Why are the Madeira Islands Europe's Best Island Destination in 2024?

A simple answer, it is a magical place waiting to be discovered. When you step foot on the Madeira Islands it is hard not to be mesmerized by the beauty of these subtropical islands sitting in the Atlantic ocean. No matter how many days you plan to stay it never seems enough, there is so much to see and taste on this Portuguese Paradise! Madeira has stolen our hearts and palates so we have decided to feature this destination as our first special **E&W True Flavour Journey!**

During our 7-day journey, our experts have **hand-picked experiences** to best represent Madeira. Starting in **Funchal**, the capital of the Island, a small cosmopolitan city that faces the Atlantic and is in close contact with nature having levada trails, tropical gardens, etc. all within reach from the city centre. It is named after a sweet-smelling wild herb, traditionally known as

GASTRONOMY, WINES & SPIRITS OF MADEIRA

The gastronomy, spirits and wines of Madeira are deeply rooted in the culture, for a small archipelago it has a bit of everything! The fruits and vegetables are abundant, largely due to the extraordinary fertility of its soil combined with the subtropical climate of the island. The fish caught off the coasts, like the deep-sea fish the Espada (Black scabbardfish) or the Atum (Tuna) are two very popular fish used in many Madeiran recipes, a favourite being black scabbardfish filet with banana. A locally sourced seafood delicacy to mention are the Lapas (Limpets), sauteed in garlic and butter then with drips of lemon juice on top, are to die for! You can't taste them without the Bolo do Caco (flat bread) also with butter and garlic, a pair made in heaven. The Espetada, meat over the barbeque on laurel branch stick-skewers to get that flavour of laurel (bay leaf) in the perfectly grilled meat.

fennel (Foeniculum Vulgare), which was abundant here when the settlement was created. Later, several excellent regional products, such as **sugar or wine** became the main source of income turning Funchal into an important trading port in the middle of the Atlantic.

Our welcome to the island will be on a rooftop terrace bar overlooking the city of Funchal just before sunset, how does that sound? Of course, we will toast the start of our gastronomic journey with a glass of Madeira wine, which this island is famed for in the wine world. Since we are staying in the town centre everything is within walking distance to explore the charm of the old town streets and get acquainted with many cafes, bars, restaurants, etc. The seaside promenade for a late evening or early morning walk is always so relaxing. Get the best views of the city by taking the cable car to the top of Monte, then slide down the streets in a hand-made Sledge from wicker and wood by specialised craftsmen and carpenters. They are pushed by two drivers, called 'carreiros', who are dressed in typical white garments and wear straw hats. With recognised skill, they use their boots with thick rubber soles as brakes to control the sledge during the journey.

CUISINE OF <u>NAVARRE</u>: QUALITY AND TRADITION IN EVERY BITE

Navarre's cuisine is based mostly on fresh and high-quality products, largely grown on its fertile land. One of the region's star ingredients is the Tudela artichoke, cultivated along the banks of the Ebro River and famous for its delicate flavour and tender texture. Furthermore, asparagus from Navarre is also very appreciated, known for its whiteness and sweet taste, typically served boiled with mayonnaise or olive oil.

Another traditional dish is the **vegetable stew**, a real tribute to the region's produce, such as artichokes, peas, asparagus, and green beans, all cooked and sautéed with cured ham. Do you enjoy meat? Then, the **cordero al chilindrón (lamb stew)** will be your favourite dish: it combines tender lamb with a sauce of red peppers, tomatoes, and onions, perfectly **capturing the spirit of Navarre cuisine!**





Pamplona: The capital of tapas and fine dining

Pamplona, the capital of Navarre, is **well-known around the world for the San Fermín festival**, but it is also a city where gastronomy plays a key role. The old town is filled with bars where you may **enjoy pintxos (tapas)** that are a blend of history and innovation. Among **the most popular are those of txistorra**, a typical sausage from the region, and the **gildas**, a savoury appetizer of olives, anchovies, and chili peppers.

What other typical food is a must? **Pamplona** is also famous for its **beef steak**, a tender piece of meat grilled and topped with coarse salt. And for dessert, don't forget to try the **canutillos de crema,** a crispy delight filled with custard cream. You won't stay hungry!



WINES OF NAVARRE AND **ARAGON: FIND THE BEST PAIRING**

Navarre is a wine region with a long tradition that has successfully adapted to the new times. Although historically associated with rosé wines, today the region produces a wide variety of wines, including high-quality reds. **Garnacha** and Tempranillo are the most common grapes, but international varieties like Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot are also cultivated. Wines from Navarra are fresh and fruity, excellent to accompany light dishes like vegetables or pintxos.

As for Aragon, there is also a deep winemaking tradition, with several Denominations of Origin (D.O.), the most popular being **D.O. Cariñena.** Here, Garnacha is the king grape, producing powerful and structured red wines that pair well with local cuisine. The D.O. Somontano is another outstanding region, located at the foot of the Pyrenees, producing elegant and modern red and white wines.

ARAGON: HEARTY DISHES AND ROBUST FLAVOURS

Aragonese cuisine stands out for its intense flavours and the influence of Mediterranean and **mountain food.** One of the most iconic dishes is the **Ternasco de Aragón**, a young lamb roasted in the oven and served with fried potatoes with onions, peppers and garlic (patatas a lo pobre).

Another traditional dish is the Aragonese migas, prepared with crumbled stale bread sautéed with garlic, bacon, chorizo, and grapes, a recipe that reflects Aragon's humble and rural roots. And for chilly days, nothing beats an Aragonese stew, a filling dish made with veggies, pork, chorizo, and chickpeas.



Zaragoza: Between tradition and modernity

The capital of Aragon is a city that blends heritage and innovation, which is shown in its culinary offerings. Similar to Pamplona, Zaragoza has a strong culture of tapas: The heart of tapas bars is **El Tubo**, an area of narrow streets in the city centre. Here you can enjoy everything from classic patatas bravas to more elaborate tapas like Ternasco or octopus prepared in the Galician style.

Zaragoza's cuisine also benefits from outside influences. One such example is the cod dish Bacalao Ajoarriero, which is of Basque origin but has been widely embraced in Aragon. And for a sweet ending, try the guirlaches (a sort of almond nougat). They are a perfect option for anyone with a sweet craving!

AZORES ISLANDS A FOODIE PARADISE (TERCEIRA & SAO MIGUEL)

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The Azores Islands comprises of 9 scenic, volcanic islands deep in the Atlantic Ocean over 1,360 km west of mainland Portugal. São Miguel is the largest island famous for its volcanic crater called Sete Cidades and Fogo (Fire) Lagoons in the centre of the island and its most beautiful sight. You'll also encounter geysers, hot thermal waters and volcanic lakes. In the hot springs locals make the dish "Cozido das Furnas" slowly cooked in a giant pot full of meats (pork,sausage,chicken and beef) and vegetables. The south-eastern most island of Santa Maria has fantastic white, sandy beaches and a landscape dominated by vineyards.

The islands of Terceira, São Jorge, Pico, Faial and Graciosa (referred to as the Central Group of Azores) is where you can see whales and dolphins. On Terceira, the city of Angra do Heroísmo is an UNESCO World Heritage Site famous for its festivals. Faial Island is the "Blue Island" thanks to the cool blue of the hydrangeas plant. Its marina is one of the most busy and famous in the world and it's colourful murals are the work of yachtsmen to give them protection on their trip. The extinct Capelinhos volcano, which is like a lunar landscape is also a must see. Next to Faial Island is Pico Island where there is the highest mountain in Portugal which rises out of the sea (Ponta do Pico). The island has vineyards planted in black volcanic earth, a unique historical feature and key to the island's development resulting in its UNESCO World Heritage

status. On São Jorge, the most scenic of the islands, the main sights are the Fajãs (geological, coastal feature) and its cheese, a unique specialty with an flavour not unlike Cheddar.
Graciosa,the graceful "White Island", is an agricultural island full of vineyards that contrast with its strange windmills.

Finally there's the Western group of Azores including Flores island. The beauty of its flowers, the natural waterfalls and lakes carved out by volcanoes is spectacular. The island of Corvo is the smallest and most northern island of the Azores. It has a broad, beautiful crater at its centre, and attracts many species of migratory birds from both Europe and America.


Melgaço: A Haven for Nature and Wine Lovers

Melgaço is the perfect destination for those seeking a blend of nature, adventure, and wine culture.

Here are some popular dishes that you must try in Northern Portugal:

- **Tripas à Moda do Porto**: Traditional tripe stew of O Porto cooked with veal tripe, white beans, smoked ham, pork sausage, carrots, onions, spices such as paprika, and cumin, and different cuts of pork and chicken.
- Cozido à Portuguesa: Originally a dish from the north of Lisbon (Beira) that consists of vegetables like rice, potatoes, beans, and cabbage with different slow-boiled meats such as sausages: chouriço, morcelo (blood sausages), pig ears, beef, chicken. A tasty unadorned dish, that will fill up your belly for the whole day!
- Bacalhau à Braga: The star ingredient of Portuguese cuisine, is codfish. This
 dish consists of sliced fried cod with fried potatoes and onions
 accompanied by bay leaves and cloves.
- Caldo Verde: Traditional soup from the Minho province, highly popular around the world, made with basic ingredients: potatoes, onion puree, and collard greens. Usually served as a starter at the beginning of a larger meal.





GALICIA: A LAND OF TRADITION AND COASTAL BEAUTY


