



If you have a special educational need or disability (and have an EHC Plan or are on the SEND register at your primary school) your parents/carers will be invited to one of our SEND coffee mornings.

This gives them the opportunity to meet the team who will be working with you, to learn about the support available and to ask any questions. This will help us to work with your parents/carers to support you throughout your time at Hope Valley.

Transition day

Thursday 3 July, 9am—3.30pm

You may start transition day by catching the bus to Hope Valley from your village meeting point—the bus driver will be expecting you. You will also catch the bus home after the end of school at 3.30 pm.

During the day, you will experience a variety of taster lessons, meet your new teachers and school staff, have the opportunity to make new friends and explore your new school.

We ask that you:

- Bring a pen and pencil.
- Wear your primary school uniform.
- Wear footwear that is suitable for PE activities.
- Bring a packed lunch (if you are entitled to Free School Meals, you will receive a packed lunch at school).





Mobile phones

You don't need to have a mobile phone at Hope Valley, but we know that you might bring one with you. The rule about your mobile phone, mobile devices and earphones/pods is simple:

Mobile phones should be switched off and in your school bag between 8.55am—3.30pm.

Lessons and subjects

There are five lessons (periods) in each day, each one hour long, as well as a morning break and a lunch break. Each lesson will take place in a different room, with a different teacher. You can use the map to find your way around—or ask if you think you are lost.

You will study a wide range of subjects. Your teachers will teach you in specially equipped classrooms. These include the science laboratories, drama studio, music rooms, gym, design and technology rooms and indoor and outdoor PE facilities.

Uniform

- Navy blue polo shirt with HVC logo.
- Navy blue sweatshirt or hoodie with HVC logo.
- Plain blue or black trousers, knee-length skirt or tailored shorts.
- Flat shoes or trainers.



PE kit

You will always change into PE kit when you have a PE lesson and return to your school uniform when the lesson is over. The kit that you need to have is given opposite. There is lots more information on the website, and also a handy checklist for you or your parents/carers to use.



- PE shirt with HVC logo.
- Black shorts or tracksuit bottoms.
- Plain black warm layer.
- Trainers for indoor use, or on the multi use games area (MUGA).

If you play football/rugby:

- White or black knee-high football/rugby socks.
- Football boots/Astro turf trainers (deep grip).
- Shin pads.
- Gum guard/shield.

You will receive an ATL grade from your


teachers each half term. These will be shared with your parents, and your form tutor will help you to use this information to develop an exceptional attitude to learning.




Facilities
