Editor's Opinion

AS Lym Life was going to press I was still picking through the pieces of Warrington Borough Council's proposed budget, which could literally see the lights going out!

There is also a stark warning that if the council can't balance the books following savage cut backs and a council tax rise above the current 5 per cent limit, the council could face being served with a Section 114 notice, effectively declaring the council bankrupt!

Details appear in a newly published Cabinet and Scrutiny papers. Buried deep in hundreds of pages of technical documents, the plans would see darker streets, reduced services, higher charges and increased fines — while residents are asked to accept more pain with little clarity on accountability.

Street lighting reductions are framed as a cost-saving measure. Yet there is no clear, publicly presented assessment of the impact on road safety, crime, personal security or community confidence. For many, the decision to "turn off the lights" has become a metaphor for a council still failing to illuminate how Warrington reached this point.

Beyond lighting, the same papers set out a sweeping programme of cuts and income generation measures, including:

The sale of assets like Birchwood Park, Redwood Bank and Times Square.

- Closure and mothballing of

council buildings

- Community centres and libraries placed under review, with the expectation that volunteers or community groups take over if services are to survive
- Services reduced to statutory minimums only, ending discretionary support
- Council jobs deleted, reducing capacity across departments
- Increases in parking charges, resident permits, leisure fees and golf course prices
- Introduction of moving traffic offence enforcement, creating new fines where none previously existed

These measures are not presented in a clear, resident-friendly way. Instead, they are scattered across dozens of financial tables, requiring expert knowledge to interpret — a fact critics say actively discourages public understanding.

Despite the scale of the changes, the budget itself remains unstable.

The council is currently assuming a 4.99% council tax increase, but its own papers confirm this figure is speculative. Warrington has formally applied to Government for Exceptional Financial Support (EFS) and, as part of that request, has asked for permission to raise

council tax above 5%.

If that permission is granted, residents should expect the increase to rise further — after scrutiny has already taken place.

More starkly, the papers make clear that without EFS the council cannot legally balance its budget. In that scenario, the council's Section 151 Officer would be required to issue a Section 114 notice, effectively declaring the authority unable to meet its financial obligations.

Lymm community backs UK Town of Culture bid following public meeting

A public meeting in Lymm has sparked strong community backing for exploring a bid to become a UK Town of Culture, with residents turning out to share ideas, energy, and support for a community-led approach- with a top prize of £3m up for grabs.

The meeting revealed real enthusiasm for using the bid to bring Lymm together, build on its existing cultural strengths, and create new opportunities — particularly by involving younger people and ensuring their ideas and priorities help shape any future plans.

Following the meeting, it was agreed that a working group will now be formed to develop an initial Expression of Interest for the UK Town of Culture 2028 competition. The group will be independent and community-led, bringing together residents, creatives, and local organisations.

Cllr Sally Sharma, Chair of Lymm Parish Council, said: "The response from the community has been incredibly encouraging. What stood out was the creativity in the room and the strong desire to build something that reflects Lymm's identity, culture, and sense of community. There was also a clear message about involving the next generation and making sure young people's voices are part of the story from the very start."

Cllr. Colin Oakley said: "This meeting showed just how much energy and pride there is in Lymm.

"A UK Town of Culture bid has the potential to bring people together around a shared vision, and the strength of any bid will come from the community itself. It's really positive to see people stepping forward to help take this idea on."

Cllr. Graham Gowland added: "The buzz in the room was

fantastic. People brought forward a huge range of thoughtful, creative ideas, and there was a real sense of excitement about what Lymm could achieve by working together. It showed just how much talent and enthusiasm already exists in the community."

The UK Town of Culture programme supports places across the country to celebrate their identity, strengthen community pride, and develop a shared cultural vision with lasting benefits.

Any bid from Lymm would focus on showcasing what already makes the community special, while creating space for new ideas and wider participation.

Organisers have stressed that the bid does not involve any change to Lymm's legal status or governance, and that there is no practical distinction between a town or a village within the competition.

Further details about the working group and next steps will be shared in due course.

Village set to face two lots of 18 weeks of road closures

HIGHWAY planners have announced two lots of 18 weeks of road closures for Lymm village to allow Scottish Power to install a new HV Cable.

It means at least two lots of eighteen week road closures will be running tandem in the village.

Local Cllr. Graham Gowland commented: "At times it feels as though Lymm has been cut off from the rest of the world. Key routes linking us to the motorway are closed, and the temporary three-way lights on the main road through the village are completely snarling up traffic. Children are arriving late for school, and adults are late for work — it's causing real disruption for residents.

"Some of the roadworks are unavoidable emergency repairs, such as the collapsed sewer, but a significant amount is planned work, including new electrical mains and the resurfacing of the A56. While it's positive that we'll benefit from more reliable power and smoother roads in the long run, people are understandably getting very fed up in the meantime.

"I'm pressing officers to make sure works are properly coordinated to minimise the impact as much as possible — and in the meantime, I may be getting my bike out to dodge the jams."

Warrington Borough Council has given notice it intends to make an Order under Section 14 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The effect of which will be to introduce a prohibition of driving as follows: Eagle Brow from its junction with Booths Hill Road to its junction with Brookfield Road; Brookfield Road from its junction with Eagle Brow to its junction with Dane Bank Road; Dane Bank Road from its junction with Brookfield Road to its junction with Dane Bank Road East; Dane Bank Road East from its junction with Dane Bank Road to its junction with Dane Bank Road East.

The Order will be effective from 2nd March 2026 for 18 weeks, with the works being carried out in phases, as and when signed on site. Access will be under the control of the relevant Contractor for the duration of the works.

The alternative routes will be as follows: Eagle Brow via Higher Lane, Brookfield Road, Eagle Brow, The Cross, New Road, Rushgreen Road, Birchbrook Road and vice versa; Stage Lane via Mill Lane, Birchbrook Road, Sandy Lane and vice versa; Oughtrington Crescent via Higher Lane, Brookfield Road, Eagle Brow, The Cross, New Road, Rushgreen Road, Birchbrook Road, Sandy Lane and vice versa; Sandy Lane via Birchbrook Road, Mill Lane, Stage Lane and vice versa.

The closure is required to allow Scottish Power to install a new HV cable.



Developer pledges £3m investment for local community as part of plan for 170 new homes

WARRINGTON-based property developer Miller Homes has completed the acquisition of a new residential development site off Warrington Road, Lymm, pledging £3m investment for the local community.

The 18-acre site has outline planning permission in place for up to 170 new homes and will offer a well-planned new neighbourhood in one of Cheshire's most popular villages. More than half of the site will be given over to public open space and landscaping, helping to create a green and open setting for future residents.

As part of a Section 106 agreement with Warrington Borough Council, 30 per cent of the homes will be delivered as affordable housing. Miller Homes will also contribute around £3 million towards local education, health and sports facilities, alongside improvements to the Trans Pennine Trail, which runs along the southern edge of the site.

The site's location close to Lymm village centre, combined with good links to Warrington and the wider region, makes it well-suited to a range of buyers, from first-time purchasers to growing families. The scale of the development also allows for a strong focus on placemaking, with space for landscaping, walking routes and connections into the surrounding area.


John Hardy, Land Director at Miller Homes, said: "Lymm is a location we've been keen to secure for some time, so we're really pleased to have completed on this site. It's a great opportunity to deliver new homes in an area where demand remains strong, while also bringing forward meaningful green space and investment for the local community."

Jason Newton, Managing Director for Miller Homes North West, added: "Completing this acquisition is another positive step for our North West business. The site offers the right balance of location, scale and planning certainty, and we're looking forward to progressing plans to bring forward a high-quality new development that works well for both new residents and the wider area."

The acquisition comes as Miller Homes continues to build momentum across the North West. In 2026, the business is targeting the completion of more than 400 new homes across the region, with a combined contract value of approximately £133 million.

The Lymm site forms part of Miller Homes ongoing commitment to delivering sustainable new homes across the North West, with further updates expected as plans progress.

Lymm Parish Council, 28 nearby residents and local borough councillor Ian Marks had lodged objections to the scheme, which involves three fields on either side of Warrington Road, Lymm. It had previously been green belt land but was removed in the council's Local Plan.

Top national award for conversion project at former bank building

THE bold plan to convert the former Barclay's Bank at Lymm into a bar, restaurant and retail units has won a top national award.

The scheme, in Eagle Brow, master-minded by local architects Randle-White in collaboration with Warrington Borough Council's building control department, won the LABC building excellence award for the best non-residential extension, alteration or conversion project.

After the awards ceremony in London, Roger White, of lead architects Randle White Ltd., said: "We went up against the rest of the county and were successful in winning the national award. The successful transformation was down to the close collaboration we had with WBC building control department, the skilled professional consultant we worked with and the client who believed in our vision for change."

The project had to first win the North West regional LABC award before going on to claim the national award. Mr White said the inspiration for the project was taken from the original 1970s bank building.

The LABC Building Excellence Awards have long been established as the premier accolades within the industry.

Lorna Stimpson, chief executive officer at LABC, said: "More 800 individuals from across England and Wales, came together,

showcasing the amazing people and projects working in our industry. The Warrington borough council building control team worked closely with the contractor and architect to overcome challenges such as maintaining pedestrian access during construction and achieving level access for all units despite the site's sloping topography. Early collaboration at pre-application stage allowed for compliant solutions, including inclusive layouts and accessible WCs, while innovative site management strategies ensured safety and minimal disruption to village life. The result is a high-quality, historically sympathetic development that exceeds building regulations and delivers lasting benefits for the local community.

"The judges commended the project for its in-depth historic research of how the building used to look, allowed for design and technical drawings to be developed to bring this successful scheme forward. Working closely with the community and building control team, developers were sensitive to the local conservation area throughout the build of the project; minimising disruption to the community and turning a vacant building into a mixed-use commercial scheme."

Healthspan in 2026: What actually adds years to your life?

We often talk about lifespan – how long we live. The more important question is healthspan – how long we remain well, independent and mentally sharp.

In Warrington, average life expectancy is around 79 years for men and 82 for women, broadly in line with national figures. However, healthy life expectancy – the years lived without significant illness or disability – is notably lower. Many people are living longer, but spending more of those later years coping with chronic disease.

The principal drivers are well established: cardiovascular disease, cancer, type 2 diabetes and cognitive decline. These conditions do not appear overnight. They develop quietly over decades before symptoms emerge, often signalled only by gradual changes in blood pressure, cholesterol or glucose levels.

The encouraging truth is that much of this risk is measurable and modifiable – both across communities and at an individual level.

Muscle mass is one of the strongest predictors of healthy ageing. From our forties onwards, we naturally lose muscle unless we actively maintain it. Reduced muscle is linked to frailty, insulin resistance and loss of independence. Two to three sessions of resistance training

per week – alongside regular walking or aerobic activity – is not about appearance; it is about preserving strength, metabolic resilience and functional capacity into later life.

Metabolic health sits at the centre of disease prevention. Waist circumference, blood pressure, fasting glucose and cholesterol provide early warning of future cardiovascular risk. Improving these markers is rarely complicated: consistent physical activity, prioritising whole foods over ultra-processed options, moderating refined carbohydrates, maintaining adequate protein intake and sustaining a healthy body composition all improve insulin sensitivity and reduce inflammation. Even modest weight reduction can significantly lower blood pressure and improve glucose control.

Substance use remains a major determinant of healthspan. Smoking is still the leading preventable cause of premature death in the UK. Alcohol increases cancer risk even at relatively low levels, and recreational drugs carry both immediate and longer-term cardiovascular and mental health

consequences.

Sleep and stress are frequently underestimated. Chronic sleep deprivation disrupts metabolic regulation, raises blood pressure and drives inflammation. Persistent stress produces similar physiological effects through sustained cortisol elevation. Seven to eight hours of consistent, restorative sleep – alongside practical stress management – is protective.

Social connection and emotional wellbeing also matter. Strong relationships, community involvement and a sense of purpose are consistently linked with lower mortality and better mental health. Isolation and chronic emotional

strain carry measurable health risks.

Importantly, these habits begin early. Children who grow up active, eating well, emotionally supported and socially connected are more likely to carry those patterns into adulthood. Preventive health starts in childhood.

That said, it is never too late to change course. The body retains remarkable capacity to respond to improved nutrition, increased activity and smoking cessation, even later in life.

Longevity is not simply about adding years. It is about ensuring those years remain active, independent and purposeful.

Day nursery group raises more than £26,000 for charity

A FAMILY run group of day nurseries and forest schools is celebrating after raising over £26,000 for charity.

Dunkys Day Nurseries and Forest Schools has been fundraising for The Children's Adventure Farm Trust (CAFT) near Lymm since 2020.

Throughout the year, children, families and staff from seven nurseries carry out numerous events including sponsored walks, runs, cake baking and seasonal fayres. One of the nursery school dads even added £375 to the total by doing a 5k daily run.

Dunkys raised £6,214 for CAFT last year and staff from the nursery recently presented the charity with a giant cheque.

Not happy with the decision – Can I appeal?

Family court decisions can be life-changing. Whether they relate to children, finances or other family matters, it's understandable that people sometimes leave court feeling the outcome is unfair or wrong. But can a decision be appealed? The short answer is maybe. It depends. There is no automatic right to appeal. Appealing a family court decision is not about simply disagreeing with the Judge. In almost every case there's usually at least one party who disagrees with the Judge. Appeals are tightly controlled and are only allowed where there is a proper legal basis.

The appeal court will not re-hear the case or reconsider the evidence just because one party is unhappy with the result. Instead, an appeal must be based on an error of law, a serious procedural irregularity, or a decision that falls outside the range of reasonable outcomes open to the Judge.

Timing is also critical. In most family cases an appeal must be started within 21 days of the decision being appealed. In some circumstances a shorter period may apply. In many situations, permission to appeal is required – either from the Judge who made the original decision or from the appeal court itself. This initial stage acts as a filter to ensure that only appeals with real merit proceed.

It is also important to consider the practical and emotional costs. Appeals can be expensive, stressful and time-consuming. In cases involving children, the court will be particularly concerned about delay and the impact further proceedings may have on them.

For these reasons, taking early advice is essential. Appealing a decision is not a step to be taken lightly. An experienced family law solicitor will be able to assess whether there are genuine grounds to appeal, explain the risks and prospects of success, and help you decide whether an appeal is the right step to take.
