With the continued support of our community, City Council will help guide Taylor through this period of growth and opportunity. Let's look forward to an exciting and productive time ahead.

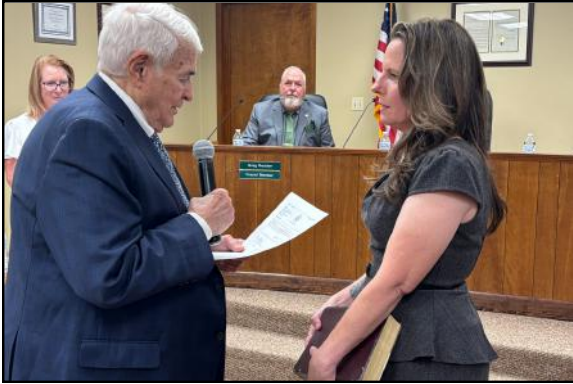

New District 4 Council Member Sworn In

At a special called City Council meeting on June 17, the Taylor City Council canvassed the votes from the June 7 runoff election. Heather Long was sworn in as a new council member for District 4, with Congressman John Carter administering the oath of office. Ms. Long takes the place of outgoing councilmember Robert Garcia, who has represented District 4 since 2016.

Mayor And Mayor Pro Tem Re-Elected

At a special called meeting, City Council held an election for the Mayor and Mayor Pro Tem. At-Large Council Member Dwayne Ariola was re-elected as Mayor, and District 3 Council Member Kelley Cmerek was re-elected as Mayor Pro Tem to serve until May 2026. In the 2026 election, the At-Large Council seat will transition into the Mayoral seat per the charter amendment passed in May 2024.

June 12 Meeting

COUNCIL APPROVED APPLICATIONS TO THREE GRANT PROGRAMS FOR SIDEWALKS, SHARED USE PATHS AND SIX ADDITIONAL FIREFIGHTERS, AMENDED AN AGREEMENT WITH SAMSUNG, AND PRIORITIZED PARK PROJECTS USING FUNDS FROM LAST YEAR'S DEBT ISSUANCE.



June 26 Meeting

COUNCIL CONSIDERED AN ORDINANCE ALLOWING THE ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION TO FUND CITY PROJECTS, A RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER A PORTION OF THE SAMSUNG PROPERTY TO THE CITY OF TAYLOR'S WATER SUPPLY, AND HEARD A PRESENTATION ON THE CITY'S DUCK POPULATION.
