Class 43 Preps for Vietnam

Module Three is nearing the end signaling the transition from gaining insights and perspectives about the economic, environmental, social, and cultural importance of natural resources in Washington State to those in international settings. Class 43 has had the opportunity to look inside the complexities of producing and transporting ag and forest products to customers, the interrelationships among competing uses for natural resources and look at significant natural resource policy issues--impacts, perspectives, and solutions.

Over the last two months Class 43 completed seminars in Skagit Valley and Walla Walla; each providing learnings about producer needs, immigration concepts, and land use concerns. Class members are asking "deep dive" questions of speakers, leaning into the on-site opportunities.

Class 43 President Mikala Staples Hughes shared that AgForestry helped her increase confidence, skill set, and experiences that allowed her to further serve her community on boards and committees including Skagit County Voluntary Stewardship Watershed Board, Western Washington Agricultural Association, and advisory committee for CTE and FFA. Mikala wrote, "I attribute all of these experiences directly to the leadership and systems knowledge I recently developed through the program".

Alumni and prospective class members stepped up and attended receptions at both seminars. Without the support of past grads AgForestry would not the impact currently enjoyed. Class 43 appreciates the networking opportunity and meeting people who share their value of personal and professional growth and lifelong learning.

Class 44 Completes Personal Leadership Module

Class 44 has completed Module One: Personal Leadership. This module was a whirlwind, beginning in Pullman in October, then to Spokane in November, and wrapping up in Wenatchee in December, where the class enjoyed the beauty of freshly fallen snow all week long. In Module One, participants gain selfawareness through a 360 Assessment and the DiSC Personality profile. They learn about and practiced mindfulness and emotional intelligence. Each participant delivered and redelivered their first persuasive speech, capturing valuable feedback from the professional panel and their peers. Two of their highlight experiences included tours at the Spokesman-Review with Rob Curley and at Stemilt with West Mathison.
