A New Chapter Among the Vines



Discover the unique story
behind Hainault @ Carmel.

Tucked into the rolling hills of Carmel, the Perth Hills' oldest wine label has found new life under fresh stewardship, and it is looking better than ever.

Meet Anna and Trent, the husband and wife team behind Hainault @ Carmel. They have swapped city careers for vineyard life and turned their long-held dream of a relaxed cellar door and restaurant into reality.

Originally from the east coast, Anna (a lawyer and former flight attendant) and Trent (an aircraft engineer) moved west 12 years ago for work and quickly fell in love with the Perth Hills.

"The community, schools, scenery and trails. We could not imagine living anywhere else," Anna says. "We had always talked about opening a restaurant in the Hills, so when the opportunity to own a winery and live on the property came up, it just felt meant to be."

The site already held a special place in their hearts. "We had visited many times when it was Fairbrossen and always loved the view," says Anna. "We could see the potential straight away. With a little love, this beautiful location could once again become a place for locals and visitors to enjoy a little piece of paradise."

For Anna and Trent, Hainault @ Carmel is both a revival and a fresh start for a much-loved local name.

"Hainault at Carmel represents a new beginning for the oldest wine label in the Perth Hills," Anna explains. "Lynne and Michael Sykes did an amazing job with Hainault, and we felt honoured that they

trusted us to continue the label and add a modern touch to such an iconic part of the region."

There is also a charming twist of fate behind the handover. "We have the same surname as Lynne and Michael," Anna says. "It just felt like it was meant to be."



Their respect for the history of the label runs deep. The grapes remain locally sourced, the wine is made by a Perth Hills winemaker, and the cellar door proudly stocks local spirits such as Carmel Distillery Gin and Vodka, with plans to extend into ciders and other regional favourites.

The couple's vision is simple. Create a place where guests can unwind and enjoy good food and wine among the vines. "We want people to feel relaxed. It is a rustic, friendly space where you can settle in and soak up the valley," Anna says.

Their chef, Evan, brings experience from country pubs to fine dining, including time as the head chef at the Oyster Bar in Elizabeth Quay. His menu is built

around share plates and hearty mains with inclusive options for all diners. Expect fresh oysters made to perfection, flame-grilled meats on open flatbreads, and the much-loved pork belly bites that guests already rave about.

This summer, visitors can enjoy the refreshed restaurant space or spend the



afternoon outdoors at the Vines Bar. "Guests can bring a picnic blanket and relax on the grassy hill by the iconic well," says Anna. "It is perfect for families. Kids can run on the grass while the adults enjoy food from the Vines Bar menu, our wines, cold beers or cocktails."

There is plenty more on the horizon too. Sunday sessions with live music, wine and food pairing evenings, and the return of Pinot and Pilates are all in planning. Wedding packages and private functions will be available from early 2026, with more ideas in development.

What has meant the most to Anna and Trent is the warm welcome from the Carmel community. "The support we have been given is amazing," Anna says. "Local winemakers and producers have been some of our biggest supporters and we really value their experience and advice."

And as for what they hope visitors take away from their time at Hainault @ Carmel? "That they feel relaxed, satisfied and appreciated," Anna says. "We want people to leave already planning their next visit."

FLYING DUCK *studio*

Nestled in the tranquil beauty of the Perth Hills, mixed media artist Karin Hotchkin finds endless inspiration in her surroundings. From her studio in Bickley, Karin creates art that celebrates nature's textures and forms using a variety of mediums — painting, textiles, sculpture, clay, jewellery, natural elements and recycled treasures to produce works that are both expressive and deeply personal.

Art has always been part of Karin's story. Growing up in a family of artists, she was constantly surrounded by creativity. Her mother was a talented portrait and landscape artist, as well as an interior designer and dressmaker. Her grandfather, a well-known Tasmanian watercolour landscape artist and teacher, was another guiding influence during her childhood years in Tasmania. These early influences helped shape Karin's instinctive connection to the creative process.

As a student, Karin was rarely seen without her sketchbook — capturing the world around her and filling its pages with ideas and inspiration. But it wasn't until her early thirties, during a period of personal health challenges, that she truly embraced art as more than a passion. What began as part of her rehabilitation journey soon became a calling. She completed a Certificate in Art and Design at TAFE, which led her to a Visual Arts Degree and then a Secondary Teaching Degree. Through those five years of study, Karin discovered that art wasn't just something she did — it was something she needed. It became her therapy, her expression, and her joy!

After two decades of teaching, Karin gradually stepped back from the classroom to focus more on her own creative practice. Today, she continues to explore new techniques and materials, but painting remains at the heart of her work. Her pieces often weave together fine lines, thread, watercolour, pencils, and even oils — always infused with a sense of wonder and emotion.

Nature is her muse. From native flora and fauna to old character homes with stories to tell, Karin's work reflects her deep connection with the environment. Her art is whimsical, abstract, naive and expressive, inviting the viewer to share in her delight for the natural world. For Karin, creativity is about feeling and instinct — not perfection. Each piece is a joyful dance between imagination and the world around her.

Karin's career has blossomed over the years. After beginning at local art markets and supplying to galleries, she has gone on to showcase her work in many exhibitions, including a highly

successful solo exhibition at the Zig Zag Gallery in Kalamunda. Her talent has been recognised with several art awards, and her pieces have been purchased by the City of Kalamunda, City of Busselton, and the Chancellor of Edith Cowan University. Alongside her exhibitions, she has shared her knowledge through art workshops, inspiring teachers and now fellow creatives from her very own Flying Duck Studio.

Housed in a lovingly restored 1950s mushroom farm, the Flying Duck Studio took five years to renovate — a labour of love supported by Karin's husband, family, and friends. The name is a playful nod to her husband's family name, Duckett, her affection for her pet ducks, and the wild visitors that grace the property throughout the year.

Flying Duck Studio opened its doors in 2023, offering visitors a glimpse into Karin's world — an eclectic collection of art, fashion and homewares all created by her hand. Initially only open by appointment and for the biannual Kalamunda Open Studios in April and October, the studio is now open to the public on the first Saturday of each


month. Karin also runs art workshops here, inviting guests to explore their own creativity in a relaxed, inspiring environment.

With its rustic charm, leafy surrounds and welcoming atmosphere, Flying Duck Studio is more than just a creative space — it's a destination. 
CASUAL DINING WITH A VIEW AT MASONMILL

Explore Masonmill's award winning gardens, bistro and mini golf, or take a look at the stunning wedding and function centre.

Just 25 minutes from Perth, Masonmill offers a refreshing pause from the everyday. Surrounded by forest and designed for slow, easy enjoyment, the venue invites visitors to "escape to fresh air, forest feels, and casual bites." This sense of calm is reflected in every part of the experience, from the dining spaces to the gardens and activities.

At the centre of Masonmill is its welcoming restaurant, where a seasonal menu pairs comforting dishes with local drinks. It is a place for long lunches, casual dinners or a slow afternoon with something cold in hand. On weekends, Masonmill opens early for breakfast between 8 am and 10 am, serving dishes such as smashed avocado with poached eggs, breakfast buns and French toast. The restaurant is fully licensed and features both indoor and outdoor seating, with views of the surrounding forest providing a peaceful backdrop. Visitors are asked not to bring their own food or alcohol, keeping the focus on the venue's own menu and produce.

To add a sense of fun, the venue's mini golf course sits near Gate 2 and includes its own kiosk. The course is designed for friendly competition among families, friends or social




groups, and in the evenings it becomes a night-golf experience when the course and gardens are illuminated. The kiosk serves snacks, slices and cold drinks, with an air-conditioned indoor area and a shaded terrace overlooking the greens.

For a slower style of visit, Masonmill's lawns and gardens offer a scenic setting for pre-ordered picnic baskets, available on weekends in limited numbers. Each basket is filled with seasonal

produce and may include local wine or beer, cheeses, deli meats, crackers, olives, trail mix, pretzels and fresh fruit or vegetables. Guests are encouraged to wander into the gardens, find a sunny patch and relax for an unhurried afternoon.

Masonmill also welcomes celebrations and group gatherings of all kinds. The venue supports events such as work functions, club dinners, family occasions and social get-togethers. One of its featured packages includes a three-hour drinks service, a choice of shared, cocktail or plated menus, access to mini golf and the use of event furniture and spaces. A minimum of 25 guests applies, and groups can choose indoor areas, outdoor terraces or garden settings depending on the style of the event.

Practical details help make the visit easy. Parking is available at Gates 1 and 2, with additional bays near the Beer Garden during busy times. An accessible parking space is located close to the restaurant entrance. Dogs on lead are welcome in outdoor areas, and owners are asked to clean up after them. Masonmill's weekly schedule supports its relaxed approach. The venue is closed on



Mondays and Tuesdays, open from 11 am to 4 pm on Wednesdays and Thursdays, and open until 8.30 pm on Fridays. On weekends, it opens from 8 am to 8.30 pm, with breakfast served on Saturday and Sunday mornings only. The kitchen closes at 7.30 pm each evening.

Taken together, these offerings create a place where visitors can spend the day eating, wandering, playing and simply unwinding. Whether it is a round of mini golf, a picnic among the gardens or a long lunch in the forest air, Masonmill provides an easygoing escape for families, couples and anyone seeking a quiet break in the Perth Hills.

Mosaic Workshops for the Beginner

Create a BEE BATH \$165

A bee bath is a simple bee water feeder in your garden, it is a nice touch to set out for your pollinating guests. A bee bath has different levels to allow the bees to access the water so they can step down and drink without drowning. After all, without these busy workers in the garden, you wouldn't have beautiful flowers or fruit and vegetables to harvest.

These mosaic classes are for the total beginner. There is no cutting of tiles, just gluing, all you need to do is choose a design.

In the 6-hour (1 day) workshop, you select tiles to glue to a terracotta saucer that is 30cm in diameter. You can follow an existing design or go your own way! There are many tiles to choose from: all shapes, sizes, and colours. Following the workshop, your pieces will dry overnight and then it must be grouted to ensure it is waterproof and ready for the garden. The grouting process will only take 15 minutes, and I send you home with colour photo instructions and a pack of materials.






