Cumbrians honoured with Maundy money

Six people from Cumbria have been awarded Maundy money in recognition of their Christian service to church and community.

The group were among 76 men and 76 women - equal to the age of His Majesty King Charles III – to be presented with the money by the monarch at Durham Cathedral on Maundy Thursday.

The Diocese of Carlisle recipients included Sandra Edwards from Egremont, Rosalie McAndrew from St Bees, Doug McDevitte from Beckermet, Nicholas Monk from Coniston, Barbara Pilon from Barrow-in-Furness, and Alan Webb from Whitehaven.

Nicholas Monk has been involved with his local churches – St Andrew's Coniston and St Luke's Torver – since 1991 and is churchwarden for both. He moved to Coniston in the late 1980s having worked in shipping and oil in the Middle East for nearly 30 years. Nicholas has also acted as treasurer for the joint PCC as well as being a sidesperson and is a church representative on the village hall committee.

He said: "Everything went extremely well on the day; the service and Cathedral were excellent. When we arrived at our hotel the day before we were helped with our cases by a man who it turned out was Graham Usher, the Bishop responsible for the Maundy service. We chatted with him and explained where we were from, so when the King handed me the Maundy money the bishop explained that I was from Coniston and he said he knew it well."

The tradition of the sovereign giving money dates from the thirteenth century. Each recipient is given two leather purses – one containing coinage worth \pounds 5.50 in lieu of food and clothing and the second contains silver Maundy coins, the same number of pence as the sovereign's age.

Maundy Thursday commemorates the day of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ with the Apostles, with the word 'Maundy' coming from Christ's command or 'mandatum' to love one another.

Pastoral Letter from Revd Harry Welch

Dear friends,

At an induction service I was welcomed by a local councillor. As I held out my hand she greeted me with a kiss on the cheek. After the service a clergy friend asked, "Do you kiss all the councillors?" to which I replied, "Only the women"!

I often wonder, when did we British become a 'kissy, huggy' nation? I recall meeting Barbara's family for the first time. The tension of the moment was added to by suddenly being smothered in hugs and kisses from all and sundry. I realise now it was part of their family tradition of my being accepted into their family as 'our Harry' and I have remained 'our Harry' ever since. For many today such greetings are becoming the norm, even from strangers. For men, the handshake is replaced by a hand clasp and a shoulder bump. For women it's a kiss on the cheek or a hug, with some hugs almost morphing the couple into one entity!

For most, these are signs of familiarity and affection. However, such attempts at closeness can also hide the true nature of relationships and draw the couple physically closer, not as an expression of affection, but merely to avoid prolonged eye contact. These encounters reveal much about us and our relationships. Judas betrayed Jesus with a kiss. St. Paul encourages Christians to greet one another with a kiss, one of love and fellowship in the faith.

Christian love cannot be forced. It flows from one Christian to another as fruit of their unity in Christ. In a world where so many of our 'huggy, kissy' expressions are hollow cultural habits without any real meaning, Christian love transforms such into expressions of fellowship and partnership in the gospel. Christian love moves a congregation from religious formality, through friendship into true Christian fellowship which is also evangelistic. Christian love prefers words of encouragement to those of criticism; Christian love builds up and heals rather than tears down and injure.

Following Peter's denial of Jesus, after the Resurrection, Jesus asked Peter, "Do you love me?", not once, but three times, and each time Peter replied, "Yes, I love you". If the Lord were to ask you now if you love Him, not once but three times, how deep would be your response? Any true response cannot be an empty gesture but rather a deep expression of love from the heart; no false hugs or kisses, no avoiding eye contact. I wonder how many of our kisses, hugs and hand clasps, yes even handshakes during the peace, would become more meaningful, or perhaps never come to pass, if we were to first ask each other, "Do you love me"?



Happy 150th Birthday

Coniston Methodist Church celebrates the 150th anniversary of its chapel building on 1st June 2025. Just eight people formed the society at that time but what faith and energy they displayed in creating a building so much in use so many years later! As we celebrate their achievements and all that has gone on since then, we remember words from the Bible, in the Letter to the Hebrews, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and for ever."

Many, many people have kept that flame of faith burning bright here and our mission remains the same, to share the love of God with the people of our resident community and those who visit.

During week **23rd - 30th May** we shall be hosting a beautiful set of **Tapestries from the Weardale Museum**, itself set in a former Methodist Chapel. The Chapel will be open daily 10am-4pm, other than on Sunday 1st June when we shall hold a special service at 11am, to which all are more than welcome; that service will be led by Rev. Grace Cauldwell to which we again extend a warm invitation to all, to gain a flavour of what has inspired villagers through the years and how we want to continue that involvement in the coming years. Our celebrations will then continue in a variety of forms over the following weeks and months.

On **Thursday 5th June Barrow Male Voice Choir** will put on a special Celebration Concert, starting at 7.30pm, admission free but donations welcome.

We will be involving **our schools** and sharing our joy with them, with special assemblies and a piece of artwork that we hope will be well visible to the whole village at the time!

Do take the time to visit the Chapel while the Tapestry Exhibition is there, both to see that work and to share in our celebrations, and make a diary note of the other events; we look forward to seeing you.

DIANA'S ORCHARD

Thanks to the King's Coronation Community Orchard Fund we have been able to

plant a new orchard on the pub land. The work of planting 16 new trees, hedgerows and making hand crafted tree guards has been ably handled by Grizedale Arts' Head gardener Karen Guthrie and members of The Farmer's Arms Gardening School. We're calling it Diana's Orchard to remember our beloved volunteer Diana Rutherford (also an enthusiastic member of the School). We're also working on a new permissive path through the orchard to offer the public a safe pedestrian route to it up from Spark Bridge.

NOW WE ARE 4!

Happy Birthday to us! Can it really be four years since we opened The Farmer's Arms, hot on the heels of the pandemic?

The Farmer's Arms had been shut for nearly 3 years before the community asked Grizedale Arts to step in. The brewery owning the pub had been looking for new tenants unsuccessfully for that whole time and had moved to sell the site. Together with 28 loanstock investors and 6 donors we bought it and within just 4 months we had it open again, thanks to an enormous push by our staff and many volunteers.

Four years on and we are STILL open, and we are very proud of that. 6 pubs per week - nearly one a day - are closing in the UK, with an estimated 80% of them unprofitable due to rising employment costs. We have weathered many storms familiar to any pub: staffing comings and goings, debtors we've had to give up on and the ongoing trials of a 16th century heating 'system'.

We run a tighter ship than ever, without compromising on the things that matter: paying our staff fairly, minimizing waste and sourcing everything we use ethically and with a focus on a local, circular economy. Regulars and one off visitors love what we do. Our Saturday Cafe Teen celebrates our youngest staff by empowering them to make all their own business decisions, and our pottery, crafts and gardening classes thrive.

We will shortly be closing on a Wednesday evening in favour of opening Thursday (5 -10), based on the feedback of customers, alongside continuing Friday, Saturday and Sunday opening. This new pattern starts on June 1st, so check the website and socials to discover what's upcoming - and enjoy the remainder of May with us, when the gardens are glorious and our kitchens are in full swing.
