




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## NEW NAME FOR AMS CLINIC

Funded by Orticare, the Opioid Management Clinic (OMC), formerly known as the Addiction Medicine Specialist (AMS) Clinic, is delivered by Dr. Adam Straub, the region's Addiction Medicine Physician

With a specific focus on opioid use, the clinic operates every Friday afternoon from 1:15pm - 5:15pm, servicing the entire Grampians and Loddon Mallee region.

As the clinic is MBS funded, there is no cost to use this service however, a medical practitioner's referral is necessary. The OMC offers secondary consults and multidisciplinary case conferencing on request and our friendly team can assist in coordinating these.

The referral form can be downloaded from our <u>website</u> and all referrals can be sent to our securely encrypted <u>email address</u>, .

To date we have completed 10 successful clinics with patients referred by a total of 18 different medical practitioners spread out between Ballarat to Nhill, offering telehealth and face to face appointments to reduce as many barriers to this much needed service as possible.

The current waiting period for an appointment with Dr. Adam Straub is only two weeks however, this is expected to increase as more healthcare professionals are introduced to the service.

There may be some capacity presently for Dr. Adam Straub to attend a virtual meet and greet with interested medical practitioners. For more information please contact your local Orticare Pharmacotherapy Liaison Officer or send us an email.

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# KEY FINDINGS FROM THE NATIONAL ILLICIT DRUGS REPORTING SYSTEM (IDRS) INTERVIEWS

The Illicit Drug Reporting System (IDRS) is a national illicit drug monitoring system that has been conducted annually since 2000, and is part of Drug Trends.

The IDRS interviews people who inject drugs (PWID) from every capital city of Australia and provides an analysis and examination of indicator data sources related to illicit drugs. It is designed to be sensitive to trends, providing data in a timely manner, rather than describing issues in detail.

The 2022 IDRS report provides the most up-to-date findings of the IDRS interviews from 2000 to 2022 with people who regularly inject illicit drugs.

More than two million red or amber alerts were triggered last year alone, as Victoria sees annual overdose deaths trending downwards for the first time in a decade

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### NEW REPORT FINDS 171 DRUG-RELATED HOSPITALISATIONS PER DAY IN AUSTRALIA 2020-21

There were 62,486 drug-related hospitalisations (excluding alcohol and tobacco) among Australians in 2020-21, according to a new report released by the Drug Trends program at the National Drug and Alcohol Research Centre (NDARC), UNSW Sydney.



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## INTERROGATING THE GENDER GAP IN OVERDOSE DEATHS

We examine alleged causes of the higher overdose death toll among men - and explain why it may mask a more complex story about gender and drugs.

Australia's Annual Overdose Report 2022 found that men accounted for 71.3% of unintentional drug-induced deaths (UDIDs) in 2020, and they reliably make up around two-thirds of UDIDs The report also found that, while the incidence of UDIDs is increasing for both men and women, it is increasing more rapidly for men. Since 2012 the number of unintentional deaths among men increased by 45%, while deaths among women increased by 12%.
