A great deal of time and effort has been spent on implementing or updating procedures. These are necessary to protect all and form the backbone of the club's health and safety legal framework. Many thanks to Adele Joyce for her tireless work in putting all these mandatory procedures in place.

Car Park Drainage,

As we are all aware, the car park flooding is an ongoing problem. We have had the drains cleared several times already. A site survey concluded that with three of the drains, the outflow pipe had collapsed within a couple of metres of the drain. We are currently costing the works involved with excavating each channel and replacing the damaged pipes. We also plan to install a silt trap along the edge of the gravel car park. Padel Court Proposal

The Padel Courts continue through the planning application stages. One major difference in our approach to the project, has been to bring the construction and ownership of the courts in-house. Rather than partner with a third-party company who would pay the club a flat ground rent, we will own and operate the courts ourselves. This will allow the club to maximise the revenue the courts will generate. This new revenue stream will provide much needed finance to help us to provide support to our first team squad, and carry out both ongoing maintenance works and our continued improvements to club infrastructure. The RFU are actively encouraging clubs to look at Padel as a partner sport and we are excited to bring the project to fruition. The proposed new club bar and cafe will not be progressed further.
