



We had a tremendous year and inspite of all the challenges that have existed in 2021, our Board is pleased to have continued impact...and have made our community a lot better this year













has successfully completed her certificate for Home-Based Business Program with OCLF and is well on her way to achieve her entrepreneurial goals by establishing an online store business that sells African clothes and accessories in 2022. A Bachelor of Business Administration in Nigeria, Bridget worked for the federal government in Nigeria for 17 years.

She moved to the US and subsequently to Canada to follow her dreams. Moving to Ottawa and her refugee claim acceptance opened doors for Bridget, and she was able to participate in different settlement and integration programs around the city. As a part of the HBB Program, Bridget completed her assignments, met with Camelia (HBB Facilitator and Mentor) during mentoring sessions and never missed a session, although she is a working mom and taking care of two kids. "I must confess that HBB is a different and unique course which came at a point of loosing my grip to my passions... the thought-challenging questions from Camelia have really been helpful to motivate me for my business",



says Bridget. She adds, "...my aim is to see how I can contribute to the society at large and support those vulnerable and non vulnerable communities as a way of saying 'Thank You'...")
