However, many critical improvements happen behind the scenes to ensure our operations run seamlessly, from new HVAC units in the cottages to commercial-grade laundry infrastructure in the clubhouse basement.

I am incredibly grateful to our ownership group for their unwavering commitment to the Sycamore Hills experience. Having spent time at clubs that frequently 'kicked the can down the road' regarding infrastructure, I find it refreshing that we never compromise on the long-term health of our Club. Finally, we are incredibly honored to host the Rolex Girls Junior Championship from June 15–18. This is one of the American Junior Golf Association's (AJGA) most prestigious "Major" events, bringing the top 72 junior girls in the world, right here to our fairways. Sycamore Hills

has a storied history of developing the next generation of greats—having previously hosted the Junior PGA and USGA Girls' Junior championships—and we take immense pride in seeing players who once competed on our course, like Nelly Korda and Lilia Vu, go on to dominate the LPGA. Hosting an event of this caliber is a testament to the championship quality of our Nicklaus Signature design, yet the tournament has a very low impact on club operations, as the small, elite field allows for a condensed schedule that keeps most member amenities running smoothly. To make this week a success, we are looking for volunteers to help with tournament operations. It is a front-row seat to witness the future of women's golf, and we would love for you to be a part of it!



As the days get longer and the preparations for spring move into high gear, the energy around the Clubhouse is palpable. Whether it's the upcoming arrival of the new golf car fleet or the familiar faces of our dedicated team, everything is falling into place for a spectacular year. Thank you for your continued support and for making Sycamore Hills such a special place to call home. THE WINTER PUZZLE: Preparing for the 2026 Golf Operations



Dear Members,

I hope your winter season is going well! It is hard to believe the 2026 Golf Season will soon be upon us. Many times, I am asked "what do you and your staff do all winter? The winters must get boring." This always amuses me as I consider the winter months not only a very active time of the year for me and my staff, but

in many cases the most important time. Beginning in November through February, we are planning, scheduling, and finalizing all the details for the Golf Operation. This includes our business plan, budgeting, organizing golf events, instruction programming, retail operation, marketing, staffing, and various operational needs.

For golf events, this process gets started each fall following the Ladies and Men's Closing Day events. The procedure involves reviewing each event with the Management Team. We discuss the details including format, favors, food, timing, participation, and anything we believe could be done for a better member experience. Next, I begin looking at the calendar concerning the dates for the events. Placing the events into the calendar involves more than just the club consideration. With some events, I need to understand the other private club event dates, the Fort Wayne Ladies and Men's Golf Association dates, the Indiana Golf Office dates, and the United States Golf Association dates. This puzzle can be challenging sometimes which leads to scenarios like the Men's Sycamore Cup and FOPS overlapping in 2025. My goal for releasing the Golf Calendars to the membership is February 1 of the current year. Some years I am able to deliver earlier.

Once the calendars for Men's, Ladies, Couples, Family, and Member-Guest events are released, Gage and Meggie have already been working behind the scenes to put the events into Golf Genius. This process allows members to view event details and register for participation. Our goal for opening member registration is mid-February (with the exception of 'The Invitational'). Finalizing all the details for the events also includes reviewing 'The Player's Fee' budget per event to determine event budgets for food, beverage, favors, and prizes. These event budgets allow my staff to understand exactly how much money is allocated toward favors and trophies so they can utilize the PGA Merchandise Show to compare options, decide, and order products.

On the topic of Business Plan and golf events, 2026 will see a new policy with our men's premier event, 'The Invitational'. Over the past three to five years, demand has escalated to unprecedented levels, with a waitlist as long as the field size. On April 1 of this year, our 48-team field filled within 90 seconds of registration opening. These scenarios have created frustration within the membership and, in many cases, an inequitable opportunity for participation. Beginning in 2026, 'The Invitational' will implement a Lottery System for determining the field.

2026 'THE INVITATIONAL' KEY DATES TO REMEMBER:

MARCH 3 An invitation will be sent to all golf members to register for the lottery through Golf Genius.

MARCH 12 A reminder will be sent that 72 hours remain to register for the lottery, and it will include the current list of registered participants.

MARCH 15 Entries for the lottery close at 5:00PM.

MARCH 20 We will hold a draw party at the club at 5:00PM for all registered lottery members, with complimentary drinks and appetizers. Tim Frazier and his professional staff will start the lottery promptly at 5:15PM. The lottery draw will complete the field plus twenty ranked alternate positions. A member does not have to attend the draw party to be picked for the field or as an alternate.

APRIL 1 Bill all participants in the field ½ of the entry fee (non-refundable).

JUNE 28–28 'The Invitational'



LOTTERY ENTRY DETAILS:

- A member must register for the tournament through Golf Genius.
- Beginning in 2027, any member who was on the previous year's waitlist and did not get into the field shall receive one extra lottery entry.
- If a member's name is drawn in the lottery and they elect not to play, that member will lose all extra lottery entry opportunities the following year.

LOTTERY EXEMPTIONS DETAILS:

- Exempted members must be registered by March 15 when entries close.
- Each member of the Club ownership group has one exemption that they can utilize themselves or transfer to another Sycamore Hills Member.
- All \$15,000 National Pro-Scratch Invitational Sponsors have one non-transferable exemption.
- Previous year champion member has a one-year non-transferable exemption.
- The active champion member cannot swap out a new guest and keep the exemption.
- If the guest of the winning team becomes a member, this doesn't allow for an exemption to the guest/new member.

This new Lottery System was researched by the leadership team with other prestigious clubs around the country. The ownership group encouraged the change and has approved the new Lottery System. The leadership team is excited for a more equitable system eliminating unneeded frustrations toward the club's premiere event.

Organized Ladies Golf at Sycamore Hills Golf Club will see some exciting changes for 2026! Over recent years, the Ladies 9-Hole League and five premier ladies golf events have taken place on Thursdays. The club has seen increased activity on Thursdays including open play and cottage play activity. This activity has left Thursday mornings busier than ever challenging the ladies golf experience for this day. Our goal has and always will be to offer the best golf experience for our members and their events. For this reason, organized Ladies Golf including Ladies Leagues and premier events will take place on Tuesday mornings when the club is less hectic. This change will allow the ladies to have a more exclusive feel for their organized golf. The Ladies Invitational will remain on a Thursday afternoon scheduled for July 30.

As we head toward spring, Gage and Meggie have put together some Golf Academy events to get you excited for the upcoming season. Ladies watch for Winter Camp and 'Sip & Chip' opportunities. Gentlemen you will see Beers, Bros, and Pros opportunities on Friday afternoons. For everyone we will feature four Fitting

Friday sessions, three USGA Rules of Golf seminars, private lessons, and an exciting multi-vendor demo day Saturday, March 14. Finally, for our junior golfers we will offer Birdie Golf and PGA Junior League. Please reference this newsletter and watch upcoming emails to learn more about these fun opportunities.



My team and I recently visited the PGA Merchandise Show in Orlando, Florida.

This is the industry's premiere trade show. We entered the show prepared with a detailed list of objectives to be conducted. For example, here is a snapshot of some of the team achievements:

- Take care of any 'house cleaning' items like, software, hardware, practice facility amenities, display needs.
- Network with other top clubs, professionals and industry leaders.

- 7:15AM** Breakfast meeting to discuss the coming day
- 7:45AM** Hit the show floor (we have early access as an industry leader)
- LUNCH** If schedules permit, we meet for a quick lunch and catchup for the day
- 5:30PM** Group text discussing where to meet to end the day
- 6:00PM** Wrap-up meeting for the day with possible vendor 'Happy Hour'
- 7:30PM** Staff dinner

The show is Wednesday through Friday each third week of January. Show days are very busy, but rewarding days as we work diligently to finalize your Sycamore Hills Golf Club Golf Shop Operations opportunities and experiences.

To wrap up this newsletter in exciting fashion, we will be hosting the 2026 America Junior Golf Association Girls Rolex Championship from June 15–18! This championship will feature the Top 72 Girls in the world for a 54-hole (three rounds) stroke play championship. You will see tomorrow's LPGA superstars first hand play Sycamore Hills Golf Club! 220 ACRES AND NO OFF-SEASON: The Grounds Team's Winter Mission



Dear Members,

Happy New Year!

As I look back on 2025, I am thankful for many things—first of all, that it's over! It was a crazy weather year for the Grounds Team at Sycamore. Fort Wayne broke or tied 11 weather-related records in 2025, beginning with the driest and most humid year since 1948. This dry year has placed Allen County in the Extreme Drought category heading into 2026, and we are still 13 inches below average rainfall.

I am thankful that, for the most part, the course held up to this challenging weather. Walking the course last week, I was especially grateful to see how well our fall cultural programs paid off. The playing surfaces have recovered nicely, and most of the greens that were struggling last fall have completely healed.

I am also incredibly grateful for Mary Kay and our talented team of horticulturists. They did an absolutely amazing job decorating the club and grounds for the holiday season. It is a massive undertaking that requires a tremendous amount of labor and creativity, and they deserve a great deal of credit for making the property look so festive and welcoming for our members.

I am also very thankful for my family. 2025 was a big year at the Thompson house. My oldest daughter, Emma, got married in July. My oldest son, Charlie, received his White Coat in Optometry from Missouri. My son Jack finished his apprentice certification and is now a Pipe Fitter, and my youngest son, Henry, graduated from high school. Through it all, my wife Melissa put up with me all summer while I tried to juggle everything!

As many of you know, Sycamore is a Toro National Account. This partnership allows the club to receive special pricing on turf equipment and irrigation products, as well as early access to the latest technology in the turf industry. Recently, the club purchased four new triplex mowers (used on tees and approaches) and four new fairway mowers. Robotics and plant health tools are some of the biggest advancements in our industry, and through our partnership with Toro, you will soon begin to see this new technology at Sycamore.

The Golf Industry Show will be held in Orlando in early February. Thomas, River, and I have a full slate of classes and seminars planned. You may have already seen or read about some of the autonomous mowers currently on the market. One challenge I see at Sycamore is the proximity of our maintenance building to the golf course. With over 220 acres of property, transporting autonomous mowers from point A to point B could be daunting. However, the idea of on-course stations or home bases where

these mowers could recharge and redeploy is very possible and something we will continue to explore.



Last fall, the team was able to complete several projects before Mother Nature slammed the door on us. Some of those completed items include replacing several bridge rails, finishing cart path overlays on multiple holes, planting 27 trees around the course, applying a second topdressing to the fairways, removing several trees, and re-edging and adding sand to multiple bunkers—an ongoing process for us. We also completed fall fertilization on all playing surfaces and applied winter plant protectants in late November.

This winter, we have been out on the course whenever conditions allow, continuing tree removal and pruning. Ford Tree Service will be on-site for a couple of weeks to prune trees that require climbing, and I have a long list ready for them. Winter is also a vital time for equipment maintenance, which helps ensure fewer breakdowns during the golf season. A great deal of planning and preparation takes place while the course is closed.

My team is anxiously awaiting spring and is very much looking forward to the start of the golf season!

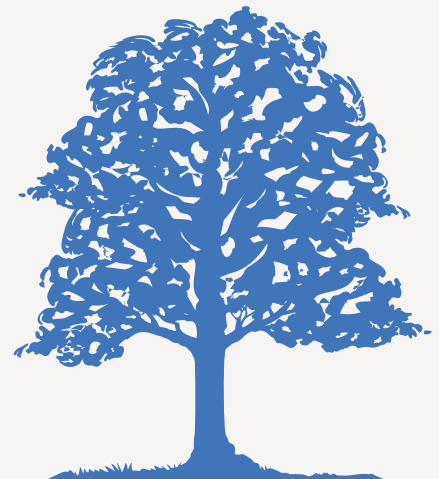

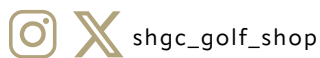
