ACTIVITIES

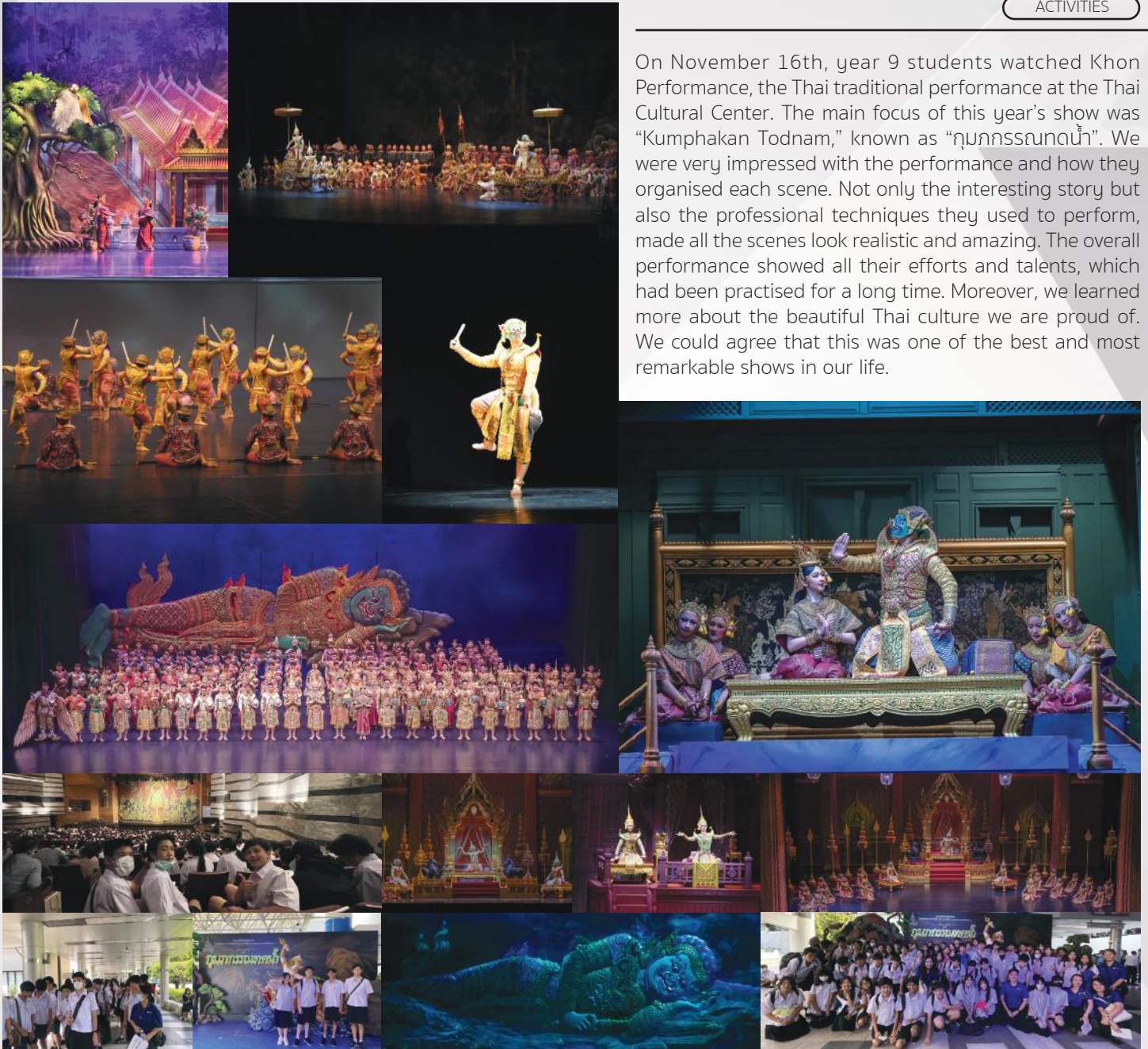

I Love Myself Project by Buket and her senior friends

On March 9, 2024, Buket Y9 and her senior friends traveled to โรงเรียนอนุบาลขอนแก่นเด็กสาทร Nakhon Pathom to deliver the "I love myself" project.

The objective of this project is to share knowledge of self-love with children, particularly orphans and disabled people, in Thailand through storytelling books. The book teaches children how to love themselves and accept them for who they are. The project aims to instill in people the value of mental health from an early age. Teaching children self-love will lower their likelihood of experiencing mental health issues, such as depression, in the future.

Through this project, we have opened a donation to buy stationary, write a story ourselves called 'I am Khaijeaw' and drawn a printout of the character.

On that day, we prepared storytelling and organised simple self-love activities. This involves colouring, drawing, and playing games like jigsaw. All of this will foster children's ability to think critically and creatively. As well as our story that developed self-love inside all children. In addition, we gave away snacks, a developmental jigsaw puzzle, and stationery to the organisation for further use.

Cookation by Perth and Kaning

Kaning and Perth's initiative showcases their steadfast efforts to empower and support the often overlooked or marginalised members of the local community. By cooking and distributing free meals, they extend a gesture of kindness akin to the local people, embodying a profound sense of empathy and compassion. Their efforts not only provide sustenance but also foster an environment of inclusivity and support, where every individual is valued and respected. In their actions, Kaning and Perth not only positively impact lives but also ignite a ripple effect of kindness and solidarity, inspiring others to join in creating a more compassionate world.

Over five weeks dedicated to this project, their journey began with meticulous planning, outlining what was needed for preparation and determining the target areas for giving out food. Inspired by the desire to offer something culturally resonant, they landed on the idea of making 'Phat Kaphrao,' a beloved Thai culinary masterpiece featuring stir-fried holy basil with meat. With their plans set, Kaning and Perth set on shopping, sourcing the freshest ingredients to make their ambrosial food. After the ingredients were secured they both started communicating with the local community set to receive the food. As the aroma of freshly cooked 'Phat Kaphrao' filled the air, Kaning and Perth joyfully distributed the flavorful dish, sharing not only nourishment but also cultural appreciation and warmth with each serving towards the people who receive it.

The Abundance by Chita, Kao-oun, and Junior

We chose this project because we agreed that we are good at working with plants. This also helps the children in the orphanage by providing more ingredients for their meals. Our team, consisting of Chita, Kao-oun, and Junior, had objectives to plant trees, remove grass (as it would steal the plants' minerals), and grow vegetables. In the first week, we explored the area to plan our activities. By the second and third weeks, we started collecting mushrooms and tomatoes and planted seeds with fertilizer. In the subsequent weeks, we focused on maintaining the plants by watering and caring for them. This project allowed us to relearn planting skills and utilize 21st-century skills such as communication. Although we faced challenges like extreme heat and occasional tardiness, the project went well overall. We managed to accomplish all our goals and learned a lot from the experience.



SEA-LIFE FIELD TRIP

ACTIVITIES

On the 13th of May, we had an exciting opportunity to explore the immersive underwater world experience with a diverse range of marine life at Siam Sea Life Bangkok! As soon as we entered, everyone's eyes lit up with excitement as they observed the fish gracefully swimming in each tank. One particular room, initially grey and intriguing, sparked curiosity among us all. Suddenly, colourful sharks, squids, stingrays, and more appeared, projected onto surfaces we hadn't noticed before, creating a lifelike and immersive experience. We were surrounded by a vibrant marine ecosystem that felt incredibly real. And to top it off, there were even baby sharks splashing playfully below our feet as we walked through. Each creature seemed to greet us in its own cute way as we continued our journey through the exhibition. Before reaching the exit, we encountered a variety of animals including penguins, otters, jellyfish, and many others which add fun to our underwater adventure at Siam Sea Life Bangkok!



SCIENCE EXPERIMENTS ; BIO+CHEM

ACTIVITIES

CHEMISTRY PRACTICALS

Airbag Chemistry Practical

In Year10 chemistry, we've done an experiment that was related to the safety of car features in terms of any possible accidents; ziplock bags have represented air bags in our experiment. This practical has covered the topic of stoichiometry, allowing us to apply our knowledge in the textbook to a real life situation. Moreover, it was a house competition, in which the house that has completed it first would get the house points. We used baking soda (NaHCO_3) and vinegar (CH_3COOH) as the reactant, then we got the product as water (H_2O), Carbon dioxide (CO_2), and sodium acetate (NaCH_3COO). We firstly measured the volume inside the ziplock bag by filling the water inside to see how much it is. Then, we calculated the mole ratio with the given vinegar concentration of 0.8393 mol/dm^3 . After we finished the calculations as the theory part, we mixed both baking soda and vinegar to test whether it worked or not. Astonishingly, the ziplock bag gradually became larger and larger, which represented the opening of the airbag in the car when there's a crash.

Chemistry Stoichiometry Practical

During term one, our chemistry class did a practical using aluminium (Al) and copper chloride (CuCl_2). This was applied to the topics we've learnt in class which was balancing chemical equations, displacement reaction, moles and stoichiometry, all in one experiment. During the session, we all put our hands on real equipment; including beakers, measuring cylinders, stirring rods, and top pan balance, just like real life chemists would use in laboratories! With this experiment, it has allowed us to observe the changes in both beaker 1 and beaker 2. In addition, it helped us to understand whether the reactants are the limiting or excess element by looking at the leftover aluminium. We then used the method of filtration to obtain the residue to calculate the amount of mole in each beaker. After we all did the experiment, we were required to write lab reports to reflect and conclude the practical. Moreover, we also applied our knowledge about stoichiometry to do various calculations to get our results.

Overall, this was a memorable and spectacular experience that we won't forget. Not only did we learn about the practical methods and understanding, but also learnt to have fun with chemistry! We all had an exciting time carrying out the experiments. From being in the lab, creating the reactions and writing results was even more interesting!



BIOLOGY PRACTICALS

Potato Osmosis Biology Practical

We Year10 Biology students had a chance to try out a practical with potatoes!! This covered the topic of transport in organisms, which was osmosis that we've learnt in class. Within this experiment, it helped us to improve our understanding of osmosis clearer and easier to see a movement of higher concentration to lower concentration. We investigated the effects of different concentrations of sucrose solutions which then affected the mass of potatoes. During the experiment, we got to put our hands on the equipment and potatoes!! From cutting, weighing, and putting potatoes into the test tube, after that we were able to observe the reaction happening directly through our own eyes. Surprisingly, we found out that the mass changes in each potato after we take them out from the sucrose solutions. This practical was another practical we certainly won't forget, it was truly a great experience!!

Biology Dissection IN ACTION

Of course we can't miss a class in Year10 biology without exploring our organ system in real life. We experienced this through dissecting frogs, chicken and pig hearts. Now having many stories to describe about our youthful experiences. The tangent smell is sure to be remembered. Through this we tested our knowledge. With the ability of not only being able to describe organs from diagrams but also in real life. Getting to learn more, it was also a great way for the students to test how strong their gut was in handling animals in such a way. Most importantly, the most important fact we learnt through this was to 'beware and do not pop the gallbladder!'

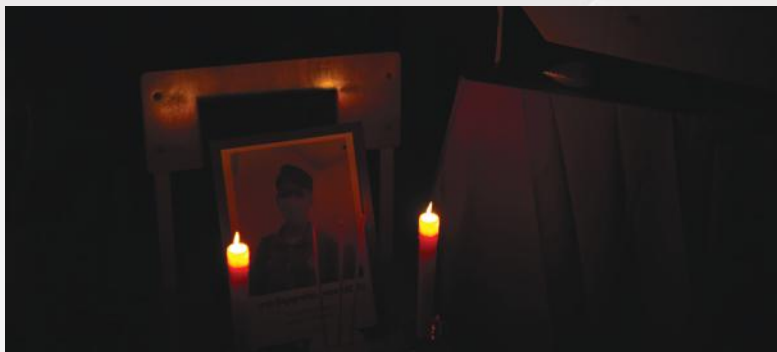


HAUNTED HOUSE AND MURDER MYSTERY

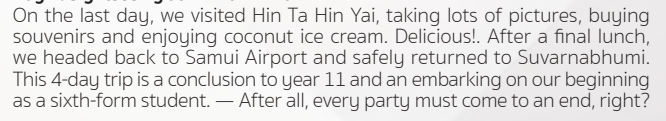
Day 3: Ang Thong National Marine Park + Party Night

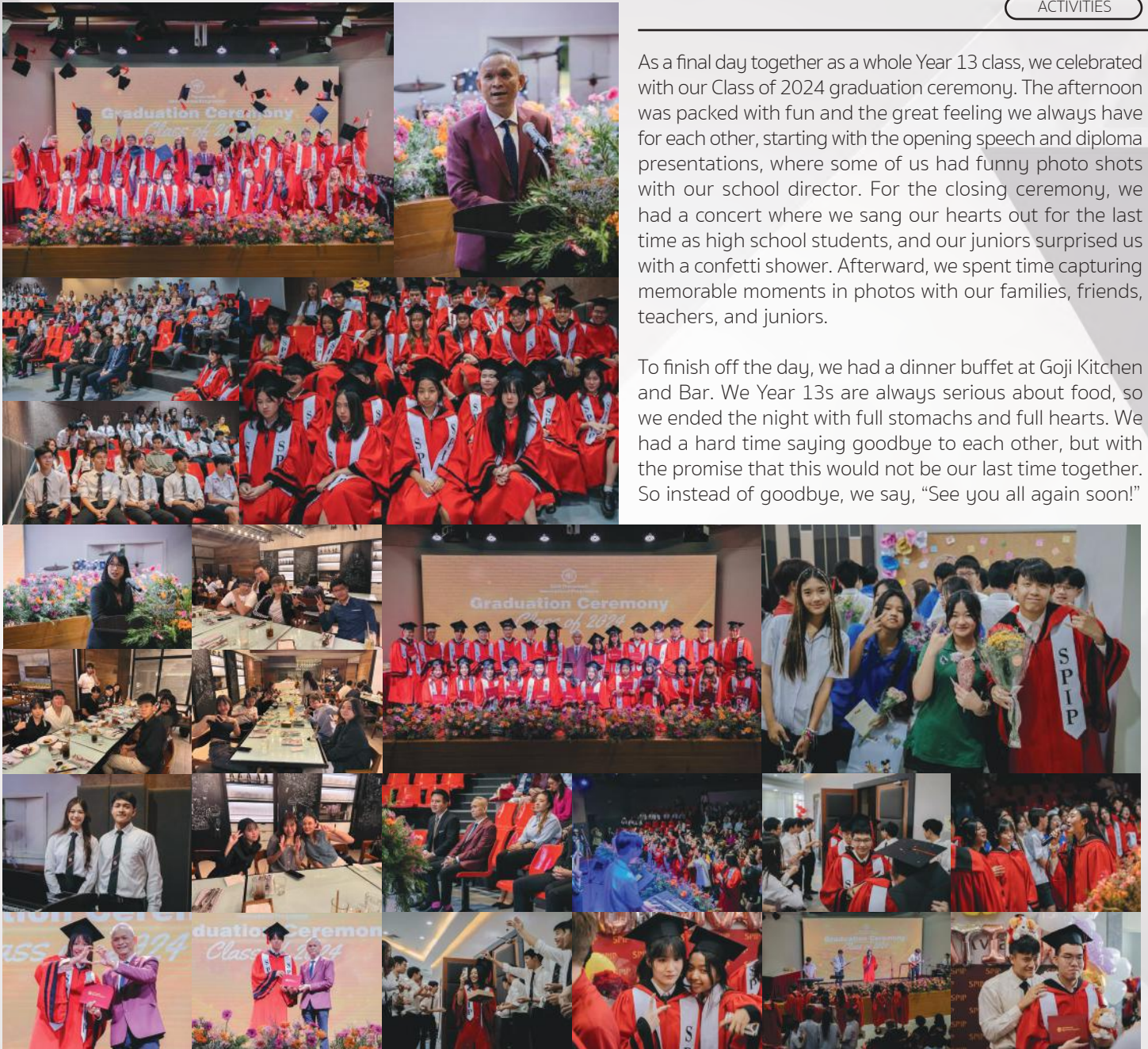


GRADUATION CEREMONY

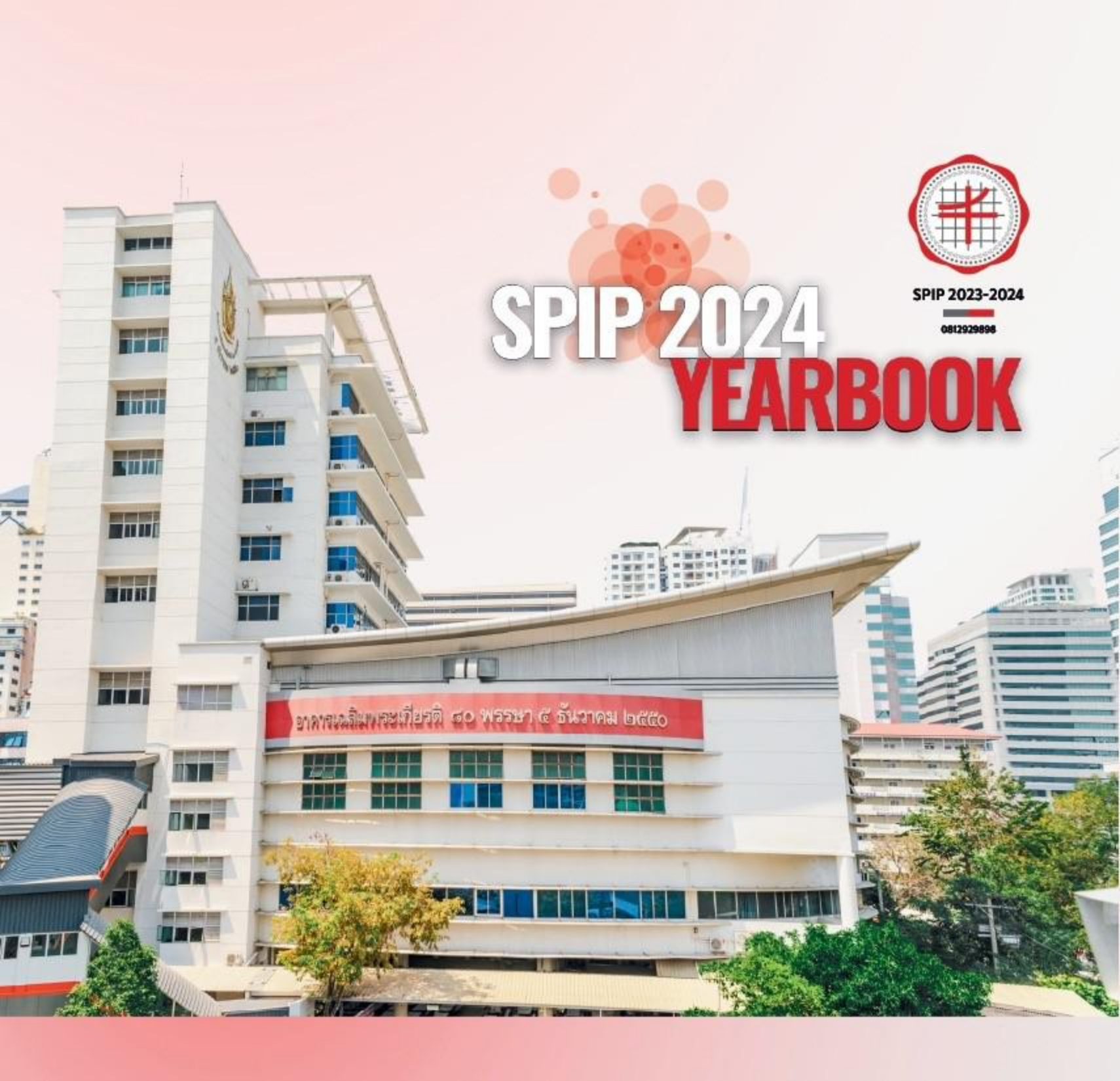
