To register online for select activities, visit www.PalmSpringsCA.gov/Recreation and click "[Click Here to register now!](#)". All participants are encouraged to pre-register online or in person.

Payments for registrations are accepted at all facility locations. Identification is required when paying by credit card.

Cancellation Policy

If an activity, class or event is cancelled, the registered participants will be notified, and an alternative will be offered if one is available. If no alternative is available, a check or credit card refund will be processed within 5 business days. The Department of Parks & Recreation reserves the right to cancel, postpone, or change facilities/instructors as needed.

Refund Policy

Refund requests can be submitted to a facility manager in writing. The Department of Parks & Recreation will issue all refunds to the primary account holder. All processing fees are non-refundable. All refund requests must be received seven (7) business days before the program start date. The Department of Parks & Recreation will review and accept/reject refund requests. Refunds will not be issued in the case of participant disciplinary action, including suspension. No refunds will be given if it is after the second class or the program's scheduled meeting date. No refunds or prorations will be offered for classes missed by a participant for any reason.

Accommodations Request

Accommodations are available upon request for City of Palm Springs activities. The City asks for notification of accommodation to be given at least ten (10) days in advance of the activity start date; however, less notice may be appropriate in some circumstances. Reasonable accommodations for participation are reviewed and granted on a case-by-case basis. The City will generally modify policies, practices or procedures or provide auxiliary communication aids or service when necessary to ensure that qualified individuals are able to participate. If you have circumstances which require specific accommodations to enjoy one of our activities, please contact the Department of Parks & Recreation at (760) 323-8272.

Disclaimer & Code of Conduct

The City of Palm Springs supports the rights of community members to use the City's Community Centers actively and to participate in programs and activities. The complete Code of Conduct policy is posted on the City of Palm Springs Department of Parks & Recreation website at www.PalmSpringsCA.gov/Recreation.

If, at any time, the Department of Parks & Recreation cannot create or maintain a safe event or if any federal, state or local restrictions prevent us from hosting a safe in-person event, the Department of Parks & Recreation will cancel or modify the event. The Palm Springs Department of Parks & Recreation Code of Conduct will be strictly enforced.

UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Capital Projects:



Palm Springs Swim Center Remodel Design: Design Phase.

The Palm Springs Swim Center building will be upgraded with new locker rooms, offices, and an expanded footprint. Construction plans in development, reviews and permitting processes to follow prior to project going out to bid.

Desert Highland Park Playground Replacement:

Project construction to be completed in Mid-Summer with grand opening details to be announced.



The playground equipment installation includes a Palm Springs Aerial Tramway and city inspired themed custom playground designed in conjunction with the community featuring playground structures designed for youth 2-5 years old and youth 5-12 years old; including a two-bay swing set, musical instruments, and Serenity Spot for a quiet area for those children with stimulus overload, inclusive features including the Movmnt Inclusive game center, accessible swings, interactive panels, a 360 Loop transfer slide, and Volta Spinner.

The new playground will also include shade coverings to provide relief from the sun and heat, poured in place seamless rubberized surfacing, and will also be the first playground in the City to include integrated solar lighting for evening play.



Wellness Park Playground Exercise Equipment Replacement:

Project assessment and development.

The City is working to replace the existing exercise equipment in the Wellness Park. This project will assess like-for-like as well as updated alternative options for the five exercise sites located throughout Wellness Park.

Demuth Park Pickleball Court Expansion Project: Project underway.

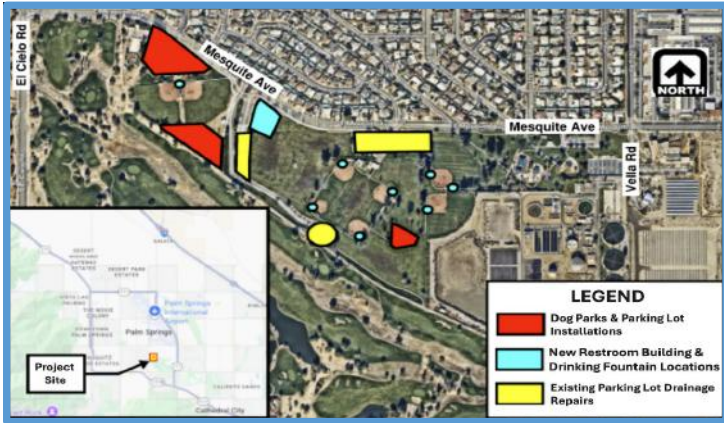


Construction on site will continue through project completion, targeting Summer 2026. Temporary pickleball courts located at the College of The Desert satellite campus located at 230 S Hermosa Dr, Palm Springs, CA 92262 will close once the new Demuth Pickleball Complex is completed and opened to the public.

The work comprises demolishing existing Pickleball Courts, Tennis Court, picnic areas and surrounding park space. Construction includes 22 new Pickleball courts with seating areas, planters, drinking fountains, courts, lighting, drainage retention area, shade structures throughout, and new electrical service upgrade. The construction costs for this project is approximately \$5.1 Million and is funded partially through Measure J.

Note – The playground, restrooms, and parking lot will remain open during construction. There may be portions of the parking lot that may need to be reserved for construction equipment at a later date..

Demuth Park Improvements Project: Project underway.



The Demuth Park Development Project includes a series of site improvements to enhance Demuth Park for the community, improving its function and overall usability. The Project improvements include design of a permanent large dog park with ADA parking spaces, a small dog park, conversion of an existing 2.2-acre dirt lot into a 165-stall paved parking lot with drainage improvements, pavement of the Community Center parking lot, pavement and drainage repairs at the Little League parking lots, installation of ADA drinking fountains, and sidewalk and pathway restoration.

This project provides over \$7,500,000 in improvements to Demuth Park, with community investment funding coming from Land and Water Conservation grant funds, Measure J Funds, Capital Funds, and Quimby funds, and 5 years of thorough assessments and project development.

UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Capital Projects:

Downtown Park Amphitheater Conceptual Design: Project underway.



City staff working with design firm to develop conceptual design and assessment of constructing an amphitheater in Downtown Park. The project will include development of three conceptual landscape design plans, and one preferred conceptual plan as well as early-stage project estimates.

Assessment of current use types and projected future use needs, capacity and seating expansion, supporting facilities, applicable engineering aspects related to existing structures, as well as visual impacts in consideration of the Downtown Specific Plan.

Palm Springs Stadium: Projects assessment and development.



Measure J funded improvements to the Palm Springs Stadium propose expansion of drainage and dugouts, updates to infield irrigation and turf, outfield wall replacement, batting cage enclosures, replacement of existing HVAC systems, as well as upgrades to the existing sound system.

Tahquitz Creek Trail: Updated master agreement finalization.



Projects feasibility and assessments, including Public Art installations, Measure J projects including the Tahquitz Creek master Plan implementation, and Baristo Park improvements, as well as trails definition and development.



Tahquitz Creek Trail Master Plan Implementation Measure J Community Initiated Project underway.



Aquatic Facility & Splashpad Feasibility Study:

Project commencement.

This project will assess all areas of Palm Springs and City owned properties to identify opportunities for future aquatic and splashpad installations. Additionally, this feasibility study will also work to assess areas of need for these types of facilities to ensure equitable access to the public.



Ruth Hardy Park Tennis Courts Improvements Assessment:

Project assessment and development.

The Department of Parks & Recreation is currently working on securing grant funding to assist with the assessment of the tennis courts located in Ruth Hardy Park. The assessment will include evaluating the state of the current tennis courts facilities. The project will work to identify repairs, improvements, and replacements of the entire complex, ranging from surfacing and screening to viability of the existing courts slabs, fencing, lighting, and utility infrastructure.
