he Interinstitutional Commission Against Commercial Sexual Exploitation and Human Trafficking of Honduras - CICESCT informs the Honduran people and the International Community that the approval of the Fund for the Care of Victims of Human Trafficking has been officially published in the newspaper La Gaceta (FOAVIT), mar-king a milestone in the fight against Human Trafficking, to provide primary and secondary care to victims. The head of the CICESCT; Sua Martínez highlighted "Since my appoint-ment I have not stopped working and today I see a dream come true to continue caring for the surviving victims of Human Trafficking and its different modalities."

In that sense, the fund has the support of the Board of Directors, which is the technical body of the CICESCT, which was approved by unanimous votes in an extraordinary meeting, where the transparency of the funds was regulated.

The CICESCT, as the governing entity of the state in the fight and prevention of Human Trafficking and crimes linked to trafficking, stated that the fund is to faithfully comply with article 20 of the special law legislative decree 59-2012 against trafficking. "The victims need comprehensive care, repair of damage, protection and guarantee of their human rights," explained Martínez.

Therefore, this support is intended for direct and indirect victims in order to reintegrate them into society. This effort was achieved thanks to the members that make up the CI-CESCT Board of Directors and the full support of President Xiomara Castro, complying with the government plan with a gender focus and the defense of Human Rights.

Danori Carbajal the woman passionate about nutrition



is Danori ho Carbajal? In talking short, about myself inhibits me, however, I can

say that I am a woman attached to my roots that I carry deep inside me. The life took me far away from my homeland when I studied at university in Brazil and I knew that my family had trained me to face life with solid principles. Upon my return, I feel that I was able to contribute to my country by being one of the pioneers in nutrition. This professional solidity prepared me to form a wonderful family that I feel is the greatest blessing I have had in my life. In conclusion, that is me.

How did you start in the world of Nutrition?

When I was in the pediatric wards of the Hospital Escuela de Tegucigalpa, I realized that Nutrition played an important role in the treatment of patients and that is where my passion for the science of Nutrition began.

What are the most common diseases for which people consult nutritionists?

Obesity, Diabetes, Renal Insufficiency, Mixed Dyslipidemia among others. How is a working day in the life of Dr. Danori Carbajal.

I am very fortunate to dedicate my-

self to what I am passionate about, "my profession". I start very early and sometimes the first thing I do is just review the dietary plans of my pa-tients prior to their delivery, of those who have visited me in the last 48 to 24 hours (the vast majority are from the previous day). I do this as part of my routine since 100% of my patients receive diets designed for their individual needs according to their food preferences and according to the nutritional assessment performed, considering laboratory values in those cases that require it. A very important aspect in this interaction with patients is to establish that human connection that is so important for understanding them. In addition, there is another transcendental aspect of my professional practice, which is to attend an important number of con-

My primary goal is that of every mother who is aware of my role in the family, and that is to continue to provide unconditional support to my family until I share the satisfaction of my family.

sultations to hospitalized patients that require a very specialized approach, as well as the occasional home visits that I still attend.

How many patients do you see on a daily basis?

There is no fixed number of patients because it varies a lot due to different factors. What I can share with you is that I am very blessed.

What should the balanced diet of a person who exercises daily be like? This diet is also individualized because it is unethical to provide generic diets. For this, the type of exercise, frequency and particular physical condition should be considered. However, as general information, high quality carbohydrates such as whole grains, fruits, legumes, lean proteins such as meat, poultry, fish, skim milk, healthy



Do you believe that a sedentary lifestyle causes disease?

No doubt it does. Metabolic syndrome, obesity, arterial hypertension, heart disease, high cholesterol, type II diabetes, certain types of cancer including colon cancer, among others. We must remember that exercise is also medicine.

What recommendations do you give our readers for good nutrition?

It is vitally important to consume fruits daily, eat three main meals and two snacks. Start eating salad first to avoid eating too much, it activates the feeling of satiety and thus avoid obesity. Include more natural foods in your daily routine, avoiding industrialized foods such as cup soups or sachet soups. Eat whole foods and stay hydrated.

My work was to make my way in the professional discussions until I managed to make them understand the relevance of the contributions of Nutrition as a science with solid concepts that had a positive impact on a shorter hospital stay and I also understood my own contribution when my effort began to be reflected in an important way in the economy of the patients when it was demonstrated that with the correct diet they reduced the consumption of expensive medicines and improved their quality of life.

With these achievements I conquered a relevant space in the multidisciplinary teams.

Having been Vice-President and President of the College of Nutritionists and Dietitians of Honduras, we have contributed positively in the exercise of a still incipient profession that can and should contribute much to the health of the country but now doing it from the legality of a properly constituted Professional College.

What are your short, medium and long term goals?

My primary goal is that of every mother who is aware of my role in the family and that is to continue to provide unconditional support to my family until I share the satisfaction of the goals achieved as it happened with me and my husband and my parents. In the professional field I have always been committed to continuous training by attending courses and relevant national and international congresses.

Likewise, as I studied several specialties in Nutrition, I managed to complete my Master's Degree and now I intend to complete my Doctorate in a short period of time.
