

The Eastern Suffolk BOCES Library Council works to ensure that the School Districts in Eastern Suffolk BOCES have access to resources, programs and trainings for their Librarians. They provide many services to the schools including liaison meetings four times a year with school library representatives, a yearly all-day Long Island Conference for librarians, and in-service training that can be accessed live via zoom for CTLE credit or viewed later for relevant and up to date information.

The districts have access to books, videos, and materials to enhance both their Classroom and Library Programs.

Librarians play an important role in any school building, they are an important resource to faculty and students throughout the school year, yet some districts at times have tried to excess their librarian for cost savings.



→ IMLS The Day the Librarians Disappeared



"Promoting Health & Wellness Through Outdoor Sports & Activities"

a Health & Wellness/Environment report by Tomas Vazquez

Health and wellness are fundamental components of a child's development, and incorporating an environmental perspective adds an important layer of awareness and responsibility. Engaging children in sports promotes physical activity, which is essential for building strong bones, muscles, and cardiovascular health. Regular exercise also enhances mental well-being, fostering confidence, teamwork, and discipline. However, the environment in which these activities take place plays a critical role in ensuring safety and sustainability.

Choosing outdoor sports and playgrounds that prioritize green spaces can positively influence children's connection to nature, boosting their mood and reducing stress. Parks and natural areas not only provide fresh air and sunlight—both vital for vitamin D synthesis—but also serve as eco-friendly venues where children can learn about environmental stewardship firsthand. Conversely, indoor sports facilities may sometimes contribute to air pollution or expose children to synthetic materials, raising health concerns.

Using eco-friendly materials, reducing plastic waste, and recycling sports gear can help minimize ecological footprints. Schools and communities can promote these practices, encouraging children to develop eco-conscious habits alongside their physical skills.

In addition, addressing environmental health issues such as air pollution is crucial, especially for children participating in outdoor sports in urban areas. Implementing policies that reduce emissions and improve air quality ensures safer environments for young athletes. Educating children about environmental issues linked to sports, like climate change and pollution, can foster a sense of responsibility toward protecting the planet.

In conclusion, promoting health and wellness in children through sports, while considering environmental impacts, nurtures a holistic approach to well-being. It encourages active lifestyles, environmental stewardship, and sustainable habits, preparing the younger generation to lead healthier lives while caring for the planet.




