# Countrymen Conquer

**H**allam bounced back from their weekend setback—a 2-0 home defeat to Heaton Stannington—by hitting the road midweek and returning from Ossett United with all three points.

Brodie Litchfield was on target yet again, his first-half strike proving decisive as the Countrymen continue their push in the Northern Premier League East Division.



## Steels End Goal Drought Under Lemon

**Y**ou must get the seeds from the fruit, clean it thoroughly and making sure they remain wet when planting them. And then they must be in a pot in your home, but if your house is centrally heated, forget it. After all that, you could end up waiting 15 years to finally get another actual lemon. Thankfully, it didn't take that long for Stocksbridge's own lemon to bear fruit.

Jordan Lemon was thrust into the hot seat following Ian Richards departure, with Reserves Manager Mark Fretwell and club captain Kurtis Turner also assisting. But despite his best efforts, luck has not been on his side. Since his appointment, Stocksbridge have not even got a goal yet, neither mind a point or a goal. But that doesn't mean the performances have been lacking. They were very unlucky not to get a

point against Rushall Olympic, and spirited performances against Hednesford Town and Marine impressed.

But football doesn't work on 'well they deserved a bit more out of that'. It works on points, and that's what Stocksbridge needed.

And Ilkeston Town looked like a team they could get something out of. They were reeling themselves following a humiliating 5-0 loss away at Hebburn, one made worse by the fact it was in front of the Clubber TV cameras. Perhaps they were prime to lose to the out of sorts Stocksbridge.

And at the start, the Steels looked determined to end their run of losses. Jack Tinker had started with plenty of energy, with his overlaps causing problems for the Ilkeston defence. One of his crosses did find Alfie Wilkinson in the middle, but he didn't get the power on the header allowing Alfie Roberts in the Robins goal to make the save.

At the other end, Dylan Youmbi was the biggest threat for Ilkeston. He was a player that Stocksbridge knew



well as he had a loan spell with the Steels a few years ago. He was known for having a vicious shot but he couldn't get the direction on any of his efforts. Ben Townsend was equal to any of shots that went at him.

Despite plenty of endeavour from both teams, chances were at a premium. Perhaps that was the confidence, or lack thereof, of the sides considering the form they brought into the match. That led to the game being

goalless at the break.

Stocksbridge started off quick in the second half and finally, they got some reward for it. The initial corner from Danny Deakin was headed right back to the midfielder who put in another cross. Elliot Owen was waiting at the far post to head in and the month long duck was broken. You wouldn't have expected a defender to be the one to finish the drought but it didn't matter how it ended, just that it did.

# Litchfield Fires Hallam Back to Winning Ways

**H**allam endured contrasting emotions in their recent Northern Premier League East Division fixtures, suffering a 2-0 home defeat to Heaton Stannington before bouncing back with a gritty 1-0 win away at Ossett United.

These matches highlighted two sides of Craig Denton's team—frustration at missed chances in Sheffield followed by resilience and tactical discipline in West Yorkshire.

The clash at Sandygate against Heaton Stannington began with promise. Hallam started brightly, pressing high and creating early openings through Ollie Russon and Brodie Litchfield, whose sharp effort forced visiting goalkeeper Alfie Gordon into action. Yet, despite enjoying territorial advantage, the breakthrough never came.

Heaton Stannington gradually grew into the contest, with captain Dan Capewell commanding the back line and Connor Walker disrupting Hallam's rhythm in midfield. The visitors' patience paid off seven minutes after the restart when Capewell rose highest to glance home a header from a well-worked corner routine.

Hallam responded with attacking changes, introducing Jay Glover and Shaun Tuton, but Gordon's reflexes denied them an equaliser. Dale Pearson sealed the win on 72 minutes, timing

his run perfectly to slot past Hugo Warhurst. Despite late pressure, Hallam could not find a way through, leaving Denton to reflect on missed opportunities.

"We started well and had chances, but at this level you have to take them. Credit to Heaton Stannington—they were organised and punished us when it mattered," he admitted post-match.

Just days later, Hallam travelled to Ingfield to face Ossett United, determined to respond. They did so with a disciplined display and an early breakthrough.

On 25 minutes, a precise through ball unlocked Ossett's defence, allowing Litchfield to surge into the box and finish calmly past the keeper.

From then on, Hallam managed the game intelligently, absorbing pressure while threatening on the counter. Defensive duo Jamie Sharman and Charlie Staniland were immense, while Brandon Bradbury, making his 201st appearance, anchored midfield with composure.

Warhurst had little to do thanks to the organisation in front of him, though he was alert to smother a late effort from Alex Peterson.

After the final whistle, Denton praised his side's resilience: "I'm absolutely delighted with the lads tonight. Ingfield is never an easy place to come, and Ossett are a strong side. We asked for discipline and togetherness, and that's exactly what we got. The early goal gave us something to protect, and I thought we managed the game superbly."

He also highlighted

the importance of momentum: "We've spoken about turning performances into points, and this win shows we're heading in the right direction. It's about building confidence now and keeping standards high."

Tactically, the two games told different stories.

Against Heaton Stannington, Hallam's high press and attacking intent in the first half created chances but left them vulnerable to set-pieces and transitions. Denton's side struggled to convert pressure into goals, and once behind, their shape became stretched.

In contrast, the Ossett win was built on compactness and discipline.

Hallam sat deeper after scoring, denying space between the lines and forcing Ossett wide, where Sharman and Staniland dominated

aerial duels.

Bradbury's positioning was crucial, screening the back four and recycling possession calmly.

Litchfield's goal came from a rehearsed pattern—quick vertical play exploiting gaps behind Ossett's high line—showing Hallam's ability to adapt.

The contrasting results leave Hallam in mid-table, still searching for consistency but buoyed by the character shown at Ossett.

With fixtures against Dunston UTS and Pontefract Collieries looming, Denton will hope his side can build on their away success and turn Sandygate into a fortress once more.

If they can combine the attacking intent shown against Heaton Stannington with the defensive solidity displayed at Ossett, Hallam could yet climb the table before the festive period.

Campion defeated Albion Sports 2-0 with goals from Corey Billy and Ewan Gregson.



# Cup Drama as Sheffield and Dinnington Shine

**T**he Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup 3rd Round delivered drama, goals, and commanding performances as four sides booked their places in the quarter-finals.

At the MEPS International Home of Football Stadium, Sheffield FC showed their pedigree with a professional 2-0 victory over Swallownest. In front of 152 spectators, the world's oldest football club controlled the tempo from the outset and broke the deadlock on 29 minutes when Nathan Whitehead finished confidently after sustained pressure.

Swallownest battled hard and even threatened before the interval, but Sheffield's defensive organisation held firm. The visitors pushed for an equaliser

in the second half, yet Sheffield remained disciplined and sealed the win in stoppage time through Alex Hardwick's composed strike on 90 minutes. It was a

display of patience and control that underlined Sheffield's ambitions in the competition.

Elsewhere, Worsbrough Bridge Athletic produced a strong away

performance to defeat Wombwell Town 3-1. Lloyd Smith set the tone with a goal inside the opening minute, and Juninho Blake doubled the advantage

just before half-time. Wombwell rallied after the break, but Smith struck again in the 82nd minute to put the result beyond doubt. Kenneth Effah netted a late consolation deep into stoppage time, but Worsbrough's clinical finishing and disciplined shape ensured their safe passage into the next round.

ponents. We killed the game early in the second half and the response to the half-time team talk was unreal, I thought that won us the game! Should be a big draw and test in the next round."

His words summed up a night where Dinnington's quality and character shone through.

Finally, Barnsley U21 completed the round with a 2-0 win over Hepworth United. The young Reds controlled possession and struck in each half to progress, though official details of the scorers have not been confirmed. It was a composed performance that highlighted their technical ability and maturity under pressure.

The four join Work-sop Town, Rossington Main and Dearne & District in the quarter final draw with the last remaining third round game taking place at Hillsborough on Wednesday evening when Sheffield Wednesday U21s take on Stocks-bridge Park Steels.

**F**or the second Saturday running, the weather tore holes in the Buckingham Insurance League Cup schedule, leaving only four of the ten planned second-round ties standing. Once again, it was the Sheffield and Wakefield patch that came out on top, with South Yorkshire clubs showing grit, drama, and no shortage of late heroics.

The clash of Premier

North heavyweights Kinsley Boys and Brodsworth Main had everything. Kinsley looked home and dry after Brad Dockerty struck inside 25 seconds and Lucas Stubbs doubled the lead before half-time. But Brodsworth refused to roll over. Jayden Yarow's 84th-minute life-line set up a grandstand finish, and Mohamed Diagabate's stoppage-time equaliser forced penalties. Kinsley held their nerve, edging the shootout 4-3 to book their place in the third round, but Brodsworth's fightback was the story of the day.

At Wombwell, Elite AFC pulled off one of the comebacks of the season

against Harworth Colliery. The visitors stunned the hosts with a three-goal blitz inside 14 minutes, Cory Goodwin, Billy Stafford, and Rob Singer all on target. Elite looked dead and buried, but Tommy Pallett and Harry Douglas dragged them back into contention before half-time. Sammy Amissah levelled after the break, and the tie went to penalties. Elite held their nerve, squeezing through 6-5, leaving Harworth wondering how they let it slip.

Burngreave United also flew the South Yorkshire flag, seeing off Ollerton Town in a fiery contest. Ollerton struck early through Harvey

Limb, but Umar Muhammed stole the show with a hat trick either side of half-time. His afternoon ended in controversy with a straight red card, but Burngreave had already done enough. Joshua Gwitera's late strike gave Ollerton hope, yet time ran out before they could force a leveller. Burngreave march on, though Muhammed's dismissal may cast a shadow over their next round.

SJR Worksop completed the South Yorkshire quartet of winners, dispatching AFC Phoenix 2-0. An own goal midway through the first half set them on their way, and Alex Boyd's

strike after the break sealed a comfortable passage.

Elsewhere, Mansfield Hosiery Mills finally ended their barren run with a 3-1 win over Mickleover Reserves, their first victory since August. Bakewell Town's gamble to switch their cup tie for a league fixture backfired, Derby Singh Brothers taking advantage with a 4-2 triumph. Blidworth Welfare extended their winning streak to six with a 5-2 demolition of Mickleover Athletic, while Selston kept their title push alive by beating Linby Colliery 3-1. In the Premier North, Teversal's Ty Macaskill grabbed the headlines

with a first-half hat trick in a 4-2 win over RHP Sports, while Staveley Reserves and Rossington Main Reserves played out a stalemate.

But the real drama belonged to South Yorkshire. From Kinsley's nerve-shredding shootout to Elite's miracle comeback and Burngreave's fiery triumph, the region's clubs proved once again they thrive when the pressure is at its fiercest. Weather may have ripped the fixture list apart, but the survivors delivered a feast of football that will live long in local memory.

**I**t was a weekend of drama, goals, and a few eye-brow-raising score-lines across the Rotherham & District Sunday League as teams battled for supremacy in their respective divisions. From a six-goal demolition in the Premier Division to a 13-goal thriller in Division Two, Sunday's action had everything grass-roots football fans could wish for.

AFP Pewter Pot sent a clear message to their title rivals with a ruthless 6-0 away win over Jack In Box. Connor Sanderson bagged a

brace, while Dean Smith, Ben Thorton, and Jamie Ward (two goals) completed the rout. This emphatic victory keeps Pewter Pot firmly in the hunt for the top spot, sitting fourth with 13 points but boasting a formidable goal difference of +18. Matthew Moore proving decisive. Deer Park Tap and AFC Maltby shared the spoils in a 1-1 draw, Billy Wright and James Green on target. The Championship remains fiercely competitive, with Clubhouse and Thorpe Hesley Village among the early pace-setters in previous rounds, though updated standings suggest a mid-season shake-up is looming.

The Rig Dyke secured a vital 3-2 win over Joker in Rotherham Embroidery Division One. Goals from G-Prince Prescott, Will Snow, and Samuel Roddis sealed the points, while Bradley Carroll and Craig Roberts replied for Joker. This result lifts Rig Dyke into mid-table, while Joker remain rooted near the bottom with just four



# Sheffield Grind Out Gritty Win at Tynedale

**F**ollowing the disappointment of the match last weekend against Scunthorpe, we travelled the approximately 150 miles to Tynedale at Corbridge.

Sheffield brought back Will Smith into the inside centre role with George Castledine returning to fullback and Chris Hooper back to the wing and Jack Dawson dropping to the bench.

The starting front row was also changed to Aaron Lonsdale, Rhodri Campbell and Jake Hickling, with Alex Reid, Will Archer and George Rogers dropping to the bench.

After the recent bad weather, with wind, rain and snow, in the North East the match was to be played on a heavy, wet and rutted pitch, which was not going to make a high paced running game likely.
