 16-year-old Italian musician stepped out of a carriage in Vienna and went on to shape the musical life of the city for more than half a century. For more than 35 years, Antonio Salieri held the position of court conductor, moved in the circles of Haydn and Mozart, and taught Beethoven, Schubert, and Liszt among many others, leaving an enduring mark on music history. Yet to this day, Salieri's name is entwined with one of history's most spectacular "cold cases": the 19th-century rumour that he poisoned Mozart out of jealousy of his musical genius. Actor Tobias Moretti retraces Salieri's footsteps, visiting original locations, meeting musicians and historians, and investigating the alleged rivalry. How could a man, admired as both musician and human being, known for his integrity and concern for orchestra musicians, fall under suspicion of having murdered the greatest musical genius of his time?





Evolution has spawned countless creatures. Today, Earth harbours millions of species, from tiny microbes to the 200-tonnes blue whale. Animals live on land, in the oceans, and in the air - and most species look very different in size, limbs, body shape and appearance. Some of them are closely related - closer than you'd expect. Yet other species look surprisingly alike, even though they're not even related. Did you know that the rock hyrax, the size of a cat, looking like a marmot - is related to the elephant and to manatees? That we humans are related not only to primates, but also to colugos - air-gliding mammals that live in the jungles of Southeast Asia? Oddly, ostriches and crocodiles are also related, as they share the same ancestors: theropods. At the same time, you'd expect a certain relationship between whales and whale sharks. But nope, sorry. And let's not even get started on snakes and eels!









Penguins are charismatic and funny characters. They always look as though they are ready to go out to a fancy dinner. They are clumsy on the ground yet extremely graceful in the water. Their neighbours on the beach are often naturally clumsy and grotesque as well: elephant seals look like gigantic bean bags when they leave the ocean to mate, give birth and moult. To delve into the lives of penguins and their invasive neighbours, a new generation of talented film makers and divers is committed to spending extensive periods of time with them in their remote and hostile environment using the most advanced tools in 4K HDR cinematography. Specific and easily identifiable king penguin characters will emerge and help us to develop in-depth stories. Despite its humorous approach, the series relies on hard facts and serious science.
