Provide Stability and Routine

Deployment can disrupt a child's sense of security. Keeping consistent schedules, expectations, and traditions in the classroom can offer comfort and predictability.

Encourage Peer Support

Foster connections with other students experiencing similar challenges. Suggest participation in a Purple Star group or provide opportunities for the student to share their experience with the class.

Suggest in Positive Activities

Help students engage in extracurricular activities, creative projects, or service initiatives to channel their emotions in a constructive way.

WATERVILLE PRIMARY EARNS TWO GRANTS

Waterville Primary School is excited to announce that it has received two grants totaling \$4,000 to enhance student engagement in hands-on STEAM learning.

A \$1,500 Global Youth Service Day grant will support the school's efforts in the Land Lab. Part of the funding supporting the purchase of much-needed supplies, with the remaining funds going toward a Toledo Grows program for third-grade students.

A second grant of \$2,500 from the Ohio Space Grant Consortium will fund inquiry-based learning, citizen science, conservation and climate science in partnership with the Toledo Zoo.





NICKIE SATTLER NAMED OPEN RUNNER OF THE YEAR

We know her as a Technology Specialist, but outside of work, Nickie Sattler is making strides in the running community. She was recently named Open Runner of the Year by the Toledo Roadrunners Club! for her commitment to expanding the local running community.

Last year, she founded the Toledo Area Galloway Group (TAGG) with just seven members. Today, that number has more than doubled, helping runners of all levels learn the run-walk-run method.

She also recently completed her first marathon the Marine Corps Marathon—alongside her son, a Marine. She is currently training for the Flying Pig race in May, a return to the Marine Corps Marathon in October, along with numerous local races.
