At LAMMA 2024, we were honoured to receive the Silver Digital Innovation Award, a testament to our commitment to advancing the sector through technology and innovation.

- Our Virtual Work Experience (VWEX) programme is proving to be a tremendous success. Over 89% of participants came from schools identified as urban reflecting our commitment to diversity and inclusion
- After taking the VWEX programme over 75% of participants were now somewhat confident or very confident about finding a future job in the industry

Our collaboration with Morrisons was a significant milestone, as they became the first supermarket to partner with TIAH. This partnership aims to accelerate Morrisons' journey towards net zero and support its farmers in adopting more sustainable practices.

We have also continued to support the next generation of agricultural leaders through our student membership offering and our continued sponsorship of the OFC Inspire programme.
