Fellowship Overview

Commitment

Part-Time Remote Employment

Fellows work for five hours per week to help diverse student populations build industry experiences and prepare for future careers.

Lead Projects for Students

Fellows lead students throughout the year in industry-relevant projects and have autonomy over their schedules when working with students.

Program Length

Fellows are accepted on a rolling basis throughout the year and remain in the program for a minimum of 6 months and up to three years. (An additional three year extension is possible)

Benefits

Immigration Solution

Receive sponsorship for a cap-exempt H-1B work visa and ongoing access to immigration support and guidance.

New Talent Pipeline

Train students with industry knowledge and skills to be future interns or entry level staff at your company.

Leadership Development

Gain experience mentoring and managing student teams on project-based work.

Global Network

Develop relationships with a cohort of international professionals working in your field at high-growth U.S. companies.

Process

Company Nomination

Candidates for the Fellowship are nominated by their full-time employers. OA scheduled a consultation with the employer and interviews qualified candidates.

Eligibility Evaluation

Fellows must have a BA, MA, or PhD in a field related to the work they do at the fulltime employer, 2+ years of work experience, and a demonstrated interest in working with students.

Hiring & Sponsorship

Once a Fellow is accepted into the program, the company signs a contract and the cap-exempt H-1B petition process begins (estimated 6 to 8 weeks).





Fellowship Onboarding Timeline



visa stamp at a U.S. consulate to enter and start employment with OA. Time to appointment varies country to country. Once they enter the U.S. the Full-time employer may file their concurrent visa petition.



Fellows lead industry project challenges with students from U.S. colleges and universities to provide real-world learning experiences and training.







Example Project: Develop a Phylogenetic Tree for an Adeno-Associated Virus

Students participated in a 6 week project with a Fellow from Dyno Tx to build a phylogenetic tree using molecular biology tools such as NCBI, BLAST, EMBL for a given AAV serotype and presented their findings in a report and presentation.
