

#### **Seaside Cakes**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.

Let the following bubble together over low-heat for about 2 minutes (this is known as Roux):

4 cup extra virgin olive oil

4 cup organic light spelt flour

Then slowly whip in the following two ingredients (make sure to leave no lumps):

1 cup of non-dairy milk (unsweetened and no flavour i.e. vanilla)

½ tsp. Celtic salt or Himalayan pink salt

Stir in and continue cooking until sauce is very thick: 3 tbsp. minced onion

Remove from stovetop and add the following

ingredients, mix well:

Crumble 1 lb. of tofu (organic and non-GMO verified) ½ tsp. dry mustard (can omit, but does add to the flavor when included)
A dash of cayenne

Shape into cakes/patties, suggested size can be about  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inch round and  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch thick. But you can be creative!

Chill for at least 4 hours.

Remove from fridge, in your food processor process approximately 16 crackers of your choice, add  $1\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. of paprika (smoked paprika is wonderful too) to crackers and then flip cakes/patties in the cracker mixture so that both sides are covered.

Place on cookie sheet that is covered with parchment paper and bake for 40-50 minutes. Flip halfway. You want the cracker covering to be slightly toasted. Tasty as a burger with all the fixings or served with salad and/or cooked veggies.




#### Sandy Lake Academy Mission Trip
