


- A visit to The National Museum of African American Music

# RIDE360 TO MY RIDE K-12

#### Attention Bulldog Bus Rider Families!

The Ride360 app that SMF Schools uses to provide our families with student transportation information is being retired by the company. They have made a new and improved app that is now available to all users.

This new app, My Ride K-12, can be downloaded now in the Apple and Android app stores. You will need to download the new app to access updated transportation information for your student(s).

Usernames and passwords from Ride 360 will carry over into My Ride K-12.

#### UNIVERSITY OF AKRON RUBBER BAND PROJECT

Four Kimpton Middle Schoolers took on the 16th Annual Rubber Band Contest for Young Inventors at the University of Akron.

The students were challenged to design and create a functional invention or art piece that incorporates at least one rubber band. Once completed, students wrote a brief message and submitted pictures of their creations for judging.

The Akron Global Polymer Academy, a branch of the University of Akron's School of Polymer Science and Polymer Engineering, established the competition in 2008.

Its annual goals are to foster interest in polymers among students and draw them into the fascinating realm of STEAM education (science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics). The design process, problemsolving, research, communication and innovation are highlighted in this immersive learning project.




# KIMPTON MIDDLE SCHOOL 8TH GRADER ETHAN FERRARI'S WKYC 3NEWS APPEARANCE




With their talent and determination, these student-athletes are set to achieve incredible success in both sports and academics.
