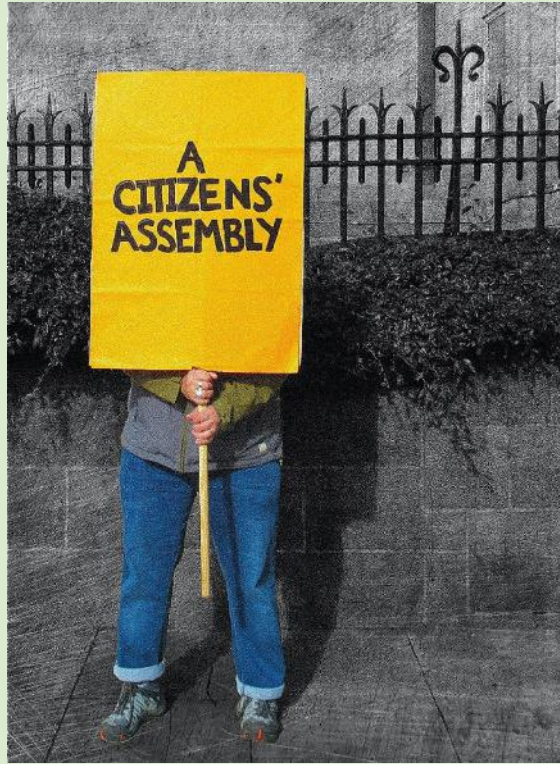

Big Burnage Parade

Join the parade, or come and support, as it processes from Burnage Lane to Fog Lane Park. DAF 2026 is delighted to be working with people and organisations across Burnage to conceive and deliver the inaugural Big Burnage Parade, a large-scale project aimed at making local communities more visible, in one of the more overlooked wards that neighbour Didsbury.

Drawing on the local history of parading and following the 2017 Big Burnage Animal Parade run for younger residents by Burnage Library, the parade will connect the upper reaches of Burnage Lane with south west Burnage, crossing the A34 and ending in the park where Burnage, Withington and Didsbury meet. The project community partners are Burnage Library, Burnage Community Centre and Westcroft Community Centre, supported by Manchester City Council and a network of local community groups, schools and religious organisations.

COMMUNITY ARTS IN ACTION

Waste2Waves

- Toubie Jack

Our most far reaching community arts project in 25/26 is Waste2Waves, with local artist Toubie Jack, whose work raises important questions about plastic waste.

Toubie uses a technique of plastic fusing, applying gentle heat to waste soft plastics, like bread bags and crisp packets, so it melds to create plastic fabric that can be used for sculpture. For Waste2Waves, Toubie will use the fabric to make a giant inflatable fish, that will form the focal point for the Big Burnage Parade.

Over 400 children at St Catherine's Primary, Old Moat Primary, Broad Oak Primary, Beaver Road Primary, Green End Primary, Didsbury High and Parrs Wood High have taken part in the creation of the fabric, as well as numerous community groups from Burnage.

Younger children also used collage techniques to make a shoal of smaller fish, which will be on display at schools and in public spaces in Burnage and Didsbury. Older children have helped to create the seascape for the fish out of harder to recycle plastics.

Not only has the project provoked discussions about ocean health and over consumption, but the playful nature of the project, and the chance to experiment and create something unique, has opened the door to the importance of creativity in our life and the benefits to our own health and self esteem.

The project's formal unveiling will be at the Big Burnage Parade on 5th July. But if like us you can't wait, then you'll be able to meet Toubie and see the fish when it makes appearances at our opening event at Fletcher Moss, and at Didsbury and Burnage Library during the festival week.
