Introduction

Welcome to a review of another fantastic season for HYFC's 400 players across our twenty-two playing teams.

Our army of eighty registered coaches plus team admins and a host of other volunteers have made football possible. Thanks to every single one of them.

At this point last year, we revealed our refreshed identity which has been rolled out through the season with a new website and Club app. We have introduced brand new kits for most teams, along with launching Club merchandise and teamwear.

We have again achieved 2* Accreditation with the FA which is essential for playing league, cup and tournament football. This has resulted from our increased investment in safeguarding and coaching development.

We've improved the matchday experience with the *Match Hatch* at the Airfield along with the *Whistler* at Woodways. We're working closely with Haddenham Parish Council and the Football Foundation to improve the pitches. Next season, we will fully implement our commitment to Smoke Free Sidelines.

We're expanding our range of partnerships, including GK Icon for goalkeeper training and Fitlife for strength and conditioning. We're now formally affiliated to Haddenham United FC, providing a pathway from U6s to adult football. The U12, U13 and U14 teams all played friendlies against the Paris St Germain's London Academy team, providing a fantastic experience for the boys and forging a relationship on which we hope to build.

An exciting feature of the year was the continued development of Girls' football. We'll launch a fifth girls only team next season and we hope to see more girls graduating to Haddenham Ladies in the coming years. We are grateful to Haddenham Beer Festivals Trust for backing our plans to grow Girls' football as well as the HYFC Community Fund. We're also working with local clubs to develop a PAN-Disability team.

There are too many highlights to list every one, but they certainly include Haddenham Ladies - part of HYFC - playing their first FA Cup match. The U17s and U11 Rangers are looking forward to Cup Finals at Thame's stadium - please go along and support. The U12 Rangers and U12G could still win their respective leagues.

Perhaps the two headline achievements are the U16s being crowned league champions in the last few days and the U18s winning Division 1 last weekend, with many of that team having played for HYFC all the way from U6s!

Thanks to all the U18s players for their hard work and dedication and we wish them well in their football journeys and the big wide world ahead! A special mention for Paul Moore and David Heafield, the U18s management team: thank you and enjoy your well-deserved rest, you have certainly set the standard for the rest of us....

Four themes emerge from the twenty-two reviews which follow: genuine team spirit; friendships forming and lasting; a culture of both learning and fun; and the nurturing of an enduring love for the beautiful game. Oh – not forgetting great performances and lots of goals!

Today, we're launching a Players' Committee which will start next season with representatives from every age group. We are committed to giving players a voice in the running of their Club. We'll also be surveying parents soon – please look out for that and give us your feedback.

Good luck to every player in the remaining league fixtures as well as cups and summer tournaments. Following last year's success, the HYFC Festival of Football returns on 31 August/1 September at the Airfield - see you there!
