# GHC's 'Groundhog Day the Musical' set to entertain — repeatedly

or the first time since its London premiere in 2016, the beloved comedy time-loop story, "Groundhog Day the Musical" is coming to the Bishop Center stage in March.

"One of the challenges that I give myself is to try to pick a production that hasn't been done at the Bishop Center," director Andrew Gaines explained. "My wife and I saw the musical in New York in 2017. It was delightful."

"It asks a really penetrating question: What would you do if you could repeat today an infinite amount of times? How would you live today?"

Gaines has been monitoring the status of the rights for "Groundhog Day" for four years and jumped at the opportunity to produce it here on the Harbor when licensing was finally possible.

"Groundhog Day the Musical" very closely follows the plot of the 1993 film of the same name. The film stars Bill Murray who plays Phil Connors, a

cynical TV weatherman. Connors gets stuck in a time loop in the small town of Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania, where he is reporting on the annual Groundhog Day prediction event.

"If you like the movie, you might adore the musical," Gaines said. "I would say the central theme of the show is about one man's evolution to becoming a decent human being."

"I also consider it to be about finding happiness with where you are instead of being angry about it," added assistant director Saebre Winn-Lark.

Though currently based in Olympia, Gaines arrived in Cosmopolis seven years ago when he was brought on as head of the Theatre Arts and Communication Department at Grays Harbor College. He's had a theater career spanning decades and has been involved in school theater programs, off-Broadway shows, drama therapy, professional acting, and film and television. His career has taken him everywhere from New York to Los Angeles and, eventually, Grays Harbor.

Assistant director Saebre Winn-Lark was born and raised on the Harbor and graduated from Ocosta High School in 2009. Winn-Lark's first experience with

theater was at the age of 18 through the Bishop Center, and over the years has worked both on stage and behind the curtain.

"Groundhog Day the Musical" is written by Danny Rubin, who also wrote the original story and co-wrote the screen play for the 1993 film with the late Harold Ramis. Musical comedian Tim Minchin wrote the music and lyrics to bring the story to life on stage.

"It's a very dynamic show, really contemporary," Gaines explained.
"There's a wide range of music styles; pop rock, folk rock, country, funk and a little big band on occasion."

Fans of the movie may appreciate the musical's expansion of overall story themes and side characters. This is a show where even the chorus members have names and recognizable personas that are integral to the portrayal of the town of Punxsutawney.

"The intention is to make it feel like we're populating the stage with a real-life town," Gaines said.

"Almost everyone has a musical solo or lines of their own," Winn-Lark added.

A production like this comes with its fair share of hard work. Scheduling and organization are really important to making sure everything runs smoothly. However, solving problems and puzzles is part of a director's job.

Gaines and Winn-Lark are taking it all in stride as they work with the cast and crew.

"It's very challenging but it's ultimately really fun," Winn-Lark said. "Problem solving is, to a degree, one of my favorite things." The cast consists of more than 30 performers, ranging in age from 16 to 72, two thirds of whom have been involved in Bishop Center productions before.

"I love every single one of our cast members. Casting this show was one of the hardest things we've had to do because we had a lot of strong contenders for the roles," Winn-Lark said. "My favorite part is watching everyone grow and learn together."

One exciting aspect of the show is watching the time loop unfold on stage. A production like this can be challenging because there are many set pieces that need to be moved around to convey the repetition of time.

The Grays Harbor community has contributed to the production as well by procuring props such as marching band uniforms, percussion instruments, and even a real television film camera to be used on stage.

"Audiences should expect some clever gimmicks," Gaines teased. "It's really



rewarding because once you see patterns you can start anticipating what might happen."

"Groundhog Day" is considered a comedy, but the show also deals with some darker themes, including sexuality, drugs and suicide, so parental guidance is advised.

"It's an outrageous comedy but the adults will be delighted," Gaines said. "It asks a really penetrating question: What would you do if you could repeat today an infinite amount of times? How would you live today?"

n addition to "Groundhog Day" at the Grays Harbor Bishop Center, thespians from throughout Grays Harbor are getting ready for a variety of other productions. These include:

#### Driftwood Players 120 E. 3rd St., Aberdeen

This spring the Driftwood Players will present "She Kills Monsters," by Qui Nguyen, a drama with strong language and adult themes. Directed by Libby Carrico with mentor director Alex Eddy, performances are at 7:30 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays, April 26, May 2, 3, 9, 10, 16 and 17, and at 1:30 p.m. Sundays, May 11 and 18.

The plot includes Agnes, who ends up participating in her sister Tilly's created world, embarking on a journey of discovery, self-acceptance, and slaying a few mischievous spirits. In the process, she comes to see just how much of her sister she never really knew.





## Open mic nights spotlight Harbor's hidden talents

uesday nights the mic is open for those who want to perform on the stage at Messy Jessy's in Aberdeen.

Wednesday nights the open microphone, sound and lights are set at Geppetto's in Montesano.

On Thursdays, the open mic includes live musicians along with karaoke singers of all ages until closing at Hot Mama's in Ocean Shores.

On Fridays, ShuJack's Bar & Grill on Main Street in Elma highlights all things that make people laugh with open mic comedy performances as a regular weekly feature.

Got talent in Grays Harbor? You can show your stuff, sing your tunes, play your instruments and perform in front of appreciative and lively audiences about every weeknight somewhere on the Harbor.

It's brought another outlet to Ocean Shores for live entertainment and local artists to express themselves.

For the venues hosting a growing field of local performers, open mic entertainment brings in patrons and builds a community that returns for repeat performances – and repeat customers who spread the word and bring others.

Two of the hosts for the ongoing open mic events – Johnny "The Capo" Gargano in Ocean Shores, and Clinton "Dogger" Mullins in Montesano – shared their insights on the revived popularity

of open mic entertainment; and the owners of Geppetto's and Hot Mama's had nothing but gratitude for the performers, the customers, and the fun they've had in the process.

"It is community, and it is financial as well," Mullins said before hosting a recent open mic night at Geppetto's. "We are all friends and family when it comes down to it. As a full-time artist, you can't find a Tuesday, a Wednesday or a Thursday where you can play (a paying gig) very easily."

Dogger Mullins has long played music in Grays Harbor as one of the members (bass player) of the band Gebular, which was popular locally about a decade ago. He now writes, records and performs his own music as well as playing live across southwest Washington.

"The biggest reason I got where I am was that I used to go to an open mic in Olympia. They had one five nights a week while I was going to college at Evergreen, hosted by (sound engineer)

Scott Lesman. He gave me the confidence to actually play as a solo performer."

Johnny "The Capo" Gargano has been in the entertainment business for decades, having been a band leader and casino entertainment director in Las Vegas, as well as in the Seattle area. When he and his spouse moved to Ocean Shores several years ago, Gargano started to look for any work he could get for his band The Bad Boys, his solo performances or his DJ and karaoke setup.

John and Nai Duncan opened Hot Mama's on Ocean Shores Boulevard two years ago, and Gargano took over a previous karaoke night there, suggesting they also try an open mic concept.

"It's a big hit, and I made it work, combining karaoke singers with performing musicians. What we have works well," Gargano said. All the venues heavily use social media to attract performers, and the organizers help recruit and nurture some of the more regular players.

"We started with 15 to 20 people, and now we get 40 to 50 people here," Gargano said.

Dogger received his master's degree in education in 2020 and planned to stop performing to become an educator. But he found he was having too much fun playing solo around the Harbor.

He started up an open mic night at the Pitchwood Alehouse in Raymond and then made it a Wednesday centerpiece at Geppetto's about a year ago.

"I needed the open mics to help with gas money for my weekend shows," Dogger said. "But also to help other people get shows and share their music with others. I noticed right off the bat that certain people who were playing here also were getting booked other places."

For many musicians, open mic nights present a unique opportunity to share talents with an audience, explore new music and connect with fellow artists. It brings a jolt of instant excitement, testing your nerves, your memory and your ability to the fullest.

"Some of the people who come through here are naturally talented, amazing songwriter-singers," Dogger said. "My job as host when I see that talent is in a sense like grooming that talent. You can put them on a stage or in a space

that they didn't know they could get to. There are people who are crazy-beyondme good and they don't even know."

Dogger has visited The Capo for the Hot Mama's open mic and thoroughly enjoyed the atmosphere there as well.

"I had a blast there and actually had the crowd singing one of my songs," he said, noting he's likely played every venue on the Harbor. "But the thing I offer (at Geppetto's) that is somewhat unique to this area is a professional sound system, and a professional sound experience. I go out of my way to provide the highest quality sound that I can."

Dogger tries to videotape one song by each performer at Geppetto's and posts them on his social media platforms. The Capo airs some of his performers weekly on North Beach Community TV and also on his social media sites.

"We really get some great talent," Gargano said. He's even accommodated a full band when the group Blues Remedy showed up to play an open mic night, and there is

a drum kit set up for more rocking jams.


"There are a lot of musicians in this area – good ones – and they have nowhere else to play," Gargano said.

The open mics at Hot Mama's have been a regular Thursday night feature since April 2024, and Gargano notes they have stayed busy through the winter, usually going as late as 10 or 11 p.m. There's even been an open mic poetry reading night, featuring the poetry club from the Ocean Shores Library.

Gargano likes to execute songs solo that he might play with his full band. In many ways, performing is his way of practicing. He throws in an occasional original song, like one called "Tender Feelings," written for his wife and performed for her at Hot Mama's while she was eating dinner.

Hot Mama's and Messy Jessy's both allow all-ages participants, but performers must be 21 or older to perform in Geppetto's lounge.

Nai Duncan notes the restaurant space for Hot Mama's had been vacant for several years, and the entertainment has helped bring locals back into their newer business.

"We're bringing in more customers in the evenings now, especially on Thursdays. Johnny has a big following, and he brings in customers all around,"
John Duncan said.

The couple take the microphone too from time to time.

"We have fun with it," John said. "It's brought another outlet to Ocean Shores for live entertainment and local artists to express themselves."

In Montesano, Ken and Lonnie Anderson took over ownership of Geppetto's after


relocating to the area and meeting previous longtime owners Bob and Sue McEndoo. The stage area, dance floor and lounge area "had been dormant for quite a while," Lonnie Anderson said. "So, we were able to utilize existing resources to bring it all back to life."

They added new stage lights and Dogger and fellow performer Paul Werda balance the sound system for the performers.

"Dogger has just done an amazing job," Ken Anderson said. "When he first came to us and said he wanted to put together an open mic session, Lonnie and I had no clue how that really worked. We're really big advocates of bringing music into the community and supporting the music. So, we thought it was a great idea. At first, it was a slow start. But now, there's quite a little gathering on Wednesdays. It's good for the soul."

Clinton Mullins clearly has come full circle musically from a hard-rocking bass player to become Dogger, a hardworking singer-songwriter. His recorded music, "Dogger Atta Bomb," is available on several streaming platforms, and he's booked regularly at the Quinault Beach Resort and Casino as well as dozens of other locations around Southwest Washington. He'll extend the open michosting gig to the Cave Bar at the Polish Club in Aberdeen for the last Monday of April (the 28th), in what may prove to be another regular night on the circuit.

"My favorite open mic experiences have been when I see the growth of an artist. For example, someone who may have been shy and very reserved on coming out of their shell after a year of open mics," he said. "One of the most rewarding open mic experiences has been the artist Silver Steele writing his song 'Northwest Country.' He wrote the song after being inspired by one of my original songs I wrote called 'Grays Harbor Nights."

The Dogger original goes: "There ain't no place that I'd rather be. It's my hometown, with a real music scene. ...
I'm loving these Grays Harbor nights."

or several generations of Grays
Harbor residents, the Grizzly Den
restaurant was regarded as
a modest but tasty burger eatery
located across Emerson Avenue from
the Hoquiam High School and Middle
School campuses.

Few envisioned it to be included among America's best restaurants.

But the locally owned establishment was recognized by the Food Network's

– Food Network's "America's Best Restaurants" Restaurants" television series in late 2024. It is one of only two Grays Harbor restaurants to be so honored – along with La Spiaggia in Ocean Shores, featured in the Summer 2024 issue of Coastal Currents.

The America's Best Restaurants website described the Grizzly Den as "a cozy establishment ... offering a unique experience for visitors seeking a taste of local charm."

The Grizzly Den celebrated its 60th anniversary (although not all under its current name) last year. It owes its longevity not only to the quality of its food but also to a pivot in its business strategy.

Founded by Norm Johnson in 1964 as The 5 Jays, it was exclusively a drive-in restaurant for two decades. A 480-square-foot dining area was added during the 1980s.

Ownership changed hands several times before Hoquiam High School graduate Brad Bonell and his wife, Stacey, a native of Alaska's Kenai Peninsula who also operates Charlie's Café at Grays Harbor College, purchased the restaurant in 2000.

For much of its existence, the Grizzly Den catered primarily to Hoquiam students, faculty and staff — even closing during the summer months some years.

But a changing market made that business model unsustainable. Most off-campus eateries have closed during the past 25 years. According to Stacey Bonell, the Grizzly Den is one of only two mascot-named restaurants still operating in the state.

"We still get students, but it's not like the '80s where everybody hung out," she said. "When we took it over, it wasn't doing well. But with the growth of Ocean Shores and Seabrook, it really started to grow.

"What we were going for was to give people what they couldn't get in town and focus on the beach traffic," she added.

The restaurant is now open seven days a week throughout the year.

The menu includes seafood, salads and chicken items. But the restaurant's stock in trade remains its hand-pressed burgers, hand-cut french fries and more than 15 flavors of milkshakes made from actual ice cream instead of a shake mix.

Although the Grizzly Den offers more than 20 burger options, Stacey Bonell considers the Grizzly Burger, a doublemeat burger topped with bacon, two types of cheese, fry sauce and other customary condiments, the restaurant's signature item.

Other popular menu items include the Jalapeño Burger and the Black and Blue Burger that is topped with bleu cheese and candied bacon. The latter dish is not part of the restaurant's everyday menu but is frequently offered as a special.

One thing the Grizzly Den is not is a fastfood restaurant. Because only one large grill and two fryers are in operation, the food can frequently take some time to

prepare during peak dining hours.

Although the primary seating area includes seven tables and there are another handful of seats in a gazebo-like

annex, many longtime customers tend to phone in advance for takeout orders.

"We have more call-ins than diners in," Stacey said. "(Calling in advance) is smart, because the wait can be up to an hour (during certain times) in the spring and summer. It can get crazy."

Despite their focus on tourists, the Bonells, and their 13 to 15 employees, take pride in their Hoquiam roots.



The Grizzly Den was one of the area's first non-chain restaurants to be active in the annual Aberdeen-Hoquiam FoodBall event and sponsors many youth and community activities. The Bonells also own a food truck that can be rented for community functions.



# Boyle's bold lines and soft palette create striking paintings

leve Boyle creates a unique style in his watercolor paintings with bold line work that contrasts the softness one might expect from the medium.

"The ink is a big part of it because the dark colors bring the picture together," Boyle explained.

The 67-year-old watercolor artist grew up in Spanaway, but has many memories associated with Grays Harbor. He recalls taking two-week trips to Westport every summer when he was young to visit his great uncle who owned a cabin in the area.

After graduating from Bethel High School, Boyle studied art at Grays Harbor College on a football scholarship before moving on to Western Washington University where he studied abstract art.

Boyle ended up back in Pierce County where he met his wife, Pam, in 1995. The two resided in Buckley before building a new house and moving to Westport four years ago.

Through all of this, Boyle has been an artist at heart.

"I'm pretty self-taught," Boyle said.
"I took art classes in high school and college. I started drawing as a little kid."

When Boyle first started making art, a lot of his pieces had religious themes. This is when he developed a taste for drawing figures, which still appear in his paintings.



His current work has glimpses of his original style. However, it's changed as he now takes a lot of inspiration from bodies of water and often keeps his aesthetic consistent with a calm blue, green, gray, brown and yellow color palette.

Though Boyle has always loved making art, he took a break from it while he

worked full time doing maintenance for Clover Park School District for 40 years.

"I was away from art for a long time," Boyle explained. "I was pretty serious about it in my thirties. Then I was so busy that I kind of put it away for a few years. I started back up again when I retired about four years ago. I missed it."

When Boyle started painting again, he created pieces depicting clam digging, something he has enjoyed doing since

he was young. Though abstract in style, many of his pieces have recognizable Grays Harbor motifs including the ocean, lighthouses, trees and, of course, clam diggers.

Some pieces take less time than others but on average, Boyle spends at least 200 hours on a painting. It starts with an initial sketch which he workshops before transferring it onto watercolor


paper. From there he does initial line work with India ink, adds the color with watercolors and finishes with re-inking his line work.

## Interest in sourdough baking is on the rise

nterest in bread baking exploded during the lockdowns of 2020, with people stuck at home taking up the comforting craft. The employees of The Market Place in Aberdeen saw this first hand as people shopped for various kinds of flours and bread-making tools.

Five years later, people are still pursuing baking, said Michelle Olson, who with her husband, Erick, owns The Market Place, Grays Harbor's popular health food store. That rising interest, along with a flourishing fascination with fermented

foods, has made sourdough bread baking especially popular, Michelle said.

"As with many fermented foods, sourdough bread has been consumed for centuries," Michelle said. "The enthusiasm over fermented foods and their effects on digestive health and gut microbiome is growing, and sourdough bread baking is one channel many people have found fulfilling."

"Some sourdough bread consumers have noticed that the activity of enzymes and lactic acid bacteria during sourdough fermentation produces a bread that is more enjoyable and easier to digest than other breads," she added.

Much to her family's delight, Michelle enjoys baking sourdough bread and rolls herself.

"I've recently become inspired to experiment with different flours and their effects on sourdough baking. I was feeding my sourdough starter one day, only to discover that I didn't have enough bread flour to do the job. I happened to have some rye flour, so I decided to supplement with it and hope for the best," she said.

"I was soon amazed at the result. My starter tripled in size within half the time! As it turns out, rye is known to contain more wild yeasts than other flours, making it particularly active when incorporated into sourdough because it boosts fermentation. It's now a routine practice of mine to incorporate a bit of white rye into sourdough feedings," Michelle said.

At the store, "We have almost every flour a baker could dream of," she said.

She isn't exaggerating. Twenty different kinds of flour, including unbleached bread, all purpose, pastry, rye, whole wheat, einkorn, vital gluten and stoneground varieties are available. Then, there's an additional 20 varieties of gluten-free flours and blends!

"We also sell wheat berries and grains, which some customers grind into fresh flour at home," she said.

The flours are offered in packages as well as in bulk. "Bulk is convenient for those

#### **Sourdough Sandwich Bread**

150 grams (¾ cup) active sourdough starter
315 grams (1½ cup + 1 Tbsp.) warm water
10 grams (½ heaping Tbsp.) salt
15 grams (1 Tbsp + 1 tsp.) oil
450 grams (3¾ cup) unbleached bread flour

Mix all ingredients to form a shaggy dough. Cover and let sit an hour. Stretch and fold once an hour for about six hours. Dough is ready when you notice air pockets throughout. Transfer dough to a buttered bread pan and cover. Place in fridge anywhere from 3 to 24 hours. When ready to bake, score top of dough, then cover with a second, inverted bread pan, and bake at 450°F for 30 minutes. Uncover bread and bake an additional 15 minutes. Remove from pan and cool.

Note: When sourdough baking, in particular, a digital scale is more accurate, especially regarding the starter.

looking for specific amounts, from as little as a cup to as much as a 50-pound bag. Nothing beats bulk prices!" she said.

This spring the store is featuring all the tools of bread baking, as well. Those for sale include digital scales, which Michelle highly recommends to get the precise measurements crucial to obtaining consistent results. This is especially true regarding measuring the sourdough starter.

"Depending on how active the starter is, that is, full of air bubbles, weight is definitely going to be most accurate," Michelle said, adding that her daughter recently was baking sourdough

bagels with a recipe that stated both measurements. "Our starter was so active that Maddy decided to compare the weight required for the recipe to the amount in cups. To reach the weight stated in the recipe required two cups, not the 1½ cups suggested. The more we bake, the more we learn."

Other helpful bread baking tools include the Danish dough whisk, designed to blend flour and water into dough without over-mixing; wood bannetons, bread baskets that are handy when preparing artisan loaves; wood bread bow knives, which smoothly cut uniform slices with their serrated blades, and bread lame, a tool to score the top of bread dough before it goes into the oven. (This not only creates a decorative pattern on the bread's surface, but also allows the baker to control the rise of the bread by directing the steam where to escape.)

And of course, The Market Place sells a sourdough kit. It includes a starter jar with lid, band for monitoring starter progress, spatula, and dehydrated sourdough starter.

Recently, Michelle and her daughter Maddy made sourdough cinnamon rolls with her favorite recipe – the aptly named "The Best Sourdough Cinnamon Rolls," and photographed the process. The recipe can be found online at amybakesbread.com.

When it comes to learning more about bread baking, Michelle said, "The internet is bustling with sourdough bakers, from novices to experts and everything in between, each sharing their experiences, advice, and recipes. YouTube is a great place to go to learn the terms and watch the methods."




















# Whisperwood Custom Framing creates new Montesano art gallery




