Teen Action Council

In 2024, we created our inaugural Teen Action Council, TAC. The TAC is composed of Collin County teens in grades 9-12, who together formed a leadership board; eager not only to make a difference in their communities but to learn more about homelessness in North Texas.

The TAC meets on a regular basis to gain knowledge about The Samaritan Inn and discuss ways to be advocates for the homeless in their communities. They also help organize and assist in our Family and Teen Service Days as well as other service projects throughout their term.



Individual Volunteers by area





How to get involved as an individual volunteer

Steps to Become an Individual Volunteer

1) Visit our website

2) Complete the Online Application Please complete the online volunteer

application for all individuals interested in volunteering. Teens must be between the ages of 14-18 to volunteer alongside a parent.

3) Complete the Background Check Form

We complete a background check for all potential volunteers. Download and complete the DPS form and upload to the form using the link on the website or email to volunteer@saminn.org.





4) Submit a Processing Fee

Please submit individual volunteer fee of \$25 per person to help cover the cost of a background check and processing fees.

5) Attend an Introduction to the Inn

The volunteer coordinator will email the applicant once all information is received and application is completed to schedule an Introduction to The Samaritan Inn shift.

Individuals.

Individual volunteers who are interested in volunteering on a regular, on-going basis. Please complete the steps below to become an individual volunteer.



Court Ordered Community Service.

We allow community service volunteers over the age of 18 to serve at our thrift store. If interested, complete the Individual Application steps.



Service Learning and Internships.

Opportunities are available for service learning as well as social work and counseling interns. Service Learning volunteers need to complete the steps below. Internships need to email volunteer@saminn.org to inquire on available internships.




Teens.

Teen volunteers (14-18) can become Individual volunteers by completing the steps outlined. Teens (14-18) must volunteer alongside a parent or adult guardian. Parents and adult guardians must complete the application process as well.

At The Samaritan Inn, group volunteers provide support through a number of organized activities designed to help meet the needs of the shelter. Groups include corporate teams, school clubs, faith-based organizations, families, and community service groups. By working together, volunteer groups help The Samaritan Inn complete needed tasks while learning about The Samaritan Inn and our programs, while also raising awareness about homelessness within our community.


Group Activity Breakdowns

Learn and Serve

Groups will begin with a tour of our shelter to learn more about our program. Upon completion of the tour, your group will do various jobs like sorting, organizing, inventory of donations, deep cleaning, etc.

Meal Sponsorship

For a financial sponsorship of \$500 up to 8 people can come and serve a meal to our residents. Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner sponsorships are available.

Bag Lunch Brigade

Groups can assist in making bag lunches. Your group can help by bringing the supplies and making bag lunches in our dining room.

Resident Activity

Plan a resident activity alongside our resident activities coordinator.

Donation Drive

Collect some of our most needed items within your friend group, club, neighborhood, school or church and deliver to the shelter. Please connect with the volunteer department for a calendar for needed items, as well as gift card donation information, and hygiene and linen kit information.

Thrift Store Workday

Organize a service day at our Thrift Store, where tasks include sorting, organizing, and receiving donations.

Schedule a Tour

Schedule a tour of our shelter to learn more about the work being done at The Samaritan Inn. Tours can be combined with any of the above, encouraged with donation and gift card drives.
