After The Dawn

- Begin your day with peace and mindfulness by offering food to a monk in Soi Sukhumvit 57 or at Wat That Thong - a beautiful act of kindness and respect rooted in Buddhist traditions, where monks rely on the generosity of others for their daily meals.
- Afterward, take a short walk to Lee's Noodle, a beloved local spot, to enjoy a hearty breakfast and experience a touch of authentic Thainess.
- Then, complete your morning with a cup of coffee at Glow Coffee Shop, known for its cozy atmosphere, high-quality brews, and stylish setting that perfectly complements the vibrant lifestyle of the neighborhood.



During The Daytime

- Exploring Bangkok's three iconic temples is a wonderful way to experience the city's rich history and culture. Begin with The Grand Palace and the Emerald Buddha (Wat Phra Kaew), a majestic complex that showcases traditional Thai architecture and spiritual significance.
- Just a short walk away is Wat Pho, home to the famous reclining Buddha. Cross the Chao Phraya River to visit Wat Arun (Temple of Dawn) — a striking riverside temple that glows beautifully at sunrise or sunset, reflecting off the water.
- After your temple visits, take a peaceful moment by the river or treat yourself to some delicious local Thai food at one of the nearby eateries.

The tuk-tuk, a classic form of Thai transportation, offers an exciting ride through Bangkok's vibrant streets — especially en route to Chinatown, where the city's energy truly comes alive. Chinatown is a feast for the senses, with bustling markets, irresistible street food, and a rich tapestry of cultural heritage waiting to be explored.
- After soaking in the sights and flavors, head to **Asia Today Bar** to conclude your journey with Traditional Thai Cocktails or **Tep Bar** to unwind with the captivating sounds of live traditional instruments. This modern bar beautifully blends contemporary ambiance with traditional music, offering a truly memorable experience that celebrates both the old and new sides of Thailand.



TEP BAR - Cultural Bar of Thailand

Tep Bar has a real sense of place, with Thai herbal liqueurs, rum and whisky playing key parts in the cocktail menu. There's a mini section dedicated to Thailand's own Phraya Rum – with four drinks each inspired by the elements earth, air, fire and water – and another that's all cocktails made with Mekong Rum, such as the Thong, which blends mango, wild honey, dill, lime and gold leaf. You can also try the local drinks neat, including different varieties of rice wine.

The other unique experience is a combination of Thai Traditional Music with Modern Vibes and Melody.



ASIA TODAY BAR

Asia Today highlights local Thai ingredients by introducing them as a companion to the alcohol in the cocktail creations. Located in Soi Nana, Yaowarat, the bar focuses on mixing rum with local Thai ingredients such as wild chrysanthemum from Chiang Rai or honey from Khao Yai.

The choice to use a fire exit door as its entrance reflects Asia Today's bold attitude. Neon quote signs bathe the venue in red & pink glow. That, and the Pulp Fiction posters and suggestive photos that lined the walls, give the bar a character like none other.

On weekends, Asia Today also opens during the day to serve coffee and coffee-based mocktails. The beans come exclusively from Thai roasteries to support local quality suppliers.
