Meet the Amazonians

in <u>Brussels</u>

The more we know about climate change, the more precious the world's carbon-storing resources can seem – particularly Brazil's majestic Amazon rainforest, often described as 'the world's lungs'. Held from 4 April until 9 November, it features 200 large-format monochrome

Try some skyrunning

(but don't get lost) in Madeira

Until about 10 years ago, Madeira was seen as a golden oldie's destination. Then extreme sports arrived. Today, the island's visitors are increasingly more white-knuckle than blue rinse, with many choosing to add surfing, diving or 'skyrunning' to their itineraries.

The latter translates as trail running up and down mountains and is wildly popular, with some 5,000 people descending on the island on 26 April for the Madeira Island Ultra Trail, taking on distances up to 115km.

There are also various trails you can follow under your own steam – but be warned. After a number of 'tourist misadventures', the island has now imposed rescue fees – including the cost of helicopter hire – payable by anyone who endangers themselves recklessly.

As well as hundreds of fishponds, the park is home to two thirds of all the waterbirds in Poland, plus 1,100km of bicycle, hiking, pony trekking and canoeing paths – and a serious amount of peace. quietparks.org



There are few riskier sports than freediving, but that hasn't stopped it booming in popularity. Nice's freediving club, the CIPA (Centre International de Plongée et Apnée), founded in 1999, has some 150 members, and organises the annual Nice Abyss Contest. Taking place over two days in June, the winner is, quite simply, whoever dives deepest.

"Freediving and scuba diving are two different sensations," explains Cédric Palerme, an original CIPA member. "Freediving gives you more freedom – you're lighter and more mobile. Since you're quieter and more discreet, it opens a world of unusual marine life species and behaviours."

"Anyone can try freediving, regardless of age," says Antoine Gustin, club president. Initiation sessions with the CIPA cost €40.



hen you think of marble, the chances are you picture glossy columns lining lofty buildings, intricate statues and ornate fountains, often indicating the historic importance of a location. In other words, marble doesn't immediately scream 'delicate' or 'wearable'.


"People thought I was crazy at the start," laughs Xenia Nefelly Vlachou, a jewellery designer from Greece. "But marble is this beautiful material synonymous with my country – I wanted to see if I could make it into accessories."

Born and raised in Athens, Xenia studied fashion at the PANSiK Fashion School in the capital and at the Academy of Costume and Fashion in Rome. "I started making accessories and jewellery as a hobby, really – my main focus was always on clothing," she explains.

However, after several years working in fashion companies in Athens, and some time teaching at PANSiK, she realised it was jewellery-making that was her real love. So, she started focusing on that, working with innovative materials such as painted wood.

Then, in the years after the Greek economic crash when the future still looked uncertain, Xenia decided to take a leap of faith and start her own company. Wanting to remind the world of all the incredible things her country had achieved, rather than its economic troubles, she sought inspiration from her environment. "Architecture, Cycladic art, Ancient Greece – there is so much to be inspired by and proud of in Greece," says Xenia. One material in particular captured her imagination. "Marble was having a surge in popularity around that time, and I had this thought: what if I could make jewellery using marble?"

A naturally occurring metamorphic rock, marble is found all over Greece, and comes in many different colours and shades, from the dark green of Tinos marble to the white, iridescent marble of





Thassos, which sparkles in the sunlight. Extracted from quarries in huge blocks, Xenia found it wasn't sourcing marble itself that was the issue, but sourcing it at the right scale.

"We have a huge marble industry, but it's all for big things – statues, decorations, things for the house. I was calling and asking companies to supply tiny cut pieces and they'd say: 'Sorry, lady, you're crazy'."

Eventually, Xenia found a successful marble company that understood her vision and she set about designing her first pieces, refining the delicate slices of marble through trial and error in her own workshop, and combining them with other materials to craft one-of-a-kind artworks. She chose to name her company Marmarometry – *mármaro* meaning marble in Greek, and metry from geometry – referencing her fondness for clean lines and elegant shapes when creating her jewellery.

At the same time, Xenia heard about a competition held by the Archaeological Receipts Fund (ARF) – an organisation linked to the Greek Ministry of Culture. They were looking for designers to create pieces for the ARF shops located in nationally owned museums all over Greece.

"There was only a month until the closing date, but the theme for the competition – Ancient Greek architecture and art – was just perfect for me," says Xenia. "So, I entered, and incredibly, I won."

Consequently, since 2016, a line of Marmarometry jewellery has been sold in ARF museum shops across Greece. The collection includes pieces inspired by historic marvels including the Ancient Theatre of Epidaurus and the ancient bronze statue of Peplos

Xenia's work has flourished elsewhere, too. Stocked in designer boutiques around the capital, her jewellery is also now sold in her two shops on the island of Paros – a short flight or a five-hour ferry from Athens – which she runs alongside her life and business partner, Alexandros Lagos, himself a jewellery designer. Splitting their time between the capital and the island, where Xenia spent childhood summers, gives them room for creativity and balance.

"We spend six months in Athens over the winter, where we have a workshop in Kesariani. Then, once we have our new collections ready, we spend the summer on the island and in our stores, meeting our customers and finding inspiration for new pieces."

Each item is still created by Xenia herself, with only the gold plating of some elements being outsourced. Her creations predominantly incorporate marbles from Tinos, Thassos, Aliveri and Paros, often paired

with other precious stones such as dark opals and lapis lazuli, and showcase different aspects of Ancient Greek art. They have also become a peaceful form of protest over one of Xenia's most heartfelt beliefs: that the Parthenon Marbles, transported from Greece to the UK in the early 19th century when Athens was part of the Ottoman Empire, should be returned to Greece.

"Before the Acropolis Museum opened in 2009, part of me felt the Marbles were safer in the British Museum – we [Greece] didn't always have a good track record of looking after our history," explains Xenia. However, once the Acropolis Museum opened, she felt it was time for them to be returned. "It's one of the most beautiful museums in the world – and it's where the marbles belong. Now, they would be 100% protected."

As a champion of Greek history, culture and produce, Xenia is keener than ever to share the marvels of her country with the world. "Our pieces are more than just jewellery – you know that it's made in Greece, and because each piece of marble is natural with different patterns and markings, they're all one of a kind," she smiles. "We always say when you buy a piece from Marmarometry, you also take a piece of Greece with you."

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In Glasgow's ghostly underbelly, death bells ring and spectral voices reach millions on TikTok. Our brave writer joins mediums and storytellers in the haunted city

'm standing in one of Lapwing Lodge's lonely, scuff-marked corridors when a piece of ghost-hunting equipment known as a 'death bell' breaks the heavy silence. The lodge opened as a sanatorium for Glasgow mill workers in 1910 before being turned into a scout camp, and rumours persist that it is haunted. The death bell seems to be in firm agreement. It sounds once, then twice, sending chills down my spine.

Although it looks innocuous, like the sort of thing you'd find on a hotel reception desk, the death bell responds to electromagnetic activity – ie: it only rings when there's something there to ring it. But except for a few musty bunkbeds and the smell of deep, spreading damp, the room we've placed it in is empty. So who – or what – is pressing it?

Perhaps it's to do with what the room used to be, according to my hosts from The Scottish Ghost Company: a mortuary. As the bell starts up again, those chills turn to icy fingers...

Glasgow may be one of the friendliest cities in the world, but it's also one of the spookiest. With its imposing architecture and sprawling Necropolis, it's a ghost-hunter's dream. They're finding new ways to make contact on TikTok, where hashtags such as #hauntedglasgow reveal the city's paranormal past - and present.

Local horror author John McNee (johnmcnee.com) doesn't seem like an obvious social media sensation, more like your favourite university lecturer. But his authoritative posts from some of Glasgow's creepiest locations have gained him 60,000 followers.



"I'm not a ghost hunter, more of a story hunter," he tells me. And the appeal of TikTok? "It's about being able to reach and connect with a really broad and engaged audience, it's really nice just to share stories. I like that." He posts from all over Europe, but the thing about Glasgow, he says, is that, "Everyone's a great storyteller. This is just a new form of telling."

The Scottish Ghost Company's posts are more dramatic, netting them over 20,000 followers. They use state-of-the-art tech to actually communicate with the dead – or "unalive" as TikTok insists they say. It's run by best friends Yvonne Hydes, a former nurse, and David McCabe, a medium, and they take people on tours of haunted venues around the country.

The pair also go ghost-hunting on their own a few times a week, with hair-raising results. But in person they're far from spooky – friendly, open and down to earth. Perhaps that's why they're so popular with the unalive. "We work well together," says Yvonne. "I don't see spirits the way David sees them. But I came from a cancer unit, so I'm not frightened of death and dying, maybe that helps." "We've got quite a lot of life experience," continues David. "I think spirits recognise that, and they draw from that and it attracts them."

To gain some life experience of my own, I join them for a bespoke tour of Lapwing Lodge. Perched high on the Gleniffer Braes (hills) above Paisley, to the east of the city, it's the sort of low-rise communal building you might find in a summer camp movie, or at least the Scottish version. When I arrive at 9pm, it's pitch black and freezing, and Yvonne and David greet me with the news that their team have already glimpsed various figures around the property. Inside, a Scout poster welcomes us with the motto, "Be prepared". Even if I'm not, they are.

As we set up in the mortuary corridor, they talk me through their equipment. There's the ITC (instrumental trans-communication) app, which allows the dead to "speak" via a bank of random words – like a haunted Alexa. There's also an EMF (electromagnetic field) reader, which lights up in response to unexplained electrical activity, and various "trigger objects", such as toys, dolls and flashing kitten balls, to lure out the spirits. Then there's the death bell which, they decide, might just be broken.

With the death bell mercifully out of action, David talks us through the spirits he can see. As the EMF

reader flashes, he describes "three men, a woman and a wee girl", the first of which is a "grumpy guy" from the 1920s or 1930s who's "aware of us and in this space". He's getting the name Peter. As he speaks, the atmosphere around us is thick and foreboding.

They turn on the ITC. To begin with, the noises that come through are just muddled electronic tones. But they get clearer, and one sounds for all the world like "Peter". Perhaps the death bell was working after all.

We head to the Robertson Lounge, an atmospheric room with pictures of forbidding scout masters peering down from the walls and a Gothic cross in the corner. Here, with the lights off and a clock ticking ominously in the background, the activity intensifies.

The kitten balls start glowing, then the EMR reader flickers, then a torch. It's as if someone – a child? – is playing with them, and Yvonne and David speak to them gently, like counsellors. "Are you a boy?" Nothing. A girl? Nothing. "It's OK, you won't get in trouble."

What happens next makes us jump out of our skins. "ALICE!" bellows the ITC. Alice, David tells me, is a little girl from the 1960s in a red coat. She's scared of someone in authority – a matron perhaps. "I hear you," Alice tells us, then, "You are not safe!" Those icy fingers grip tighter, and don't let up until it's time to leave.

It's not the last supernatural exchange of this mini hunt, but it's the one that stays with me. Are we really hearing ghosts, or is it just a glitch in the Matrix? I can't be sure, but I can see Yvonne and David are completely in earnest. This is their calling, not a side hustle.

Perhaps it's a question of interpretation. Of making yourself open to a place and the people who lived and died there, then turning it into a story. And that's what I'm left with. That whether speaking to the spirits, posting to TikTok, or just shouting into the ether, we're all just telling the same campfire tales.

family dinner table is a formative place. Some are messy, with spills and snorts and laughter. Some see parents firing quiz questions at their kids like their futures depend on it. Others are simply a place to fuel up; quiet, save the sounds of spirited chewing. Growing up, Nadine Selaawi's family dinner table in Cairo was dominated by basketball, everyone seated around it fervently swapping stats, advising on training plans and talking about tournaments.

And little wonder – the entire Selaawi clan are basketball virtuosos. Nadine's two older brothers both play professionally; her mother, Eman Badrawy, excelled in the Egyptian national team; and most notably, her father, Mohamed Selaawi, was the top-scorer for the country in the 1984 Olympics.


"He's a legend back here in Egypt. I grew up watching him play against some of the world's greatest players, like Michael Jordan. It really inspired me," says Nadine. "There's this mentality that men have to carry on their father's name, but I decided I wanted to be the one to continue his legacy."

It's for this reason that she took the unconventional decision to move to the US at 17 to play Division I basketball for the University of North Carolina at Greensboro (UNCG), going against all cultural norms for young girls – and her Dad's wishes – at that time. But Nadine makes history both on and off the court.

"I'm so proud I made that choice," she says. "It completely changed my game. Going there, I was just a scorer. I improved my shots, but I also learned to play great defense as well."

It shows. The young athlete became UNCG's all-time top women's basketball scorer ("They're planning to have a little retirement party for my jersey when I have time to go back") before returning to Cairo at 22 and becoming the shining light of Al Ahly SC and the Egyptian National Team, winning trophies for both 5x5 and - her favourite - the faster paced 3x3.

AL AHLY SPORTS HALL

She might spend most of her time here, but that doesn't stop Al Ahly SC's courts being Nadine's top pick. "Watching a game here is a fun experience, especially thanks to the fans. Our ultras sing songs and bring good vibes," she says.

RECOVERY LAB

"If I'm tired from training and I need to get my energy back, I go here," says Nadine. An athletic recovery centre and spa, it has everything from massages to ice baths – but you don't have to be a pro athlete to visit.

KHUFU'S

Nadine loves the pyramids of Giza, about a 45-minute drive from Cairo. "I never get tired of seeing them," she says. Her favourite way? Through the windows of Khufu's restaurant (pictured), while enjoying its local fare with a twist.

Her reasons for loving the 3x3 act as a good analogy for the 27-year-old's approach to life. "The game is really short and the ball doesn't stop, so you have to be focused the whole time and hold yourself accountable on the court." Yes, her decision to go into basketball may have been influenced by her family; her sporting prowess might have originated with them too, but it's her passion, determination and work ethic that have got her this far.

Like her parents, Nadine has chosen to keep competitive sport in the family, choosing a professional water polo player as her teammate in life (the two got married in 2023). "We understand each other – he gets how I'm feeling if I've lost a game and come home upset in a way he wouldn't if he didn't play sport too. Plus, we both know that 80-90% of the time we'll be busy training and preparing for games so we have to help each other out," she says. "I love that we both have this passion – it doesn't matter that it's not for the same sport. It pushes me and expands my mind."

Now the trailblazer is passing the torch to other young female basketballers in Egypt with her new mentorship programme in association with Red Bull. Set to launch later in 2025, Under My Wing will give one young athlete the chance to shadow Nadine for a whole year. That means working out and training together, and navigating the complex business side of competitive sport together. Ultimately, the aim is to provide them with new opportunities to grow their knowledge and further their future career.

The mentee will be chosen via a training camp for girls between the ages of 13 and 16. Nadine will also offer advice and connections to a few more – especially when it comes to following in her footsteps to play collegiate basketball abroad.

"I've had so many younger players come to me with questions: how do you handle the pressure? What's the best way to get your confidence back after an injury? How do you get a scholarship to a US school?" explains Nadine. Giving 20 minutes to a gaggle of girls after one of her games can be helpful, but this programme will allow her to truly nurture the next generation of women's basketball in Egypt and make a huge difference in their lives.

In many ways, the Under My Wing mentees will become part of the Selaawi basketball legacy, sat discussing stats and training and tournaments around a metaphorical dinner table.

urn them quickly," Davit calls out, nodding toward the skewers of pork sizzling and charring on the coals. "And splash on some water." His father, Artsrun, the grill master,

grabs a spray bottle and mists the charcoal. The droplets hit with a sharp sizzle, sending up plumes of smoke toward the steep, red cliffs of the surrounding mountain range.

Perched on a narrow plateau, our group of seven is taking part in one of Armenia's most cherished traditions – *khorovats*. The word literally means 'grilled', but the translation hardly does this ritual any justice. This isn't just a barbeque: people here have been gathering around these fires, laughing, arguing, and making lengthy toasts with homemade vodka for as long as anyone can remember. Without the right connections or fluency in the language, most visitors only catch a glimpse of this tradition in restaurants. But today, with sweeping views of the mountains and the reservoir below, we're experiencing khorovats as they are meant to be – smoky, hands-on and in the fresh mountain air.

About an hour south of Yerevan, the road from Dvin village cuts through several plots of farmland, with large white storks perched atop electricity posts, watching over the fields below. These rural roads are



the way to Mount Yeranos, and few know them better than Davit Abrahamyan.

Behind the wheel of his UAZ 4x4, he tells us about the time he was called to rescue a group of lost hikers. "They called the emergency services, and the emergency services called me," he laughs, "because they didn't know their way around here." Born and raised in Dvin, Davit has been climbing these mountains since childhood, first with his uncle, and now as a host, leading tourists to the peak for a mountaintop khorovats.

When we arrive, Davit's father, Artsrun, is already tending to the smoking coals. On a table nearby, Davit begins preparations, threading okra onto long



metal skewers, each piece layered with pork fat to caramelise the vegetable over the open flame. It's an unusual choice for Armenian barbecue, but our guide, Jor Martirosyan from 2492 Travel – a company that organises a series of 'Wild Food' adventures – explains that, long ago, a priest brought the roots of an okra plant back from Egypt and it's been cultivated in the region ever since.

Jor first met Davit while trying to find a way up the mountain himself. He came to the village, asking around for a route, and a woman pointed him to the local 'historian' — Davit earned the title after finding a bronze coin carved with the face of Alexander the Great while foraging for herbs. The find triggered renewed archaeological interest in the outskirts of Dvin, once an ancient capital of Armenia, uncovering a burial ground and stockpiles of old coins.

At the time, Davit agreed to take Jor up the mountain and insisted he host a barbecue. Jor remembers when they got to the top, Davit attached iron ropes to his car and tied them to old bushes, pulling the branches from the ground to use as skewers for the meat and vegetables. When Jor joined 2492 Travel some years later, he saw the

perfect opportunity. "Travellers come to Armenia to experience nature, hospitality, and good food," he says. "We decided to combine everything in one place."

This experience is a touch more refined than your typical khorovats. Right from the start. Davit hands out a strawberry cocktail - a blend of strawberry tonic, fresh fruit, and homemade almond vodka, which lends a subtle nuttiness to the drink. The wooden table where we eat, set against the mountain backdrop, is piled with local cheeses and lavash. Baked in an underground oven known as a tonir, this thin, soft flatbread is so central to Armenian culture that locals don't call meals 'lunch' or 'dinner', but rather, hats utel, or 'eating bread'. Davit also brings over the tabbouleh, but it's not the typical Levantine salad you would expect. This version is made with whole wheat kernels and laced with strips of basturma, a cured beef infused with chamen, a blend of herbs dominated by fenugreek.

Away from the grill, Davit carefully marinates pieces of pork in rosemary, thyme and purple basil. There's an art to this - each piece needs to be cut identically, and arranged in such a way that the skewers don't

touch the coals and the meat cooks evenly. "If you're Armenian, you have to know how to do this," Davit says, carrying the skewers to the grill.

As soon as he places them over the flames, his father, Artsrun, leans in and whispers: "Turn them a little, and line them up closer together." Here, the khorovats know-how is ingrained from childhood, passed from father to son. Naturally, everyone has an opinion on how it should be done.

Barbequing is not the only culinary tradition passed from generation to generation. After our meal, with the smell of smoke and charred meat on our clothes, as we make our way south to discover the revival of ancient Armenian winemaking.

Typically, visitors to Armenia will visit millenniaold monasteries and museums commemorating its storied past. But increasingly, wine is also putting Armenia on the map. While many of the wineries here are fairly new, local winemaking dates back more than 6,000 years. At a cave in Areni, a town at the heart of the southern wine region, archaeologists uncovered the world's oldest known winery, complete with fermentation vats and grape seeds preserved underground. During Soviet times, mass produced brandy nearly erased the country's wine culture, but today, a new generation is reclaiming this ancient heritage, experimenting with indigenous grapes and modern techniques.

Our first stop is NOA Wines in Rind village. Spread over 50 hectares, this project by Schuler St. Jakobs Kellerei, the Swiss wine house, only uses indigenous Armenian grapes. At 1,350m in altitude, it takes a hardy grape to survive these conditions, and here, the Areni Noir variety has endured for millennia, producing a wine rich with flavours of berry and hints of spice. The soil is laden in limestone and basalt, adding a minerality to the wine that helps it age.

Further along the main road, a different style of winery awaits. In a house built by his own hand, 76-year-old Volodya Voskanyan welcomes us into his wine cellar with a full glass. Hidden in the nooks of the walls, he's tucked away decades-old bottles of wine.

"I won't open them, but maybe my grandchildren will," he says. Taking up almost all the floor space are several enormous *karases*, traditional clay amphorae used to store wine as it ages. Using local beeswax, Volodya coats the interior of the karas by hand, and uses it as a seal, too. The wine we taste is named chudo, meaning 'miracle' in Russian. When he hands me a glass, Volodya says "*Anush lini*" ('Let it be sweet') – and it is. Each sip rich and strong, the homemade blend resembles a sherry.

Our journey continues, skirting around the region's deep canyons. The next stop is Old Bridge Winery, named after a steep, Silk Road-era bridge nearby where founder Armen Khalatyan spent his childhood learning to swim. This winery produces just 20,000 bottles a year, each labelled by hand. Here, winetasting is accompanied by local olives, honey and cheese, with glasses full of wines made with European equipment and aged in oak barrels, imparting flavours of vanilla, coffee and dark chocolate.

After an indulgent day, our resting place is Lele Hotel – named for the 'lele' vocal motif that often appears in Armenian folk music. Staff describe it as the first wine resort of the region. A budding hub for the arts, the hotel blends modern Scandinavian design with thoroughly local flavours. Breakfast the next morning is unmistakably Armenian: a hearty Qyalagosh, combining lavash, yoghurt, lentils, caramelised onions, and ghavurma, salty hunks of beef, slow-cooked and tender.

In Armenia, the past isn't confined to ancient monasteries and museums, nor its priceless artefacts that speak of a resilient history. It is in every meal, savoured with every glass raised, and remembered in the rituals that have been passed from generation to generation. **2492.travel**




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SAUSAGE SHOWDOWN



//\It's the on-the-go snack synonymous with Germany. But which city serves currywurst the best - Berlin or Dortmund?

very city has its iconic street food.
In New York, it's cart-bought
hot dogs. For Istanbul, the simit
– a molasses and sesame seedcoated bread-ring. In Rome, it's
pizza al taglio. And in Berlin, it's currywurst.

Or should that be in Dortmund, it's currywurst? For those not yet addicted to this delicious streetside snack, currywurst is a German sausage (bratwurst) served with a spicy sauce. Although variations on the theme exist, that's the basis of the street food that's been a staple – whether for lunch, an after-school snack or recharging after a long night clubbing – for over 75 years. But which city can really claim the currywurst crown?





"Science proves it was invented here," huffs 46-year-old Berlin local Eric Richter. Science might be a stretch, but certainly the most common currywurst origin story tells of West Berlin kiosk owner Herta Heuwer trading with British soldiers in 1949, exchanging liquor for curry powder and ketchup (or possibly Worcestershire sauce). Mixing these with other spices, she made a sauce to pour over sausages.

Herta patented her 'Chillup' sauce in 1951 and took the recipe to her grave in 1999. In 2019, The Berlin State Mint created a medal in her honour. There's also a plaque at the site of her stall on Kaiser-Friedrich Straße.

Part of the reason for currywurst's initial popularity was not only its taste, but its protein-rich inexpensiveness: something that construction workers, rebuilding Berlin after WWII, welcomed.

The same could be said for Dortmund, which sits within the Ruhr area known as the Rust Belt because of its manufacturing past. Undoubtedly, it held just as many workers hungry for inexpensive street-eats – to the extent that whenever Drew Portnoy (@fatandysindustries) posts a TikTok on the subject, "I get tons of comments about how Currywurst wasn't invented in Berlin, but rather in Germany's Rust Belt."

Still, although comments on TikTok aren't quite as compelling as a specially minted medal in honour of a named creator, Dortmund's industrial heritage certainly created the perfect backdrop for this working-class delicacy to flourish.



Regionality rears its head! While both Berlin and Dortmund favour a pork sausage (as opposed to Frankfurt, where beef is preferred) Berlin's currywurst is most commonly served ohne darm – without the traditional intestine casing. In Dortmund, it's more usually mit (with) – the latter giving the shell of the sausage a tauter crispiness.

But other aspects vary from *Imbiss* (snack stand) to Imbiss, even within the one city. In Dortmund, a short walk separates Böckels Beste from Wurst Willi, yet at the former, my sausage was doused in sauce and sprinkled liberally with curry powder, alongside mayodrowned chips. At the latter, the sausage was similarly smothered but served with a bread roll. Even so, the curry flavour isn't

In Berlin, at one Imbiss the sausage is cut by hand; others have nifty electric slicers. At Curry 36, the sausages are from applefed pigs reared locally in Havelland, and a bottled, branded 'Original Curry 36 Ketchup' is available. At Krasselt's Imbiss in Steglitz, the sauce on the skewer-served sausage is tangy and fruity. At Witty's Wurst, only organic ingredients are used.

And then there's Curry Wolf, which serves its currywurst with a fresh roll across three Berlin sites. The recipe for its secret sauce is dubbed "OPIUM" due, allegedly, to its addictiveness.

At Konnopke's Imbiss, tucked under the U-Bahn tracks in Prenzlauer Berg, the recipe is, again, closely guarded. The sausage may be served whole or sliced, but always ohne darm. Konnopke's has been in operation since 1930 (originally selling sausages) and keeps fiercely with tradition – post-WWII, supplies, including sausage casings, were scarce.




Charlottenburg-born Daniel, 42, has fond memories of being given money to buy currywurst to eat with schoolfriends. For Uli, 46, it was more of a guilty pleasure. Even so, those illicit, after-school snacks left an impression: before embracing veganism years ago, he binge-ate three currywurst in one day as a 'farewell.' Now, of course, vegan options are widely available.

Kreuzberg bartender Lucas, 22, says currywurst is the ultimate in comfort food. "It's home. Once, there was a currywurst Imbiss on every street and you'd smell their special sauce even before you turned the corner," he recalls "Now, Berlin is more diverse and currywurst is in competition with other cuisines – but it still means childhood for me."

Dortmunders are more prosaic. "Currywurst is simple and quick. It doesn't have to be fancy or special," says digital creator Lars (@lars_likes_food). "It's cheap," shrugs Krissi, a student from TU Dortmund. "Good also for hangovers... I have a lot."

Either way, there's something democratic about currywurst stands in both cities, where people generally eat on their feet at raised tables, sharing elbow space. You might end up speaking with a stranger, or pushing your leftovers towards your 'companion' saying "Ich bin satt, willst du das?" ("I'm full, do you want this?").

Not content with creating secret sauces. purveyors of currywurst in both cities have evolved over time: as mentioned, vegan and vegetarian options are now widely available. A new addition at Curry 61 is a vegan currywurst and vegan truffle mayonnaise. Some - including Witty's - also cater for gluten-intolerant diners.

Yet, as is common with street food, there are elevations: in the case of Berlin's TV Tower, quite literally. At Sphere Bar - the city's highest - Michelin-starred chef Tim Raue has devised a bar snack menu that

dusting of yellow - but it's gold leaf, rather than curry powder or spices.


Meanwhile, in Dortmund, former deepfreeze plant of the Hansa coking plant is now SchwarzGold, a fine dining restaurant where a €155 tasting menu created by Michelin-starred chef Pierre Beckerling begins with an exquisite 'Dortmunder currywurst': a spherical lollipop sitting proudly atop a metal chip fork.

Back in the capital, though, you can even glam up your currywurst at street level, as Bier's Kudamm 195 and Curry Wolf both serve either Moët or Dom Perignon Champagne. No bookings, no expensive menus, just currywurst and champers on a whim.



Don't expect to pay more than €10 for currywurst in Berlin - and usually, it'll be considerably less. Indeed, it's only the newer variations on the theme that tend to attract higher prices - for example, Witty's, with their organic commitment, charge €7.90 for a relatively small serving.

At Curry 36, vegans pay €9.90, as opposed to €8.70 for the meaty version. Then again, you get two sausages and chips for this price. Order just the single sausage at Bier's Kudamm 195 and vou're looking at €2.70, with an extra €2.20 for fries. It's a similar story in Dortmund, where a portion vegan or not - with fries is just under €7. or around €3.95 on its own.





While Berlin claims the historical crown with Herta Heuwer's legacy and impressive innovation, Dortmund delivers an equally authentic currywurst experience with industrial soul. Sure, Berlin dazzles with variety and creativity - from gold-dusted luxury versions to vegan innovations but Dortmund offers exceptional value. consistency, and a no-nonsense approach that honours currywurst's working-class roots. And beyond currywurst. Dortmund's evolving street food scene now features food trucks (check out Taste of Luscious by MC: Filipino Food Truck), Korean fried chicken joints (Sonamu), and street food markets (Phoenixhalle). Whether you prefer Berlin's storied tradition or Dortmund's straightforward authenticity, both cities deserve exploration by any serious

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
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Treasure island

There's off-the-beaten-path and then there's the island of Ischia, Italy's bestkept secret and the Mediterranean's ultimate wellness destination Words by Laura Martin Photography by Tim E White WIZZ MAGAZINE 53

merging from the turquoise sea, I pad along the beach, the dark sand toasty beneath my bare feet. Jutting up from the bay's edge are grey, chalky cliffs, with winding stone staircases ascending to a smattering of modest white houses. To the west is the colourful fishing village of Sant'Angelo; to the east, the Gulf of Naples, stretching in an expanse of cobalt blue all the way to mainland Italy.

"Excuse me," a nearby sunbather interjects. "Don't walk too far up that way, it's very hot. This is a smoking beach." Now she mentions it, my feet are heating up at an alarming rate as they sink into the sand.

I'm on Maronti Beach on the southern coast of Ischia, a volcanic island an hourlong ferry hop from Naples. A chilled-out antidote to the popular, neighbouring Capri, the 46.3km² island has mostly remained under the radar despite its romantic, rugged beauty and proximity to the glitzy Amalfi Coast. What's more, it's the perfect spot for natural spa-lovers thanks to the geothermal energy of the ground beneath it. According to the Italian spa expert Raffaella Dallarda, first brought to Ischia by her grandmother as a child, it remains a little-known wellness gem – even among Italians.

"Ischia has long been a natural oasis of wellbeing," Raffaella says, explaining that it's been inhabited since the Bronze Age, with the ancient Greeks arriving almost 3,000 years ago. "There are mineral-rich waters heated by the Earth's core, bubbling to the surface in over a hundred thermal springs, fumaroles and natural pools. That's why I call the island the kingdom of spas."

Also known as 'the green island' for its lush vegetation and buildings made from a signature green tuff stone, Ischia is a dramatic mix of hilly forests and black rock-lined beaches, with Mount Epomeo - a dormant volcano - towering at its centre. While Epomeo last erupted in 1302, places like Maronti Beach still benefit from its blazing core beneath the earth. Temperatures below the surface can sometimes reach 100°C, which can make bathing in its inland thermal springs downright dangerous (look out for warning signs on particularly hot days) but means that the cooler sand near the shoreline emanates a warm heat, ideal for warming tired bones after a long winter.

It's not just sunbathers who benefit from the terrain's warmth. Visitors to Maronti should keep their eyes peeled for an unusual

sight: a chef in his whites, brandishing a big spade and marching over to the hottest part of the beach. He digs in hot sand and carefully lifts out several yellow fabricwrapped tins, among erupting steam. This is Angelo Russo, a chef from the nearby Hotel Terme Ferdinando. He regularly cooks *al fumarole*, using natural thermal heat from the sand. His is one of just two restaurants on the island that has a licence to do so.

"Ischians have been cooking this way for generations," Angelo says. "The process makes for the most incredible tasting food." His restaurant, with its picturesque, sunbaked terrace overlooking the sparkling Tyrrhenian Sea, serves a unique, Earth-cooked menu of regional dishes that have been baking in the tins for about an hour and a half. There's beautifully tender octopus; fall-off-the-bone chicken with turmeric, onions and carrots; and a vegetable stew of peppers, celery, potatoes and greens, all grown at the restaurant's own farm. It tastes sensational, the intense heat trapping in all the flavours.

Nature's hot tubs

Joining me for lunch is tour guide Paolo de Palma, who was born on the island and has spent the last 20 years showing its wonders to visitors.

"We have long known about the natural beauty and power of Ischia, but it's definitely remained somewhat of a secret," he says. While the island had its heyday with Hollywood stars in the 1960s (parts of *Cleopatra* starring Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton was filmed here), the jet-set later moved on to Capri instead. Ischia was left in the shadows of more than just its volcano. "That is changing slightly now," says Paolo. "We're seeing more people coming to explore it as an alternative to Capri, and maybe I'm biased, but I think some people find themselves falling in love with Ischia more."


There's only one way to see what Ischia can offer over glamorous Capri, and it involves a trip via golf buggy, water taxi and Paolo's car to Sorgeto Bay in the southwest of the island. While there are many thermal spas on Ischia - including at Hotel Excelsior, Negombo and the sprawling Poseidon Gardens - we've come to check out the natural springs on this craggy cove. where little rock pools are heated up by steam bursting up from the ground. After descending a steep set of steps to the beach, it's serenely quiet when we arrive. Naturally, I begin to strip down to my swimming costume. "Oh no, we can't go bathing today," says Paolo, "The hot springs are just too hot."

I swish my hand in what looks like the cool edge of the seawater pool, and find the water is the temperature of a just-made cup of tea. Unlike the many indoor spas and thermal parks of the island, there's no regulating the heat coming from the Earth's crust, and we're at the mercy of fiery Mother Nature. "You have to be really careful here," explains Paolo. "A sign tells you if it's too hot to enter, and if there's no one else in the pools or it's low tide, that's also a sign not to go in. Anyone who ignores that could end up in hospital with burns as a result."

A trip to the emergency room would be far from relaxing. Luckily, this is far from the only natural spa on the island, and Paolo has another suggestion for an alfresco experience.

Chasing waterfalls

Nitrodi Natural Springs, in the hillside village of Buonopane just north of Maronti, is the oldest spa in the world. Spa manager, Giuseppe Di Meglio, is keen to prove just how old, showing me copies of the decorative votive stone tablets discovered on the site by farmers in 1757. They were created by the ancient Greeks and date back to 14AD, when warriors came to the

sacred springs to nurse war wounds and local women drank and bathed in the mineral-rich water. For ancient Ischians, cleanliness really was next to godliness.

Nitrodi's charmingly ramshackle herbal aromatherapy gardens and springs attract 20,000 visitors every year. While it costs €18 for a half-day ticket, on the first day of spring when it opens for the season, it's free for everyone, in celebration of the ritual so deep-rooted in the island's history.

Surprisingly, though, Paolo says locals don't regularly go spa-bathing in Ischia. "When the Greeks arrived," he says, "they brought three things to the island: the alphabet, pottery and wine. So, the Ischians didn't concern themselves with thermal spas, concentrating on these things instead." That means that, while the island now boasts award-winning volcanic wine and globally recognised pottery brand Ceramiche Mennella, you won't find hoards

of locals gathering at Sorgeto's springs every weekend or popping to Nitrodi after work for a refreshing shower.

Gisueppe shows me to the open-air waterfall shower for a final blast from the cult springs. "You need to stand under it for at least 10 minutes," he insists. "Afterwards, don't shower and don't use soap until the morning after. You want to let all the minerals soak in, and I promise you, your skin will be silky soft in the morning."

I step under the spray. The water flows through wild rosemary, infusing it with a woodsy, Mediterranean scent, while the sun dapples through the nearby citrus trees. I can even see a calming strip of blue sea on the horizon. As I relax into the healing powers of the water, it feels like little has changed in this patch of Eden in almost three millennia. Ischia's secret might be out, but I'll still try to keep it for a while longer.





"One of the main highlights of pop art is changing the original function of something, and turning a public toilet into a museum is very pop art," says Eszter Marton, the gallery's managing director. The various features of the toilets include emojis galore, a 14-carat gold cockroach and flying pixelated pigs. The music in the loos - created by kissmiklos's brother - is like that of a 1980s video game, and a bespoke fragrance wafts through the air. Pop & Roll, which also hosts work by other contemporary artists, has only been open for a year but the reaction in Hungary has been hugely positive. "I was expecting much more negative comments," says Eszter. Head off to Budapest and spend a penny. It's the one place where you won't need to worry about explaining why you were in the toilet for so long. popandroll.art

Oriole London

What do you get when you blend live music with decadent cocktails and a menu fusing together the best flavours of Latin America? The answer is Oriole, a restaurant-cum-bar-and-music-venue located in the St Martin's Courtyard area of Covent Garden. Low lighting, dark woods and green leather benches create an intimate, speakeasy vibe, with vintage wallpaper depicting exotic landscapes providing a

fitting backdrop for your meal. The food itself comes beautifully presented and brings creative Latin twists. Expect the likes of shiitake mushrooms with egg volk and soft arepa, and seabass ceviche with amarillo leche de tigre to start with, followed by bold main dishes such as Nikkeiinspired short rib with kimchi and mash. Even classics like panroasted duck come with an orange mole sauce, chicory and chestnut purée. Despite being just seconds away from the Icelandic Parliament, the only political thing at Hjá Jóni is deciding how to split the bill. Well, that and the name, a nod to 19th-century Icelandic politician Jón Sigurðsson (you might spot him on the 500 kronur note and as a statue in Austurvöllur square). But happily, this swish spot inside

the Iceland Parliament Hotel makes everyone welcome. Tables are surrounded by green banquettes and velvet chairs that invite you to sink in and settle down for the evening – and once you've tasted the food, you'll do just that.

Head chef Fanney Dóra
Sigurjónsdóttir's aim is to
showcase the exceptional quality
of Icelandic ingredients, while
playing with international flavours.
A plate of her signature pillowy
Japanese milk bread will always
arrive first, best torn and smeared
with herby whipped butter. Follow

it with a starter of melt-on-yourtongue smoked salmon, served warm with a punchy yuzu and horseradish glaze and cut through by pickled celery and apple.

For local big hitters, order the lightly smoked Hornafjörður cod, served proudly atop a bed of creamy mash, and the fillet of Icelandic lamb marinated in Arctic thyme. 

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

"The XLR is a game-changer for the aviation industry"

This April, Wizz Air welcomes the first Airbus A321XLR to its fleet, taking off on a new route from London to Jeddah. We speak to the people at WIZZ who helped order and deliver this special aircraft



izz Air UK's Head of Operations Philip Cullen has experienced many highlights during his 35-year aviation career, 25 years of which were as a pilot. His most recent big task for WIZZ is right up there with all of them. In April, Philip has the privilege of flying the latest addition to the Wizz Air fleet - the Airbus A321XLR (Extra Long Range) - from the production line in Hamburg to London.

"Aircraft coming off the production line have that new plane smell," beams Philip, who will be joined by a co-pilot and crew for the journey of about two hours. "Flying the new Airbus A321XLR is a wonderful task and a big highlight for me. The plane is a gamechanger for the aviation industry. At Wizz Air we are all about safety, convenience and bringing affordable travel to people. The XLR allows us to do all three."

This Airbus A321XLR is the first of many ordered by Wizz Air, to be delivered in stages until 2030, and allows the airline to, quite literally, spread its wings. The plane's range (about 8.700km) means WIZZ can now extend its maximum flight times from around six hours up to eight hours or more. It's a change that allows the airline to connect the furthest destinations on its network - linking Europe and the Middle East - and expand even further. The first A321XI R will be used to fly a brand-new route from London Gatwick to Jeddah, in Saudi Arabia, this spring.

"The A321XLR will create exciting new opportunities for Wizz Air and its customers," says Philip. "It's 30% more fuel efficient per seat than flying with a long-haul wide-body aircraft, and it has high seat density, which means the CO₂ emissions intensity is less than that of a wide-body plane on the same flight. It also has a lower-cost base, which makes travelling with WIZZ more affordable."

"With the A321XLR we can connect major airports at a fraction of the cost of wide-body airlines, and use smaller, less busy hubs to connect cities," he continues. "This will open up new markets and connect people even more, getting closer to where they are or where they want to go."

The fact that the plane is a variant of the A321neo will help to

make its integration into the fleet as seamless as possible.

"The XLR cabin has the same layout as our A321neo aircraft. with 239 passengers," says Gréta Dobránszki. Fleet Acquisition Manager at Wizz Air, "Most of the spare parts and internal cabin items are the same as on the A321neo. "The XLR has an extra so-called rear tank, which allows the aircraft model to fly longer routes," she continues. "This extended range enables us to offer the market the most sustainable flying option at the lowest fare at longer distances, compared to wide-body aircraft on the same route."

Wizz Air placed its order for the XLRs in 2019 after a period of thorough research. "The process of choosing the right plane involved a lot of teams," explains Gréta. "We needed to look at the available options from a network, crewing, airport, operations and maintenance point of view, amongst many others.

"All involved teams are kept up to date on the progress to ensure no information is missed. This close collaboration is essential for successfully integrating the XLR into our fleet."

After all the hard work, Gréta and everyone else at Wizz Air can't wait to see the XLR arrive and take off on its first official trip. "It's always exciting working at WIZZ, but it doesn't happen every day that you bring a new aircraft model into the fleet," she says. "That makes the arrival of the XLR extra special."

Why smoking is banned on flights

Airlines started banning smoking in the late 1980s and by 2000 it was made illegal across the world. Here are the reasons why

Secondhand smoke: Secondhand smoke contains over 7,000 chemicals, including at least 70 known carcinogens. Breathing these harmful chemicals in the confined space of an aircraft poses serious health risks.

It impacts air quality:

Cigarette smoke can circulate in the confined air and lead to unpleasant odours. It impairs the air quality and jeopardises how the cabin pressure system functions, which can result in a lack of oxygen at high altitude.

It's a fire hazard: A lit cigarette can ignite flammable materials, potentially leading to a catastrophic fire in the cabin. Extinguishing fires mid-flight is challenging.

Electronic cigarettes/vapes/IQOS can cause concern: Therefore

they are also not allowed on in the cabin. While e-cigarettes produce vapour rather than smoke, the visible vapour can be mistaken for traditional cigarette smoke, causing confusion and potential alarm among passengers.

Dry air conditions: The dry air in the aircraft cabin can make fuel more flammable.

Smoke detectors: The smoke detector in the toilets is linked to a warning system. When triggered,



the smoke detector notifies cabin crew through a control panel in the cockpit and triggers an audible alarm throughout the aircraft cabin. This system helps cabin crew swiftly address emergency situations related to smoke on board.

Overheating batteries: Vaping, IQOS and e-cigarettes work with lithium-ion batteries that are more likely to overheat or explode while being used.

SMOKING ON A PLANE COULD LEAD TO:

- Fines of up to €3,000
- A ban from flying with that airline for life
- As per the applicable law, smokers on board may face prosecution.

Remember, lighting up during a flight is not only illegal but also jeopardises the wellbeing and safety of everyone on board. The ashtrays in the passenger cabin and restrooms are not an optional design element and not an invitation to smoke. Cabin crew members are trained to extinguish smoke and fire and eliminate any potential danger.

Your onboard safety

Please show consideration for your fellow passengers and pay attention to the following information. Remember that by purchasing your Wizz Air ticket, you have accepted the Wizz Air General Conditions of Carriage (available in full at wizzair.com)



Safe handling of hand luggage

Ensure that your larger hand luggage remains safely stowed in the locker and the smaller ones are under the seat in front of you for take-off, landing and whenever instructed by the crew. Passengers seated in the emergency rows and first row must store their cabin bags in the overhead lockers. Take care when opening lockers, as falling items may injure fellow passengers. In case of evacuation, all baggage must be left on board, and the instructions of the cabin crew must be strictly followed.



Safety equipment

It is an offence to tamper with or remove safety equipment, including adult and infant life vests, infant safety belts or extension belts. You are not allowed to remove or damage any onboard informative placards.



Sharp items

To dispose of sharp items (e.g. hypodermic needles), contact a cabin crew member. Do not leave it behind.



Turbulence management

Turbulence can occur unexpectedly. Whenever seatbelt signs are switched on, remain seated, keep seatbelts fastened and stow away large electronic devices. For your safety, we recommend that you keep your seatbelts visibly fastened at all times when seated.



Safety of infants on board

Wizz Air has a clear procedure for infant (a child under two) restraint systems. You can only use the single hook infant seatbelt – vests/slings cannot be used with the infant seatbelt. Wizz Air only accepts aft-facing car seats when an extra seat is purchased. However, during take-off, landing and whenever the seatbelt sign is switched on, infants should sit on an adult's lap with the seatbelt fastened. Life vests for infants are available and are provided whenever flying over water. All lavatories are equipped with a changing table. Do not leave children unattended in the cabin.



Lithium batteries

Portable electronic devices (PED) such as phones, laptops and tablets can contain lithium batteries. When damaged, faulty or overheated, these batteries can catch fire and explode. If you recognise any issues with your device, inform the cabin crew immediately.

Charging electronic devices on board using a portable battery charger is forbidden.



Flectronic devices

Some electronic devices can be used during the flight with WLAN/Wi-Fi/Bluetooth turned off.

Larger electronic devices that cannot be held comfortably in one hand, exceed ca. 1kg in weight and do not qualify as handheld devices (e.g. laptops, notebooks etc.) must be stowed in the overhead stowage compartments for takeoff, landing and whenever required by the cabin crew.

If in doubt, please ask your cabin crew.



Read these tips on how to stay fit when travelling.



Before your air travel

Consult your doctor before travelling if you have any medical concerns. Pregnant women and those with heart or respiratory problems, blood diseases or ear, nose and sinus infections should seek medical advice before flying. Crew members are entitled to call for medical assistance pre-flight if they deem it necessary and are in doubt about your fitness for the flight.



Medical supplies on board

Keep any medication you may need in your hand luggage and in its original packaging. Inform cabin crew of allergies or illnesses. If you are seriously ill or travelling post-surgery, you will need a medical certificate confirming that you are fit to fly. If you have limited mobility, are hearing- or sight-impaired, pregnant, or unable to understand/react to safety instructions, you will be unable to sit in the emergency exit rows or the front row. If you start to feel unwell during the flight, do not hesitate to talk to the cabin crew.



Nut allergy

During our WIZZ Café service we offer peanuts and some snacks containing peanuts/nuts traces. If you have any allergies we strongly encourage you to take all necessary medical precautions before flying, and to inform the cabin crew during boarding about your allergy.
