
Penang State Aspirations


Our Material ESG Factors

It is essential to identify significant ESG factors that can impact the PDC's ability to create value. Their effective management is pivotal to ensuring long-term economic competitiveness and sustainability, which in turn enhances Penang's appeal as a global investment destination. These ESG factors are categorised into four primary themes: environmental, economic, social, and governance. These themes dictate the content, structure and extent of our reporting efforts. We review these ESG factors on an annual basis to ensure relevance and alignment with our objectives.

The Materiality Assessment Process

Identifying What Matters

Materiality assessments are essential aspects of our sustainability strategy. They enable us to identify and evaluate the ESG issues that present the most substantial risks and opportunities for our operations and major stakeholders. By understanding and effectively managing these issues, we can enhance our value creation process and fortify Penang's economic strength and appeal as an investment destination. This year, following a four-step process, we conducted PDC's inaugural materiality assessment.



Our appointed consultant organised a tailored materiality assessment workshop, bringing together 38 participants from PDC's Heads of Departments, Senior Executives from all divisions and C-suites members from seven subsidiaries. This workshop proved to be a targeted and insightful forum, allowing key stakeholders within the PDC ecosystem to collectively explore and identify the most critical ESG factors relevant to their operations. The diverse perspectives and expertise of participants enriched the discussions, offering a comprehensive understanding of the material issues that significantly impact both PDC and

its subsidiaries. Through collaborative dialogue and interactive sessions, the workshop aimed to establish a unified approach to prioritising sustainability concerns, aligning corporate strategies with stakeholder expectations and enhancing overall ESG performance across PDC and its subsidiaries.












Materiality Matrix

Following the data collection process, we discerned a total of 13 material matters. 

Corporate Governance and Anti-Corruption

In our business operations, PDC is committed to upholding the greatest standards of honesty, transparency and accountability. We endeavour to comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations, including the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission ("MACC") Act 2009, the MACC (Amendment) Act 2018 and any local anti-bribery or anti-corruption laws. Our employees are required to follow all applicable laws and regulations.

We established three ethical policies that serve as guiding principles to safeguard the operational integrity and long-term viability of our organisation. These policies guide us in adhering to transparent governance practices.



WHISTLEBLOWING POLICY

- 1. Corruption and integrity related complaint channels are provided in line with the Whistleblower Protection Act 2010 (Act 711) and the PDC Whistleblower Protection Guidelines.
- 2. Ensure that the complainant's information is not disclosed and known by any party.
- 3. Every complaint received will be followed up by PDC.
- 4. The integrity unit is responsible for carrying out the PDC's Corruption and Integrity-related Complaint Management function.

PDC Integrity Unit

Adequate Procedure Guidelines were released on December 10, 2018, in accordance with Section 17A (5) of the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission Act 2009 (Amendment 2018). These guidelines are intended to assist commercial organisations in understanding how to implement effective anti-corruption measures in their business operations. To ensure compliance with Service Circular No. 6 Year 2013 and to increase the effectiveness of the Integrity Unit in federal and state ministries, departments and public organisations, a guideline for Integrity Unit Management was released in 2019.


By aligning with these guidelines, PDC established an Integrity Unit to realise our vision of combating corruption and making Malaysia a country of integrity. According to Service Circular No. 6 of 2013, the Integrity Unit is in charge of implementing the following five (5) key functions:



In line with our commitment to integrity and good governance, PDC's Integrity Unit remains dedicated to upholding the highest standards of ethical conduct and ensuring compliance with all relevant laws and regulations. By fostering a culture of integrity, we contribute to Malaysia's journey towards becoming a nation of transparency and trust.

Integrity and Anti-Corruption Programmes

All government agencies, including PDC and our subsidiary companies, are mandated to implement integrity and anti-corruption programmes. These programmes will be implemented in stages and include the following:



PDC organised the Risk Management Corruption Workshop in collaboration with the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Academy ("MACA") and the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission ("MACC"). We also received support from the Penang State Secretary's Office's Integrity Unit, which contributed to the success of the session. The workshop aimed to identify risks in PDC's activities in order to eliminate corruption, reduce complaints, improve service and quality and make other associated efforts.

We also actively promoted a culture of integrity by holding briefing sessions for our stakeholders on the topic. The objectives of these training programmes are to increase knowledge, teach moral principles and build a culture of integrity within our firm. By giving our stakeholders the information and resources to make moral judgements, we demonstrate our commitment to sustaining the highest standards of behaviour and accountability. Data Privacy and Cybersecurity

We are aware of the threats that arise from rapidly advancing technologies and digital breakthroughs. Data breaches and cyberattacks have the potential to adversely affect business and weaken stakeholder trust. As a result, we are dedicated to maintaining the highest level of security to ensure zero data breaches.

We launched initiatives for various essential cybersecurity measures, such as ICT Safety Announcements ("Hebahan Keselamatan ICT"), cybersecurity awareness programmes and periodic reminders to increase our security and data privacy procedures. The main objective of PDC's frequent ICT safety announcements is to embed a culture that champions ICT safety across the Group. They educate employees and stakeholders on potential ICT-related risks, cybersecurity threats and best practices for safeguarding sensitive data. By sharing timely and pertinent information and ensuring continuous integrity and security of our digital activities, we strengthen PDC's cybersecurity position and minimise ICT-related events.

We also conducted briefings and advisory programmes for our stakeholders to help raise digital awareness.

In FY 2023, PDC received no credible complaints about data and privacy breaches from our suppliers, customers or internal staff.





GBS@Mayang, previously known as Mayang Mall, is a 1-block, 4-storey building located in Bayan Baru. It was restored by PDC to become an MSC Malaysia Tier 1 Global Business Centre.

In response to the rising demand for GBS office spaces in Penang, PDC began another MSC Tier 1 GBS project. We purchased 3.5 acres of property on which to construct the new two-story office building for the cost of RM21 million. The structure was completed in October 2020.

Entrepreneur Development

PDC remains steadfast in our commitment to empower and nurture entrepreneurs through various programmes and courses. In addition to these initiatives, we provide supplementary microcredit loans to Penang businesses, bolstering local businesses.





The Penang State Government, through PDC, launched SPH to aid in the creation of a fund to offer additional financing for small traders and enterprises. This extra capital allows these small traders to expand their operations while also indirectly increasing their living expenses and household income.

A budget of RM13.0 million has been set aside for this purpose. These loans are made without collateral and range from RM5,000 to RM50,000.

The state government launched TUT to encourage young people to pursue careers in agro-based industries. PDC was chosen by the State Government to help implement TUT.

TUT loan applications are made through the organising committee, which includes the Penang Departments of Agriculture, Fisheries, and Veterinary. The organising committee is in charge of evaluating applications in order to identify qualified applicants. The state government has allocated RM750,000.00 to implement this programme. Since 2015. RM1.099.000.00 has been disbursed to 195 borrowers.

Property Innovation

PDC is committed to supporting property innovation throughout Penang. We always strive to reinvent and redefine the urban landscape, surpassing the conventional limits of real estate development. <u>Urban Redevelopment of Sia Boey Urban Archaeological Park</u>

In Sia Boey, we launched an impressive urban reconstruction project that has given the area new life and made it into the enticing Sia Boey Urban Archaeological Park. Located in the centre of George Town, Sia Boey has a long history of serving as a major trading centre. A lively market hall, traditional shop buildings, the famous old Ansons Bridge and the historic Police Barrack were all part of the thriving life of this important commercial centre in the 19th



century in the area surrounding the Prangin Canal. Both "Sia Boey" in Penang Hokkien and "Ujong Pasir" in Malay are names that signify the "end of the village," highlighting the importance of this location as a crucial crossroads for trade and social interaction.



The Sia Boey Conservation Project, initiated on March 25, 2018, marked a crucial step in the revitalisation of Sia Boey. Covering a substantial area of 5.73 acres, this project was driven by the objective to meld urban development with heritage conservation, green spaces and sustainable practices. The Sia Boey Urban Archaeological Park, the final product, is evidence of PDC's dedication to safeguarding and honouring Penang's rich past.



Urban Redevelopment of KOMTAR



We are proud to introduce our comprehensive green initiatives, which encompass renewable energy ("RE"), energy efficiency ("EE") and electric vehicle ("EV") charging station projects for all PDC-owned facilities. These initiatives not only reflect our commitment to reduce our carbon footprint but also underscore our dedication to a healthier planet and a brighter future.

One of the key pillars of PDC's green initiatives is the integration of renewable energy sources across all our facilities. We understand the critical role that renewable energy plays in reducing GHG emissions and mitigating climate change. As part of our commitment to renewable energy, through our subsidiary companies, Solar Voltech Sdn. Bhd. and PDC Nusabina Sdn. Bhd., we have taken the following steps:

1. Embracing Renewable Energy

Solar Power installations:

We have installed solar panels on the rooftops of our office building and PDC-owned building currently leased by Marelli Automotive Lighting Malaysia to harness the power of the sun. These solar panels generate clean and sustainable electricity, reducing our reliance on fossil fuels and lowering our energy costs.

In 2024, PDC targets to install capacity of 7,535kWp of solar power at our owned facilities. This installation through our subsidiary company, Solar Voltech, will contribute to approximately 5,200 ton of offset CO_2 emission and annual CO_2 absorption by 239,200 trees. PDC also targets to reduce our facilities energy cost by 30% lower than the current operation cost.

2. Improving Energy Efficiency

Energy efficiency is another critical aspect of our green initiative. It is not just about producing clean energy but also about using it wisely and minimising waste.

Some steps taken and planned to enhance energy efficiency is to have regular energy audits to identify areas of improvement. Solar Voltech will help us by identifying energy-inefficient practices and equipment. We can then make targeted changes to enhance efficiency.

3. Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

As part of our green initiative, we are committed to promoting the adoption of electric vehicles in Penang. To support this transition, Solar Voltech will help us to install cumulative of 25 Nos. AC and DC EV Charging Stations at our strategic facilities by 2024. This EV charging station will be powered by 100% green and clean energy source.

By supporting electric vehicle usage, we contribute to reducing harmful emissions and promote cleaner air in our communities.




Preserving Our Water Resources

By capturing and utilising rainwater for non-potable purposes such as lavatory use and washing, our customers can significantly contribute to water conservation efforts in Penang State. This practice not only conserves water but also minimises energy consumption, reducing our collective carbon footprint.

Waste Management

Aligning with the Principles of Circular Economy

We place great importance on proper waste management as an integral component of our commitment to environmental responsibility. In pursuit of this, we introduced recycling bins to collect recyclables such as paper, plastic and glass across our premises. By encouraging the separation of recyclable materials, we aim to reduce our ecological footprint and promote the efficient use of resources.





In addition, we are dedicated to promoting sustainability and supporting education in our community. We are a proud participant of the 'E-Refurbishing to E-Learning' programme, an initiative launched in 2020 by the State Government to aid underprivileged school students. As part of our contribution, we supplied refurbished desktop computers in good condition to this charitable cause where the computers were used in schools to improve the IT knowledge of school children.

By contributing to this programme, we aim to enhance e-learning facilities for primary and secondary school students. This initiative aligns with our commitment to reducing electronic waste and ensuring these resources are put to meaningful use. Biodiversity

Greening Our Townships

The goal of an eco-city is to create a harmonious balance between urban development and nature, ensuring a high quality of life for residents while minimising negative impacts on the environment. PDC is devoted to the preservation of Penang's natural heritage while nurturing sustainable urban development. Our biodiversity conservation initiatives are designed to promote a harmonious balance between progress and environmental preservation.

In our flagship development project, Bandar Cassia, we adhere to EcoCity Guidelines to preserve the mangrove area along the coastal lines (142 ft from the boundary). This dedication to ecological preservation ensures the safeguarding of crucial habitats and indigenous flora and fauna.



Since 2006, we have taken significant strides to enhance the green spaces within Batu Kawan, the locale of Bandar Cassia and Penang Science Park. Over 12,000 trees, 28,000 shrubs, and expanses of grassland were meticulously planted. These efforts increase green cover and transform the area into a thriving eco-city, promoting biodiversity in an

urban landscape. The meticulous selection of tree species also plays a pivotal role in nurturing biodiversity. Native tree species offer a variety of ecological advantages, such as the restoration of natural habitats and the provision of sustenance to local wildlife. Hence, we chose species indigenous to Penang, such as Cassia Siamea, Samanea Saman, Dalbergia Oliveri, Fragrea Fragrans and Bucida Molineti for planting. These selected trees will support and sustain the intricate and vibrant ecosystem that defines Penang.

PDC provides ongoing financial resources, information, programmes and training to promote a culture of safety and health, encouraging shared responsibility among its employees and stakeholders.




Swift Response to Incidents:

PDC ensures the efficient implementation of Occupational Safety and Health Management which includes continuous improvements aligned with the department's mission, vision and objectives.




The functions of the Occupational Health and Safety Committee ("OHS") are as follows:

- Assist in developing safe work systems or procedures
- 2. Conduct studies on accident trends, near misses, hazardous incidents and occupational illnesses or diseases
- 3. Review the effectiveness of health and safety programmes
- 4. Review health and safety policies
- 5. Conduct workplace inspections and propose improvements
- Investigate accidents and make suggestions
- 7. Take action on reports and recommendations from Functions 5&6

- 8. Handle complaints related to unsafe conditions and propose improvements
- 9. Resolve received complaints
- Assist employers in promoting activities such as campaigns, lectures and other initiatives to encourage safe working practices
- 11. Discuss and consider reports submitted by:
 - i. Health and safety auditors
 - ii. Government agency enforcement officers
 - iii. Other reports and information submitted by the committee

PDC has also established a Fire Safety Organisational ("FSO") Committee with a total of 40 members. The objective of the FSO is to establish and enforce fire safety policies in compliance with relevant laws, as outlined in the Fire Services Act 1988 under the provisions of Fire Certification and Fire Extinguishing.



The functions of the Occupational Health and Safety ("OHS") Committee are as follows:

- Preparing policies, guidelines and implementation directives for issuing fire safety certificates
- Reviewing legal aspects related to the Fire Safety Installation Requirements ("PKK")
- Providing guidelines for the inspection and testing of PKK
- Monitoring the implementation of fire safety certificate issuance

As the construction arm of PDC, PDC Nusabina Sdn Bhd places the health and safety of our workforce as our utmost priority. We appointed a dedicated health and safety officer who meticulously oversees our workforce's safety during on-site construction operations. This officer is also responsible for implementing and rigorously enforcing safety protocols, ensuring that all construction activities adhere to the most stringent safety standards.

Roles and Responsibilities of PDC's Safety and Health Officers



Provide safety and health advice to the employer or relevant personnel concerning necessary safety measures.



Inspect the workplace to identify potential hazards, including machinery, equipment, materials, tools or processes that could cause injuries.



Investigate accidents, near misses, dangerous incidents, occupational hazards or illnesses occurring in the workplace.



Assist the safety and health committee in organising and implementing occupational safety and health programmes per Occupational Safety and Health Regulations (Safety and Health Committee) 1996, Regulation 11.



Act as the secretary for the safety and health committee, performing all secretarial functions specified in the Occupational Safety and Health (Safety and Health Committee) 1996, Sub-regulation 6(2).



Support safety and health committee inspections to assess the effectiveness of implemented measures and ensure compliance with the Act and related regulations.



Collect, analyse and record statistics related to accidents, dangerous incidents, occupational hazards or illnesses occurring in the workplace.



Assist in fulfilling duties under the Act or related regulations and follow instructions given by responsible personnel regarding workplace safety and health matters.

Responsible Supply Chain



We maintain a well-defined procurement policy and approval document, both of which serve as benchmarks for our supplier and sub-contractor selection procedures. These terms outline our expectations regarding responsible sourcing, environmental compliance and social responsibility. They also serve as guidelines that encompass ethical conduct, fair labour practices and stringent quality standards. By adhering to these criteria, we guarantee that our partners meet the highest ethical and professional standards, reinforcing our commitment to responsible sourcing practices.


Human Capital Development






















Employee Demographics
