HISTORY

SATCHMO SUMMERFEST

Louis Armstrong, also known as “Satchmo” and “Pops,” was born in New Orleans. He sang in choirs as a child and then learned to play cornet at the Colored Waif’s Home for Boys. He moved to Chicago in 1922 to join Joe “King” Oliver’s band. Soon after, he started recording as a bandleader with his own ensembles, the Hot Fives and Hot Sevens. His innovative trumpet playing, singing, and charismatic personality led him to become one of the most influential and beloved musicians in the world. Armstrong continued to perform and record music until his death in 1971.

Satchmo SummerFest was established in 2001 to commemorate the life, legacy, and music of Louis Armstrong on what would have been his 100th birthday.

Twenty-five years later, the silver anniversary of the festival marks the 100th anniversary of Armstrong’s first recordings as a bandleader.

More than just a celebration, the festival provides an important boost to New Orleans’ cultural economy during the hot summer months, supporting local musicians, food vendors, and small businesses.

RED BEANS AND RICELY YOURS

Louis Armstrong loved red beans and rice so much, he asked his future wife, Lucille, if she could cook it. After learning the recipe and impressing his and her parents, he proposed soon after. Later, he even signed letters “Red Beans and Ricely Yours.”

SATCHMO SUMMERFEST EXHIBIT

The New Orleans Jazz Museum will launch a new exhibition on July 31, celebrating and honoring the 25th anniversary of the Satchmo SummerFest. Curated by David Kunian, “Brother, Can You Spare A Quarter: Satchmo SummerFest Turns 25” features the commemorative posters since the start of the festival. The artists in the exhibit include Jane Brewster, Tami Curtis-Ellis, Margaret Slade Kelley, Ayo Scott, Marinta Skupin, Scott Hodgins, Koby Sackey, Mario Padilla, Richard Thomas, Philip Bascle, and many others. These framed art pieces will be displayed on the walls of the world-famous New Orleans Jazz Museum throughout the festival weekend and beyond.

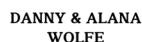
