The confluence of Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day this year has led to some interesting conversations in clergy circles. Some colleagues are moving their services from the evening to noontime to accommodate Valentine's Day dinner reservations, others are crafting hallmark-esque poems merging the days (I'll spare you the examples!) while yet others are leaning into the opportunity, inviting their parishioners to keep the LENT in VaLENTine's Day. Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of the Lenten season, is an unusual and counter cultural day. 




Congregational Meeting



Wandering Heart: Lent 2024 at CPC



This Lent, we will be “Figuring out Faith with Peter.” Using devotional materials developed by Sanctified Art, we’ll dwell in the stories from Peter’s life of faith and find in them reflections of our own story. Key lyrics from the well loved hymn “Come Thy Fount of Every Blessing” will help frame the journey we take together from week to week.

Ash Wednesday Service

February 14 7pm

Gather in the sanctuary for a simple communion service where we will receive the mark of ashes and be reminded of God’s great love.

Sunday Sermons

Each Sunday we’ll engage with another episode from Peter’s journey.

THE FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT Wandering Heart: “Jesus sought me” Summary | LUKE 5:1-11

After a long night of fishing without a single catch, Jesus told Simon Peter, “Take the boat to deep water and let out your nets.” When Peter did, he caught so many fish that the nets began to break! Simon Peter bowed down and told Jesus, “I am not worthy to be in your presence.” But Jesus told him, “From now on you will catch people instead of fish.” Then Simon Peter left his boat and followed Jesus.

THE SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT Wandering Heart: “Rescue me from danger” Summary MATTHEW 14:22-33

While the disciples’ boat was being tossed around in a storm, they saw Jesus walking toward them on the water. They were scared, but Simon Peter told Jesus, “If it’s really you and not a ghost, tell me to walk to you on the water.” Jesus called him out of the boat, and Simon Peter started to walk on the water. But when Simon Peter got scared, he began to sink and cried out to Jesus, “Rescue me!” Jesus caught him and brought him safely to the boat, saying, “Why did you doubt?”

THE THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT Wandering Heart: “Praise the mount” Summary MATTHEW 16:13-20

Jesus asked his disciples, “What are people saying about me?” They told him, “They think you’re a prophet.” Then Jesus asked them, “What about you? What do you think?” Simon Peter answered right away: “You are the Messiah, the Son of God!” Jesus blessed him and gave him the name Peter, which means rock. Jesus told him, “You’re the rock I’ll build my church on, a church so strong that nothing will overcome it.”

THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT Wandering Heart: “I’m fixed upon it” Summary MATTHEW 16:21-23

Jesus told his disciples that being the Messiah meant that he would be killed in Jerusalem, but would be raised from the dead. Peter did not like the sound of that. He told Jesus, “Absolutely not! It can’t happen that way, and I won’t let it.” But Jesus told Peter, “Get out of my way! You’re trying to tempt me away from the path I must take. I’m seeing God’s big picture, but you’re only worried about what’s here on earth.”

THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT Wandering Heart: “Teach me” Summary MATTHEW 18:15-22

Jesus was teaching people about how to live the way God wants us to live. He told them, “If someone does something to hurt you, tell them and try to work it out.” Then Peter asked, “What if the person hurts me again? How many times do I need to forgive? Seven?” But Jesus told him, “You should forgive over and over again. Not seven times, but seventy-seven times!”

Lent Devotionals

Printed devotionals will be available to pick up from the sanctuary on Sunday February 11. Different to the standard daily devotional, this year’s offering has a mix of music, poetry, art and reflective reading for you to engage at your own pace throughout the week. Thought provoking and engaging, it will encourage us to linger with Sunday’s scripture a while and note the intersections with our own lives.



Contemplative Prayer Practices for Lent and beyond...

Life can be chaotic, loud, ever moving, and generally stressful. It can be difficult to distance ourselves from the noise and movement of our day-to-day lives enough to even hear ourselves think, let alone to develop healthy, consistent spiritual lives and prayer practices. Finding inner calm and connection to God is a challenge.

If any of this resonates with you, then join us this Lent for a 4-week series on contemplative prayer practices, designed to help us reconnect with God. In this group we'll spend some time learning about and practicing some new ways to pray that can be incorporated into our daily lives.

No-one will be put on the spot to pray aloud. Rather we will be gently guided by Rev. Christine Davies, who is a trained spiritual director and wise counsellor. Rev. Davies is the Director of Pastoral Care at Robert Wood Johnson.






Women's Bible Study

Led by Elder Colleen Duerr, we engaged in what is called an ‘environmental scan,” considering what in the world around us might be helpful or challenging, while also reflecting on our current strengths and weaknesses. We are seeking to be intentional about our future as church, a place where God’s love is known and shown, and we invite your prayers as we journey on.

B U I L D I N G

As we turn into 2024, many of our Capital Campaign projects have been completed or are close to completion. Sanctuary repairs are completed, bathrooms and classrooms have been remodeled, the Fellowship Hall roof has been replaced and the work on the exterior of the church nears a conclusion.

Soon, new interior and exterior signage will be installed and plans are currently being developed to rebuild the accessible ramp. The final piece of the puzzle will be a kitchen refresh.

We plan to hold a “town hall” meeting for our whole church family in the near future to provide more specific updates, including financial updates, as we round the corner into the home stretch of this work. More information to follow soon.



During the final months of 2023, we spent time vetting and researching new church management software. Our choice was Realm and we are very excited to share it with you in the coming months! This new software is entirely web based and will allow our members to login and view and make changes to their profiles. Much more information to come - we are excited about this impactful change!
