

DEARNE STAY TOP

Dearne continued their remarkable rise in the Northern Counties East League Division One with a gritty 1–0 win away at newly promoted Route One Rovers.

Adam Baskerville’s first-half goal proved decisive, securing Dearne’s eighth win in nine matches and keeping them at the summit of the table in just their second season at Step 6.

Last season’s play-off finalists have shown no signs of slowing down, combining attacking flair with defensive resilience. Their latest victory keeps them one point ahead of Harrogate Railway Athletic

and five clear of Wakefield AFC, who are also chasing promotion.

Dearne now turn their attention to Saturday’s home clash against Glasshoughton Welfare, a side struggling for form and sitting near the foot of the table.

While Dearne celebrated, it was a week-end of mixed emotions for other South Yorkshire clubs.

Stocksbridge Park Steels endured a roller-coaster of a match at Stockton Town, racing into a two-goal lead before conceding three times, including a heart-breaking last-minute winner. The defeat was compounded by a disappointing midweek performance, as they fell

2–0 at home to Greasborough Trinity, leaving fans frustrated after a promising start to the season.

Hallam’s FA Trophy campaign came to an abrupt end with a heavy 4–0 defeat at Consett. The result highlighted defensive frailties that have plagued the team in recent weeks and leaves them with only league fixtures to focus on.

In contrast, Sheffield FC provided a welcome boost for local supporters. They secured a solid 2–0 win over Eccleshill United in the NCEL Premier Division, before edging out Parkgate 3–2 in a thrilling Tuesday night derby. The match was decided

by an injury-time winner, keeping Sheffield unbeaten in the league and building momentum heading into the autumn fixtures.

Club Thorne Colliery were in ruthless form, dismantling Selby Town 4–0 away from home. Their attacking display was one of the standout performances of the weekend, with Maltby Main also impressing in a 2–0 win over South Leeds.

Dronfield Town enjoyed cup success, progressing past Blackstones—who play in a higher division—after a goalless draw and a tense penalty shootout. However, their fortunes flipped midweek as they suffered a hum-

bling 7–1 defeat at Retford United, a result that will raise questions about squad depth and consistency.

Wombwell Town were involved in a goal-laden affair on Tuesday evening, racing to a 3–0 lead against Bottesford Town before eventually sealing a 4–2 victory. The early blitz proved too much for the visitors, despite a spirited fightback.

Elsewhere, Club Thorne and Armthorpe Welfare shared the spoils in a closely contested match, while Swallownest were unlucky to lose 2–1 at Retford in the UCL Division One, having created several chances that went begging.



South Yorkshire’s rugby union clubs kicked off their league campaigns with mixed fortunes. Sheffield RUFC made a flying start in Division Two North, defeating Otley 48–26 in a dominant home performance.

The win marked head coach Ant Posa’s 100th game in charge, and the team showed real intent to improve on last season’s runners-up finish.

Rotherham Titans also impressed in National League One, securing a 48–23 bonus-point victory away at Sale. The Titans combined power and precision to overwhelm their hosts, sending a strong message to the rest of the division.

However, it was a tough start for Sheffield Tigers, who travelled to newly promoted Macclesfield and suffered a 46–26 defeat. Despite flashes of attacking promise, the Tigers were unable to match the hosts’ intensity and execution.

There’s a big Sheffield derby on Saturday where Tigers will be hoping to recover with the visit Sheffield at Door Moor with a 3.00 pm kick off.

FA Cracks Down: Respect or Face the Consequences

Grassroots football is getting a major behavioural overhaul as the Football Association (FA) rolls out a bold new set of measures aimed at stamping out misconduct and restoring respect across the pitch.

Under the banner of *Love Football. Protect The Game*, the FA’s 2025–26 campaign introduces a raft of reforms designed to tackle dissent, intimidation, and abuse in the lower tiers of the game. With 7 in 10 participants citing poor behaviour as the biggest turn-off in grassroots football, the message is clear: shape up or ship out.

Leading the charge is the new “Captains Only” protocol, which restricts post-decision discussions with referees to

team captains alone. A four-metre “captain-only zone” around match officials has been drawn up, and any player breaching it risks an instant caution for dissent.

Referees are also being armed—literally—with bodycams, following a successful pilot last season. These devices, now deployed in leagues with high discipline issues, act as both deterrent and evidence-gathering tools in heated encounters.

Another innovation is the “cooling off period”**, allowing referees to pause matches and send players to their penalty areas when tempers flare. Captains and coaches then meet in the centre circle to defuse tensions before play resumes.

Youth referees under 18 will now wear yellow armbands to signal their

age, encouraging players and spectators to treat them with added respect.

The FA isn’t just punishing bad behaviour—it’s also rewarding good conduct. Clubs demonstrating consistent respect and sportsmanship may receive discounts on affiliation fees and local awards. But for repeat offenders, the consequences are severe: penalty points, league deductions, and even removal from competitions or England Football Accreditation/

The Behaviour Improvement Programme is back, offering struggling teams tailored support through physical assets, coaching resources, and County FA guidance. Clubs are monitored via respect scores and disciplinary data, with action plans enforced where needed.

The Behaviour Hub, a

central resource platform, provides training, webinars, and practical advice for coaches, players, and parents. From managing emotions to dealing with misconduct, the Hub is a one-stop shop for building a better football culture.

FA Director of Football Development James Kendall summed it up: “We’re clear on our position—unacceptable behaviour has no place in football. These new measures are about creating safe, respectful, and inclusive environments for everyone involved in the game”

With tougher sanctions and smarter support, the FA is drawing a hard line in the turf. The grassroots game is being reshaped—and it’s respect that will win the day.

Wombwell Town on look out for new Secretary

Wombwell Town FC are making headlines both on and off the pitch this month as the Barnsley-based club begins its Northern Counties East Premier Division campaign with a flurry of fixtures—while also launching a search for a new club secretary.

The club, known for its strong community roots and ambitious footballing ethos, has already played several matches this season, including FA Cup ties and league clashes against Parkgate, Tadcaster Albion, and Stocksbridge Park Steels.

Wins against Horbury Town and Parkgate have shown early promise, while defeats to Liversedge and Stocksbridge have highlighted the challenges ahead.

But while the players battle for points, the club is also facing a key off-field challenge: finding a new secretary to help steer operations behind the scenes.

The secretary role is central to the club’s functioning, covering everything from fixture coordination and player registrations to league correspondence and matchday logistics. With the position now vacant, Wombwell Town are ap-

pealing to the local football community for someone with the passion and organisational skills to take on the role.

A club spokesperson said: “We’re looking for someone who loves the game and wants to be part of something special. The secretary is the heartbeat of the club off the pitch, and we’re keen to find someone who can help us grow and thrive.”

The vacancy comes at a time of growth for Wombwell Town, who now field men’s first and reserve teams, a ladies’ side, and a thriving junior section. The club’s

fixture list is packed, with upcoming matches against Bottesford Town, Sheffield FC, and Beverley Town, making the need for a dedicated secretary more urgent than ever.

Final Over Bowled as League comes to an end

A historic chapter in local cricket came to a close last weekend as the Yorkshire & Derbyshire Cricket League (YDCL) played its final round of matches, marking the end of a proud 56-year legacy.

Founded in 1969, the YDCL has been a vital part of the grassroots cricket scene across South Yorkshire and North Derbyshire, offering competitive fixtures for clubs ranging from village sides to city outfits. But with structural changes in the regional game and declining team numbers, the league has officially ceased operations at the end of the 2025 season.

The final weekend was charged with emotion as players, officials,

and supporters gathered for one last outing under the YDCL banner. While the cricket remained competitive, the atmosphere was unmistakably nostalgic, with many reflecting on decades of memories, rivalries, and camaraderie.

League Secretary Rachael Roberts paid tribute to the league’s enduring spirit and the people who kept it alive.

“These past few years have at times been frustrating and I’ve got many a grey hair,” said Roberts, “But it has also been very rewarding. Assisting existing clubs who have had their struggles, into seeing new clubs start from scratch and thrive.”

The transition marks a new beginning for clubs seeking fresh competition and sustainability. The Cricket



Yorkshire Southern Premier League is expected to welcome 17 former YDCL sides, offering a new structure and opportunities for growth. The other four sides will move into the Derbyshire County Cricket League.

Roberts thanked the YCSPL for their help for the clubs that were transitioning.

“We are working behind the scenes to en-

sure the transition into South Yorks will go as smoothly as possible and we will continue to support both the league and clubs until the transition is complete.” she said, adding: “But I’d like to thank the support we have received from YCSPL as they have done all they can to ensure no one misses out on continuing to play cricket.”

Social media was

awash with tributes, photos, and memories as players past and present shared their thanks and farewells. From rain-delayed thrillers to sun-drenched six-fests, the YDCL leaves behind a rich tapestry of grassroots cricket.

As the final stumps were drawn, one thing was clear: while the league may be gone, its spirit will echo through every boundary, wicket, and warm Saturday afternoon for years to come.

The League comes to an end this Saturday with the remaining two League matches and also the Cup Final. There will then be presentation night on 21st November when the 56 years will be remembered and trophies awarded for the final time.

Some days, you just hate football. It can always find ways to hurt you in a way only something you truly love can.

And such was Stocksbridge’s trip to Stockton. It has never been a happy hunting ground, the Steels have not won in four visits to the

Map Group UK Stadium. That included defeat in the play-off semi-finals in 2023 when the Steels valiantly fought back from 2-0 behind to force penalties, only to lose out on the spot kicks. So it wasn’t exactly where you wanted to go to get your first league win of the season. But it couldn’t

have started better. It took only 27 seconds for Stocksbridge to take the lead. They went forward quickly and when Tommy Marshall’s cross was cleared back to him who put it back in. The ball took a knock off Connor Smythe and James Morris was able to tap the ball in, giving Stocksbridge another early lead. It was even quicker than Oliwier Grzelak’s 52nd second goal against Guiseley.

But that seemed to just provoke Stockton. The Anchors became back page news for the wrong reasons in May. Having won their play-off semi-final against Guiseley, they were then denied their place in the final having played an ineligible player in the previous match.

Being one of the few teams to win in the play-offs but also not go up, they were determined to make that right this time. And they showed that righteous anger following the goal, camping in the final third. Their biggest

chance came when Josh Scott rounded Ben Townsend, only for a sliding Jaz Goundry to make the goal line block.

And then against the run of play, Stocksbridge doubled their lead. The Steels had found success through the counter attack and this worked for them again. Like with the first goal, Marshall’s initial cross was blocked. With his second attempt, he found Morris in the box who still had work to do. He went across the box and eventually fired a shot past Nathan Harker, giving Stocksbridge an unlikely lead. Morris even came close to scoring a hat trick, but his first time shot was denied by Harker.

For the second half, Stockton brought on the big guns. Players like Michael Sweet and Jake Petitjean, the Northern Premier League East’s top scorer last year, came on, showing the strength of depth the promotion chasers had. It didn’t take too long for this

strength to show itself. Harker sent in a well placed ball from deep and it was sent back across the six-yard area for Adam Nicholson to crash in at the far post.

From there, Stockton piled on the pressure, like wolves hunting down a wounded rabbit. And eventually, the hunt proved successful. Another ball into the box and took a wicked deflection. The ball went right into Michael Sweet’s path who then headed the ball past Townsend. It was now 2-2.

The game did settle down and Stocksbridge were able to get back into it. They even had a chance at a winner, a ball back into the box was flicked up and over the bar by the back heel of Jordan Barnett. It would have been one of the cockiest ways to win a game of football. But it was not to be, and instead it’d be Stockton celebrating.

Elliot Owen went clumsily into the back of a Stockton attacker on the edge of the D and from there, the writing was on the wall. Kevin Hayes was a free kick specialist and this was his bread and butter, especially as he had got closer and closer with previous attempts. And so it would be, Hayes swung the ball into the top corner. It delighted the home fans, but Stocksbridge would have to miserably trudge back to Sheffield with nothing.

Wednesday evening saw a very disappointing home defeat to Gainsbrough Trinity 2-0.

Two first half goals from Jonathan

Margetts was the difference between the sides with Stocksbridge again being punished for mistakes and not taking their own opportunities when they came along.

Its back to FA Cup action this weekend with a trip to Dunston UTS in the second round qualifying. It’s a return to the ground where we secured promotion last season with a dramatic penalty shootout. Dunston have had mixed start to their league campaign with three wins and two defeats and are currently sitting seventh in the Northern Premier League East Division.

Stocksbridge Park Steels Ladies provided a good end to the weekend as they continued their FA Cup heroics.

They won 2-1 in the Adobe FA Cup against higher division Cleethorpes Town, helping to claim revenge for the men who were beaten by them last month.

After spurning several chances in the first and second half, the Ladies finally made their dominance pay when Olivia Winstanley scored from a corner with a glancing header. Gemma Harte would double the lead a few minutes later with a smart finish.

Cleethorpes did fight back though and Lily Blackwood was able to score after going free on goal. Stocksbridge were able to hold on and book their place in the 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup.

Stocksbridge will face FC Farsley in the next round of the FA Cup on the 21st September.

Hallam’s FA Trophy journey came to a painful end on Wednesday night as they were comprehensively beaten 4–0 by a clinical Consett side in County Durham. Despite a promising start and several chances to take the lead, Hallam were left to rue missed opportunities as the hosts punished every lapse with ruthless efficiency.

The Countrymen began brightly, showing attacking intent from the first whistle. Brodie Litchfield looked lively and twice went close in the opening 20 minutes. His first effort whistled just wide of the post, and his second forced a smart save from Consett keeper Harry Moss. Hallam were on the front foot and looked the more likely to score, but their failure to convert early pressure would prove

Against the run of play, Consett took the lead in spectacular fashion. Isaac Walker picked up the ball on the left, cut inside, and unleashed a thunderbolt into the top corner that left the Hallam keeper with no chance. It was a moment of individual brilliance that completely shifted the momentum.

Hallam thought they had responded almost immediately when Litchfield latched onto a through ball and

But just as Hallam looked to be building momentum, they were hit on the counter. A quick break saw Walker and Holdsworth link up again, with the latter curling a composed finish into the far corner to make it 3–0 and all but end the contest.

Walker wasn’t done yet. With Hallam’s defence tiring, he weaved his way through a crowd of defenders before hammering home his second and Consett’s fourth. It was a cruel blow for Hallam, who had shown plenty of attacking endeavour but were undone by moments of quality and clinical finishing.

Substitute Brandon Bradbury brought fresh energy to the side and nearly grabbed a consolation goal with a driving run and low shot that went just wide. He also created late chances for Danny South and Calum

Ward, but the ball just wouldn’t fall kindly for the visitors.

The final whistle brought an end to a disappointing night for Hallam, who were left to reflect on what might have been. They had more than enough chances to make a game of it, but Consett’s sharpness in front of goal and a few key moments going against them proved decisive.

It was Hallam’s heaviest defeat since April and a tough pill to swallow for a side that had shown so much promise in the early stages of the tie. The result may sting, but there were positives to take — particularly the attacking intent and the number of chances created.

Now, the focus shifts back to the league, where Hallam will look to bounce back quickly and channel the frustration of this defeat into a strong domestic run. The FA Trophy dream may be over for this season, but the campaign is far from finished — and there’s still plenty to play for.

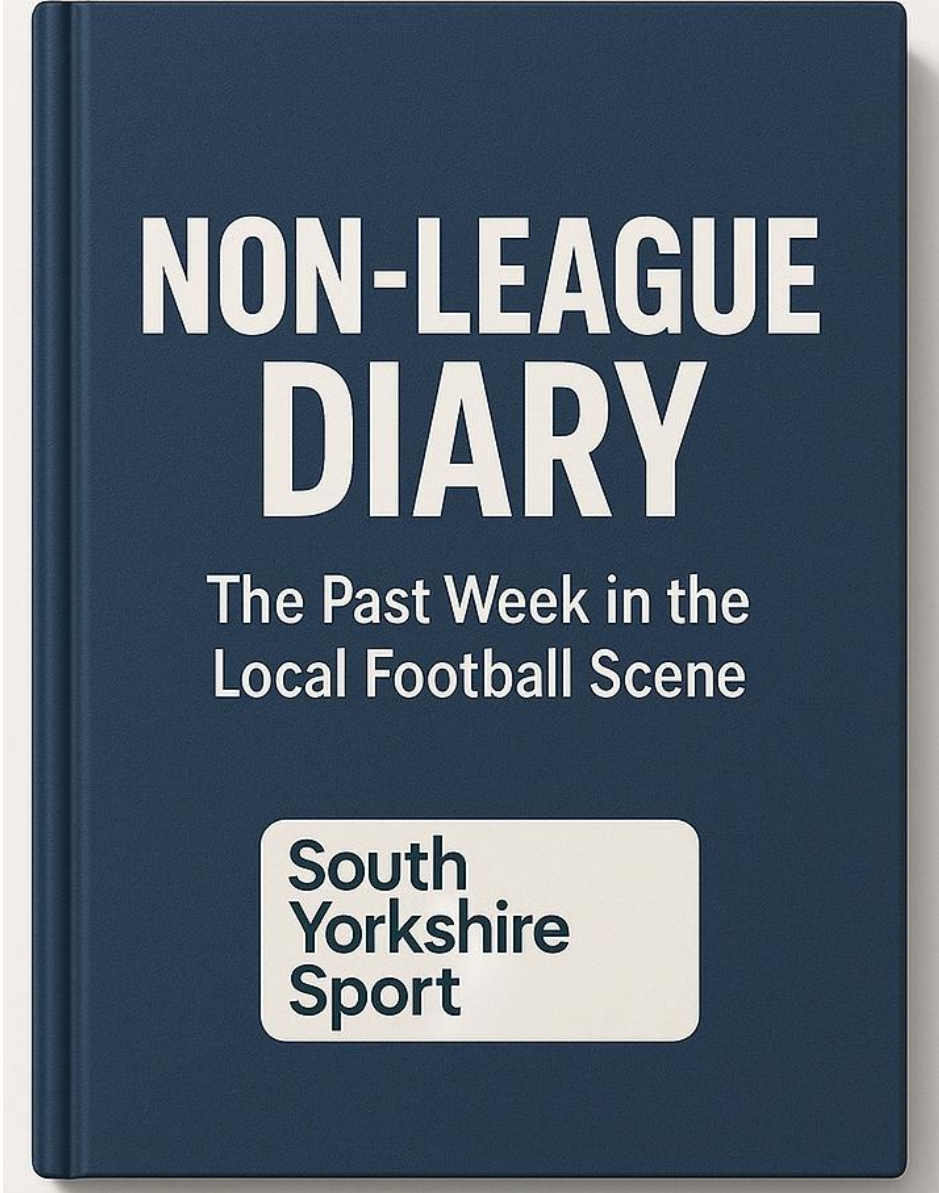
