Stephanie Pena lives at Paradise Creek with her mom and her two children: an infant and 10-year-old Santiago.

Thanks to CHW's Study Stars After-school Program (Study Stars), Stephanie is confident that she has a safe place for Santiago to learn and play while she is at work. Santiago has been a part of Study Stars since he was in kindergarten and has developed academically as well as socially. He loves being a part of the afterschool program and gets excited to learn, make friends and play with them.

"Santiago loves the Study Stars' afternoon classes because he plays with his neighbors and friends and makes various activities as if he were in a mini school," Stephanie described. "When Santiago first became part of Study Stars, his English greatly improved and his academic evolution was substantial," she shared. Santiago continues to advance his academic outcomes by using the i-Ready online learning tool.

This understanding spurred Stephanie to speak with her employer, a local bakery, which then approved her request to package leftover bread and baked goods for her community. This bread has been used to create some of the healthy snacks provided daily for Study Stars students as well as extra for their families to take home.

Matteo Mondragon and his family are wonderful examples of how CHW builds futures for generations today and for those to come.

Matteo Mondragon is six years old and lives in Mayberry Townhomes with his dad, Juan Mondragon, his mom, Yadira Salazar, and his brothers: Octavio Eribez (15 years), Cristopher Mondragon (11 years), and baby Isaias Mondragon.

Their lives have changed significantly since arriving in the community. Before moving into Mayberry Townhomes, Matteo's family lived with relatives in a single room. When Yadira received a call that they were accepted to move into an apartment in Mayberry, she was very excited and thankful for the opportunity.



Yadira, Matteo and the rest of the family have been actively involved in the Mayberry Townhomes community since they arrived. Yadira has been a Community Leader for several years and often volunteers for activities, events, and programs, including the After-School Program which her kids attend. She participates in Financial Well-Being (FWB) classes and attends family nights and other activities. Octavio attends the FWB Teen classes and is involved in a program with CHW partner Reality Changers.

2023 Community Milestones

The numbers below are evidence of our growth in 2023. We ended the year strong, supporting more residents in more communities than ever before.



Welcoming New Residents

Every new CHW community is a cause for celebration. This year was no different as it brought new residents in San Diego, Sacramento, and Orange Counties. Truly a remarkable achievement!



Amanecer Apartments San Diego, CA

Amanecer Apartments provides 96 affordable apartments in the heart of San Diego and is the first new affordable housing development in the Linda Vista neighborhood. The community is highly affordable to families and individuals, with

10 apartments reserved for veterans and 10 apartments set aside for transitionaged youth. It is conveniently located near public transportation, schools, a library, a park and state-of-the-art skate park, and numerous retail and employment centers.

Amanecer Apartments transformed a previously underutilized site in a central San Diego neighborhood into much-needed homes.

Salvator Apartments Sacramento, CA

Salvator Apartments is a sustainable, transit-oriented community featuring 120 new apartment homes and is designed to provide affordable housing options for the local



workforce, families, older adults and veterans. As the first affordable housing community to participate in the Sacramento Municipal Utility District's Smart Home pilot program, Salvator Apartments is designed to be "all-electric ready." Previously vacant land has been transformed into a new family-friendly community that integrates affordable housing into transportation and business corridors.

Salvator Apartments is designed to provide safe, affordable housing to lowand middle-income families and individuals while serving as a catalyst for neighborhood revitalization of North Sacramento.

Portola Senior Apartments

Lake Forest, CA

Located in the city of Lake Forest, Portola Senior Apartments is CHW's first development in Orange County, California. With 57 apartments for older adults, Portola combines retail and community space in the ground floor, while the three additional elevator-served floors provide safe, affordable, ADA-compliant housing in a newly planned community that promotes dignified aging-in-place.



In addition to having access to nearby walking trails and public transit, residents receive free public transportation passes, free high-speed internet in each apartment, and access to on-site classes focused on adult education, health and wellness, and skill building.

Portola Senior Apartments provides affordable and accessible housing for seniors, a demographic often underserved in urban areas.

Breaking New Ground

Cortez Hill Apartments

San Diego, CA

In August of 2023, CHW broke ground on our first community in downtown San Diego. Cortez Hill Apartments is planned as an 88-unit, five-story affordable housing development in the Cortez Hill neighborhood. It will offer one- and two-bedroom apartments, including 14 apartments that will be set aside for formerly homeless individuals. Located within San Diego's designated Transit Priority Area, Cortez Hill is in close proximity to multiple public transit options and neighborhood

amenities. This development is CHW's first all-electric project.

Cortez Hill Apartments is dedicated to providing long-term affordable apartments and resident service programs for lowincome working San Diego residents.







CHW was named a 2023 Workplace Excellence Award Winner by management consulting firm Peter Barron Stark Companies.


Funding Approved for Bandar Salaam Rehabilitation
