

Past to Present

15th Avenue and Thomas

DECEMBER 2024

A neighbor asked what was originally at the corner of 15th Avenue and Thomas. Not much to be found, so I stopped for lunch at McGurkees (a family favorite) on the SW corner. I mentioned to Ted Theodoropoulos that I saw a photo of their building, and there used to be a pharmacy there. Did he know anything? He said, "My grandfather, Nick Gannis, built this building." Talk with my dad about this building and the others at the intersection.

Between Ted and his father Gus, the original McGurkees' owner, I learned that Mr. Gannis (Gus's father-in-law) built the unique building in 1950 with a rounded curved frontage with the front door facing the intersection. Originally, Partin's Encanto Pharmacy was on the corner, a bakery and small business fronting 15th Avenue, and the Arthur Murray Studio on Thomas to the west.

In January 1974, McGurkees opened in the building. Across the street, the State of Arizona Real Estate Department was housed in today's Hamburger Works (est. 1977). Gus recalled after Arthur Murray moved out, Safeway set up a mini grocery store, complete with registers, carts, and stock, to train employees.

Today, it is once again a dance studio. The pharmacy left some time ago. Today, Strawberry Hedgehog, a soap and vegan boutique center, uses Partin's space.

Gus noted that the north sides of the intersection had gas stations. Today, the stations have morphed into a Circle K with gas on the NE and a gas station conversion on the NW, serving as two Asian restaurants. In 2022, owner Aaron Schofield opened Luanas Coffee and Beer, and as his business' Instagram says, it's where "your favorite coffee shop meets your boyfriend's favorite dive bar."

Gus was uncertain whether the SE corner was called the Encanto Village shopping center. If it were, an American Modernist architect, Edward L. Varney, likely designed it in 1946. His portfolio mentions a project of this name. This corner will have to wait for further exploration until neighbors or readers share more information with me.



I wanted to share something for you to use after the holidays.
I started this a few years ago.

Grab fruit box from Costco as shown in the pictures below and using a box cutter, cut off all the sides of the box leaving just the bottom which I then cut in half as shown. Then I cut a notch into one side.



Taking a string of lights I put one end in the notch then wrapped the string around the cardboard until the end and slid the other end under the wrapped lights and plugged it into the other end. Make as many as you need.



Then put them into a container that you have. You can then put a trash bag over the whole thing to keep the dust off. And next year you take them out and easily test each one before you use them.

Mindful Moments

Welcome to 'Mindful Moments,' a monthly retreat to calm amid our festive neighborhood bustle. I'm Allison, a local therapist passionate about sharing practical mental wellness strategies.

This month, we'll explore a powerful Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) skill called 'Opposite Action.' This technique helps us manage overwhelming emotions by doing the opposite of what we feel like doing.

When you notice a strong emotion, gently pause and name it. Consider what action your emotion is urging you to take. Is anger making you want to lash out? Is anxiety making you want to avoid? Is sadness telling you to isolate?

Here's the key: when you feel ready, try the opposite. If anger urges you to yell, you might take a walk. If anxiety suggests staying home, maybe step outside briefly. If sadness pulls you to isolate, consider sending a friendly text or calling a friend.

Opposite Action isn't about ignoring your emotions – they're valid messengers. It's about exploring new choices that align with your values.

Opposite Action can feel challenging at first, but with practice, it becomes a powerful tool for emotional regulation. Start small – even tiny opposite actions can lead to significant shifts in how you feel.

Until next time, may you find strength in choosing your actions wisely.

Reminder to All Neighbors:



There is NO Routine Bulk Trash Pickup

- It is illegal to dump non-contained trash in the alley.
- You can be fined for dumping illegally, amount to be determined after a report is filed and an investigation by the City of Phoenix is complete.
- Homeowners can request non-contained bulk trash pickup.
- Request can be done online through the City of Phoenix website.
- Each homeowner is responsible for what is dumped in the alley, no matter who placed it there.


