Compass is also the place to log your child's absences, see the Newsletter, read your child's Report.


If you require help accessing this service, please contact the office because Compass is the preferred way for notes into the future.

We are excited to be able to offer Millwarra students the opportunity to participate in a Swimming Program at the Yarra Centre, Yarra Junction.




