

Watch for Buses, Kids, and New Routines! Back to School Safety: A Message from the Brazoria



As the school bells start ringing again across Brazoria, the Brazoria Police Department would like to remind all residents to stay alert and keep safety top of your mind during this busy back-to-school season.

Starting in August, our roads will once again be filled with yellow school buses, crossing guards, bike-riding students, and excited kids walking to school. With changing traffic patterns and early morning rushes, it's more important than ever to slow down, stay alert, and protect our community's children.

BRAZORIA POLICE DEPARTMENT



School Bus Safety Reminders:

- Stop for the bus! Texas law requires drivers to stop when a school bus has its red lights flashing and the stop arm extended. Do not proceed until the bus moves or the lights stop flashing.
- Never pass a stopped bus, even if you're in the opposite lane, unless there's a physical divider.
- Expect frequent stops and give buses plenty of space on the road.

Watch for Pedestrians:

- Slow down in school zones and obey posted speed limits.
- Be especially cautious during morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up.
- Watch for crossing guards and follow their instructions.
- Never block crosswalks at intersections.

Talk to Your Kids:

Parents, please take a few minutes to remind your kids about walking safely to and from school:

- Always use crosswalks.
- Look both ways before crossing the street.
- Never dart out from between cars.


