Please tell me about your visitor experience. It will be my pleasure to send a complimentary official Blackstone Valley t-shirt to five visitors who respond.



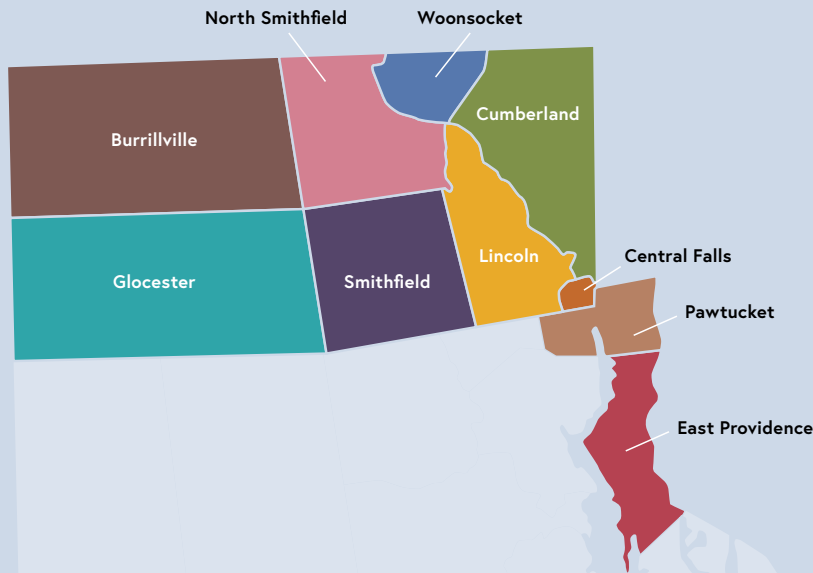

Taste the soul of each country's delicacies whether it's iconic American fare to classic Italian pasta and Colombian pastries to traditional German sausages and Portuguese Caçoila. There's something for every palate and it's a great way to experience the different flavors, ingredients, and influences that combine to make each country's culture and cuisine distinct.

We invite you to venture to any of the spots on our **Blackstone Valley International Food Trail**. You will agree the food alone is worth the trip, but while you're here definitely stay for all the other fun!

DINE IN AFRICA

Get ready for a safari of flavors at the African restaurants in the Blackstone Valley. At **10 Rocks**, known for their Cape Verdean cuisine, you may want to try eggs and chorizo on capucha (a Cape Verdean hash). Also getting great reviews are coconut shrimp, crab cakes and their plantains. Or taste their Calamari de Cabo Verde, which is made with calamari, chorizo, banana peppers, olives and red bell pepper slices. Their yucca fries with horseradish dipping sauce is a must-try.

Favorites at **Taste of Island** include Chicken Mozambique, bistec and blackened salmon. Creole shrimp skewers served with beans and plantains are popular and so is the bread pudding. They also make their chowder in-house and it's a culinary delight that's both familiar for New England but also unique to their Cape Verdean style.

Incred-A-Bowl in East Providence has a delicious Liberian bowl made with Liberian-style spinach, stewed down with onions, peppers, chicken and beef, topped with a plantain. Sounds incredible, right?

At **The Village** you'll enjoy Nigerian specialties and the staff will be very helpful, answering your questions about the food and level of spice in each dish. Jollof rice is very popular. Theirs is mild but you can ask for sauce to turn the heat up a bit. They also serve goat meat and fish, both bone-in and boneless and many of their dishes are cooked in a delicious tomato base.

DINE IN ASIA



Your culinary tour of Asia begins in Vietnam at **Pho Horn's** with authentic pho, the national dish of this country. It's made with slow-simmered broth, typically prepared with beef or chicken, served with rice and a topping. Also popular are their summer rolls served with a tasty peanut sauce.

If you're looking for Indian food, try the Chicken 65 Biryani at **Mehfil**, made with aromatic chicken dum biryani topped with specially curried tender boneless chicken. Locals rave about this authentic restaurant, highlighting their vegetarian options as well as their classic chicken, goat, and fish dishes. One person even said that they could eat Mehfil's Butter Chicken every day for the rest of their life! Make sure to save room for some of their traditional Indian desserts too.

Have you ever had Laotian food? Stop in at **Mom's Home Cooking** in Woonsocket. Their most popular dishes of Laotian national cuisine include sticky rice, larb (a spicy mixture of marinated meat or fish with a mix of herbs, greens and spices), and green papaya salad. These are but a few of the many items on the takeout menu at Mom's.

Becoming more popular in the area is bubble tea, a Taiwanese recipe made by blending tea with milk, fruit and juices, then adding tasty tapioca pearls and shaking vigorously. Try this drink at **Bubble Waffle Cafe**, where you can also enjoy a bubble waffle, a dish that has more sugar and eggs than a European waffle. Have your bubble waffle served as a cone with ice cream or fruit (or both) for an amazing treat!

For a taste of Korean cuisine, stop at **Ming's Asian Street Food** for their Korean Hot Chicken, an extra crispy fried chicken thigh on a fresh, locally-made brioche roll served with pickled carrot/daikon, house bleu cheese, Ming's own Korean hot sauce and scallions.

DINE IN EUROPE



Travel the European continent through food! Relax with a traditional British afternoon tea at **Val's English Tea & Pie Shop!** Sip your tea while enjoying a tiered tray of pastries, sandwiches, customer-favorite scones, and savory sausage rolls. It's an experience fit for royalty as your hostess delights you with stories from her life across the pond!

Continue to Woonsocket for **Ye Olde English Fish & Chips**, serving the city for over 100 years with the original recipe that owner Steve Robinson's great-grandfather brought over from Bradford, England. A unique dish loved by locals and not found anywhere else is their fish cakes, which have two thin slices of potatoes, with fish in the middle and a thicker batter.

For flavors of Italy, **Tavolo Wine Bar & Tuscan Grille** in Smithfield is one of the go-to restaurants for this style of cuisine and their award-winning wine list. A favorite on the menu is the braised pulled beef served over gnocchi or pappardelle with asparagus tips.

Krakow Deli has possibly some of the best pierogies you will find around. Folks travel from far and wide just to stock up on their potato and cabbage pierogies! The shop is full of many Polish specialties and treats, and the owners also offer classes so you can learn to make your own pierogies at home.

NORTH AMERICA

The North American continent offers us a wide variety of cuisines from Canada in the north, through the United States and Mexico, to Central America and some of the islands.

Corn and beans are staples of the cuisine in El Salvador. Local favorites are pupusas which you can try at **Azucena Restaurant**. Choose to follow those with Parrillada Azucena, a traditional grilled dish containing beef, chicken, bacon, shrimp and sausage.

A recipient of a 2024 James Beard nomination for "Best New Restaurant", **Tuxpan Taqueria** is a family-owned shop that offers a taste of their native region in Mexico in every dish. The gordita is their specialty with staff making tortillas by hand every day. Other highlights include their torta, huarache, and pambazo.

Chef Stacy Deetz is well-known for her time on the TV show Top Chef, and now you can dine at her New American Bistro, **Hangry Kitchen**, where she creates some of the best hand-crafted seasonal food and beverages.

And for some traditional Jewish treats, stop in at **Just Like Nana's** for authentic rugelach made by the owner using her nana's recipe. Rugelach is a baked confection traditionally made in the form of a crescent by rolling a triangle of dough around a filling and it is delicious.

There are some hyper-local culinary traditions that come from right here as well. One of the most widely known is "family-style chicken" - a meal that includes endless baked chicken, pasta with marinara, salad, french fries, and rolls. Served on big plates for everyone at your table to share, this meal draws busloads of diners to **Wright's Farm Restaurant** in Burrillville.

Did you know that the state drink, coffee milk - a sweet drink similar to chocolate milk but with coffee syrup instead - was first created here in Lincoln? You can get it today at many places across the state including **New York Lunch** in Woonsocket. While there, try a "Dynamite". This sandwich of ground beef, tomatoes and spices also originates here in Blackstone Valley.

On the other side of the city is **Kay's Restaurant** known for their signature steak sandwich and famous menu on a napkin.

With a story that dates back to the early 1930s, **Stanley's** in Central Falls, started as a flavorful way to feed people during the Great Depression. Today, this restaurant is truly famous for their "Stanleyburgers" and is a landmark in Blackstone Valley.

South American restaurants are some of the most popular culinary venues in RI's Blackstone Valley. You can find mouthwatering Brazilian barbecue at **Minas** in East Providence, with different side dishes and specials each day. Try the traditional feijoada, a stew of black beans with beef and pork.

You can't go wrong with the food or the view at **Shark's Peruvian Cuisine**. Situated on the beautiful Blackstone River, you will experience the freshest and most authentic Peruvian specialties, combining local ingredients and family recipes. Must-try dishes include the Rellena de Pollo (mashed potatoes marinated aji amarillo with a filling of chicken salad, mayonnaise, fresh avocado and black olives), Bistec a la Pobre (deep fried steak topped with chopped onions, tomatoes and cilantro, served with white rice), and Arroz con Mariscos (Peruvian style seafood paella rice).

Next you can travel to Venezuela without packing a suitcase by enjoying a meal at **La Arepa**. The national dish is Pabellon Criollo (shredded beef with black beans) which you can find on their menu, as well as many varieties of arepa dishes (a corncake that is a cross between a tortilla and a pancake, and can have savory or sweet fillings) and cachapa, a thin, sweet corn cake, also served with your choice of many different toppings or fillings.

A very popular Colombian restaurant is **La Casona**, where you can try the traditional dish of Plato Montanero, which is beef, pork, chicken or ground beef with rice, beans, chorizo, fried pork rinds, sweet plantain, corn arepa and egg. A "quick food" favorite is Salchipapas, a mixture of cut potatoes and chopped hot dogs with a choice of sauces.

At **Wildflour Vegan Bakery**, Pawtucket, you'll instantly notice all of the vibrantly-colored foods and drinks populating the cases and shelves. Bright orange sweet potato pudding and rich, chocolatey peanut butter brownies with maple roasted peanuts are some of their sweet offerings - many of which are also gluten-free.

Meanwhile, at **Gingersnaps Bakery** in Lincoln, traditional cinnamon rolls with gooey vanilla cream cheese icing greet you with their sweet scent as you enter the shop. This picturesque bakery has something to satisfy everyone's sweet tooth, including French macarons in many flavors and their decadent stuffed cookies.

Looking for several international favorites? Some popular spots with locals are **La Sorpresa** and **Caprichos Antioqueños Bakery** (Colombian), **Colonial Bakery** and **Matos Bakery** (Portuguese), and **Bachini's Bakery** and **Juliana's Bakery** (Italian).

With their hip atmosphere and tasty drinks, East Providence's beloved **Cafe Zara**, is the perfect stop to caffeinate. Try their RI Iced Latte, which is a double espresso and classic Rhode Island coffee milk, to experience a new twist on a real Rhody favorite.

Or stop by **WeRoast** in Lincoln to experience their adorable shop and full-flavored coffees that they roast on-site. Cold brews and pour overs are a few favorites. They are true coffee lovers that offer excellent customer service and are very willing to share their knowledge with you.

Whether cone or cup, sprinkles or nuts, homemade or extravagant...ice cream is definitely a summertime favorite!

Stop by the chic Airstream trailer that **The Wright Scoop** operates out of at Wright's Dairy Farm in North Smithfield. Known as the only "cow-to-cone" shop in Rhode Island, you're in for some fresh and unique flavors of homemade ice cream.

Ice Cream Machine, across from the Diamond Hill Park in Cumberland, is another tremendously popular shop with dozens upon dozens of homemade choices and prodigious portions.

Have you ever had ice cream nachos? No? Then you need to make your way to **Josie's Ice Cream!** These include creamy soft serve with a topping, their homemade waffle chips, plus a sauce to dip them in. Or you can try some of their delicious homemade hard ice cream.

More than just an ice cream shop, **Sacred Cow** not only features Munroe Dairy's milk and ice cream, but also carries many other locally-made products.

If you're looking for a classic Blackstone Valley meal followed by a sweet treat afterward then **Pound Hill Creamery** is your destination. Grab slow-cooked roast beef or other delicious sandwiches at The Beef Barn, but make sure to save room for a cone or sundae. Sit by the nearby picturesque pond for an even more exceptional summer experience.

Craft drinks are abundant here in our region! Taste these robust flavors at some of the most highly-esteemed breweries, distilleries, and wineries around.

With four breweries and four distilleries within its boundaries, Pawtucket is definitely the craft drink capital of Rhode Island. The city has both the largest brewery (**The Guild**) and smallest brewery (**Crooked Current Brewery**) in the Ocean State!

Blackstone Valley's two other cities are also home to some amazing craft beer. Make a stop at **Crook Point Brewing Company** in East Providence which features both modern and traditional styles of beer and is known for their stouts and ales. Heading North to the City of Woonsocket you'll find **Lops Brewing**. This unassuming nanobrewery loves to be creative and use locally-sourced products for their beers.

Heading into our region's towns, you'll find the veteran-owned **Bravo Brewing Company** in Burrillville. The town of Cumberland has two breweries. **Ravenous Brewing Company** which was the first brewery to open in Northern Rhode Island back in 2012. Their batches of beer are forged by hand and truly qualify as handcrafted, artisan ales. **Phantom Farms Brewing** opened their doors in 2024 paying homage to the former mill building they call home with their "Berkeley American Stout." Another must-try is their hard cider made using apples grown on their farm just 4 miles away.

Also hidden away in the rural part of Blackstone Valley you'll come to our region's vineyards. Come for a relaxed picnic on the front porch of **Diamond Hill Vineyards** in Cumberland. Be refreshed by their unique fruit and grape wines as you unwind under the shady forest canopy. Pinot Noir, blackberry, cranberry apple, and blueberry are only a few of the offerings produced on the winery's beautiful and historic 220-year-old grounds. On the other side of The Valley in the quaint town of Glocester is **Mulberry Vineyards**, a 40-acre vineyard on the historical Andrew Brown homestead known for their wines, ciders, and seasonal beers.

Grab a pint and enjoy live music as you shop tables of fresh fruit, veggies, and local goods during the summer season.

In rural Blackstone Valley, behold the bounty of **Burrillville Farmers' Market**! This open-air summer market is running every Saturday morning from June - September and offers multiple fresh produce vendors, local artists, baked goods, and other wholesome and hand-crafted treats. The high standards every Rhode Island farmers' market has guarantees you only get the freshest Rhody items.

Adams Farm on the edge of northeastern Rhode Island is a splendid agricultural attraction. They have a great farmstand but are even more known for their wonderful family-friendly activities. Come pet their farm animals or immerse yourself in their other seasonal activities.

In Glocester, the beautiful barn at **The Farm** welcomes you to peruse organic produce, fresh-cut flowers, and baked goods every Wednesday and Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. They also carry other locally-sourced meat, fruit and dairy products.

Finally, if you're here in the fall, take a trip out to Smithfield - also known as Rhode Island's Apple Valley - to go apple picking. **Jaswell's Farm** has a variety of pick-your-own fruits and a farmstand featuring delectable homemade desserts that are sure to please. Another real gem is the small 6-acre, family-owned **Leach Farm**. They still water their orchard by hand and take real pride in the selection of apple varieties they offer. Take your time wandering through the orchards, feeling the peaceful fall breeze, and munching on the different varieties of apples.

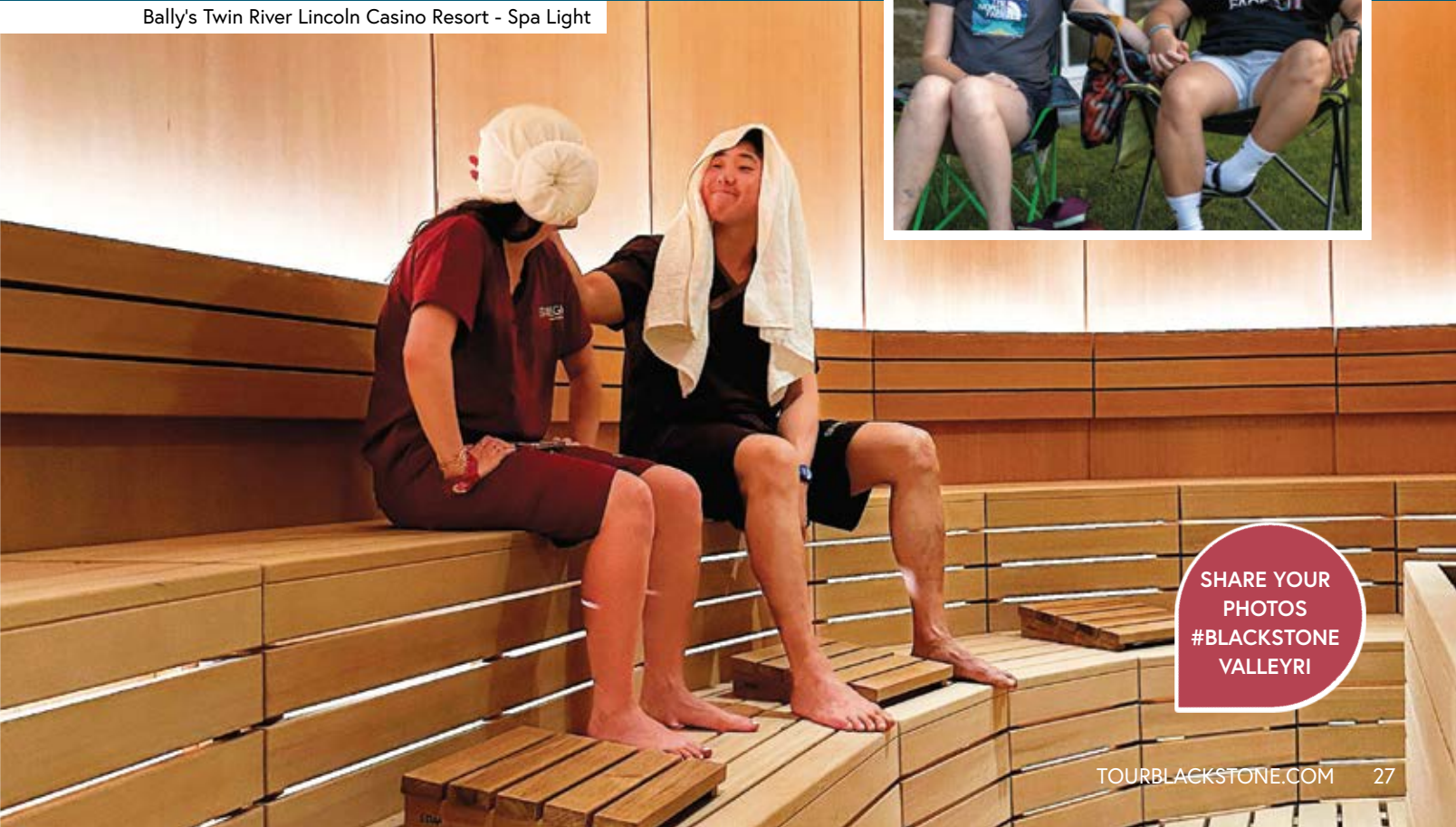

TOUR THROUGH HISTORY

Start your tour with breakfast at the first diner in the United States to be recognized on the National Register of Historic Places, **Modern Diner** in Pawtucket. Everything on the menu is wonderful but you may want to try their Custard French Toast since The Food Network named it the "best diner dish in the country!"

Then head $\frac{3}{4}$ mile down the street to the **Blackstone Valley Visitor Center** to learn more about the history of the region and view a short film, "Hidden in the Blackstone Valley." Stroll directly across the street for a free tour of **Slater Mill**, birthplace of the American Industrial Revolution, with a National Park Ranger.

Located between the Blackstone River and the Blackstone Canal in Lincoln (also part of the National Park), is **The Kelly House Museum**, where you can learn the history of early transportation in the Blackstone Valley.

Stop for lunch at **The Lodge Pub**, located on Lincoln's Great Road - one of the oldest thoroughfares in the country. Along the way you'll see sites such as **Hearthside House**, the **Eleazer Arnold House**, **Moffett Mill**, **Hannaway Blacksmith Shop** and more!

Continue your historic journey in Woonsocket for a visit to **The Museum of Work & Culture**. Through engaging exhibits you'll learn stories of the French-Canadian immigrants who left their farms in Quebec starting in the mid-1800s to come work in the growing number of mills around Blackstone Valley.

Veterans Memorial Museum



While in Woonsocket, learn how we honor military veterans and preserve their history. The **Veterans Memorial Museum** is home to one of the largest collections of veterans-associated artifacts in Rhode Island featuring pieces from the Revolutionary War all the way to our current military.

End your busy day in Woonsocket with a meal at **Chan's** or **Ye Olde English Fish & Chips**, which have both been open for over 100 years. You can also take a short drive to Gloucester to dine at **Tavern On Main** which has a long history that dates back all the way to the early 1700s.

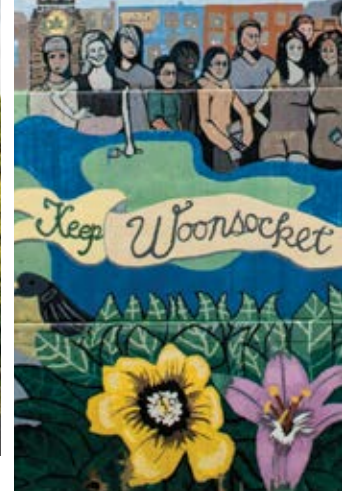

IN THE MOVIES

Did you know that several movies were shot at locations in Rhode Island's Blackstone Valley or were even the inspiration for famous films?

"**Hocus Pocus 2**" starring Bette Midler, Sarah Jessica Parker and Kathy Najimy was filmed here. In East Providence you can see the centuries-old **Newman Cemetery** and **Newman Congregational Church**, both featured in scenes when "Billy" makes his comeback. The church is recognized for its belfry with Greek Revival corner pilasters and corner and central pinnacles, which are both featured.

Much of "**Hachi: A Dog's Tale**" starring Richard Gere, was filmed at the historic **Woonsocket Train Depot**. Stop by to see the exterior of this beautiful brick building and also the statue of Hachiko, the dog this fabled story is about. This is a popular tourist stop, especially for animal lovers looking to grab a picture with one of the world's most loyal dogs.

Woonsocket's Main Street was used to depict the streets of Washington, D.C. in "**The Purge: Election**". A scene at 162 Main Street shows a mural that normally reads "Keep Woonsocket Beautiful" but was transformed into "Keep Washington Beautiful." The mural is still there but transformed back to its original form. On the other side of downtown Woonsocket, **St. Ann Arts and Cultural Center** was used as Our Lady of Sorrows, the site of the purge mass.

Keeping with horror films, "**The Conjuring**" movie universe was inspired by a house in Burrillville that was the actual home of the Perron family hauntings. Stop by for a house tour or paranormal investigation of this famed ghostly residence. They sell out quickly so book in advance.

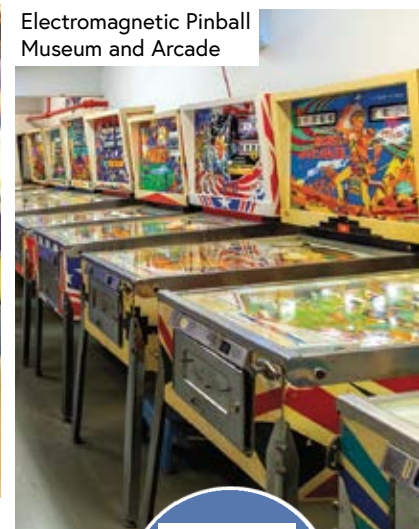

In East Providence, there are several other locations for extraordinary amusement. Sixty-two beautifully hand-carved figures and four fanciful chariots await you at the **Crescent Park Carousel**. This ride dates all the way back to 1895, and it's the largest and most elaborate work of Charles Looff - one of the world's most famed carousel designers. Across the city is **United Skates of America** where roller skating, laser tag, an arcade and rock climbing wall all come together under one roof. Check their schedule for "all-you-can-eat pizza night" so you can skate a lap and then grab a slice.

For a leisurely outdoor experience **The Monastery** in Cumberland is ideal. Several miles of flat trails circle the property, and there are plenty of opportunities to explore nature. In addition to a playground, the property is also the home of Cumberland's Public Library that has a very large children's section.

Furthermore, **Lincoln Woods State Park** is renowned for its beauty and ample recreation opportunities. Just minutes from our state's capital city is essentially a one-stop-shop for anyone looking for the challenge of bouldering, hiking and mountain biking along a variety of exhilarating trails, jogging the hilly loop road, or simply relaxing with the family at their free freshwater beach and enjoying a picnic.

Bring a bike with you or rent one from **Blackstone Bicycles** because the **Blackstone River Bikeway** is the perfect off-road path to see much of the region. And we can't forget about **Rhody Rug** and **Blackstone Quilting Company** which are both keeping our region's history in textiles alive. There are only a handful of buildings within the 200-acre **Slater Memorial Park** with one of them being the **JC Potter Casino Building**. This historic lakeside "boathouse", is now home to **RIWS'** art gallery, library and studio space that is adorned with gorgeous watermedia and open free to the public Thursday - Sunday from 10:00am - 4:00pm. This group is one of the oldest watercolor organizations in America and it's spectacular to see the work they present.

As you're traveling around RI's Blackstone Valley, look for the **large murals and breathtaking sculptures** interlaced in our urban landscape. Some favorites include Pawtucket's colorful **3,000 square foot mural** by artists **Gera Lozano and Werc Alvarez** that features much of what has made this city great over the years at 55 Pleasant Street, and the grand sculpture garden at the rear of the **Lorraine Mills Complex**, also in the city.

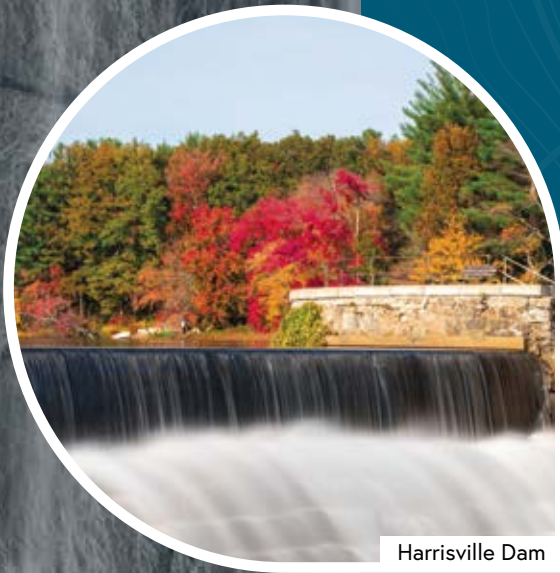

For avid birders, over 2,000 acres of woodlands, deciduous forest, and farmlands at **Buck Hill** in Burrillville, has the perfect mix of edge habitat and maintained wetlands to attract a wide variety of local and migratory bird species. This meticulously-maintained management area is the perfect habitat for wood ducks with nesting boxes lining small ponds. Gloucester's **Hawkins Pond** is a landscape that looks as if it's been in existence since the dawn of time, but has been heavily influenced by human hands. The mill pond and surrounding old-growth pine forest provides habitat to support water and forest fowl alike, including heron, warblers and thrushes. In Smithfield, **Powder Mill Ledges Wildlife Refuge** houses the headquarters of the Audubon Society of Rhode Island, where you are sure to get plenty of tips about birding, wildlife identification, and educational programming. Back in Gloucester, **Sprague Farm** and the abutting **Robert Huckins Woodland**, were once a farm, but is now a lush woodland with ferns lining the forest floor. Various species of woodpeckers, owls, and other birds call this protected land their home.

Each hole has 2 tee pads and 2 baskets so it's perfect for any skill level. If you don't have discs, just head to the Park Office off of Armistice Boulevard to grab some loaners.

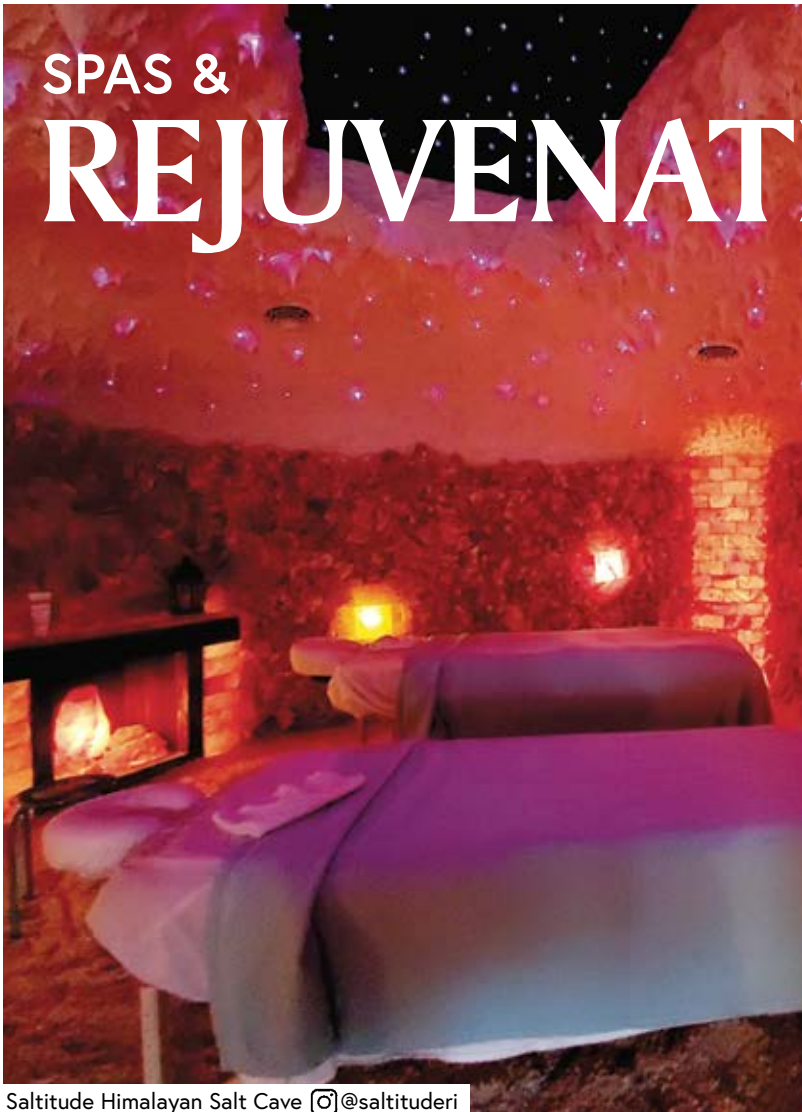
For indoor and outdoor golf you've got to head a bit north to the towns of Lincoln and Burrillville. The appropriately named **Inside Links** is the perfect spot to virtually play some of the most popular courses around the world. beautiful weather will surely call you outside and RI's northwesternmost town has two wonderful golf courses. **Crystal Lake Golf Club** and **Country View Golf Club**, both par 70s, are a splendid mix of demanding holes yet the courses are still accessible and fun for sporadic players.

And you'll definitely want to hit the **Higginson Complex** in Lincoln for an array of exciting indoor challenges. **Rock Spot** has over 100 climbing rope routes and multiple boulders, **KR Baseball Academy** has numerous batting cages, or you can play archery tag and other family-friendly shooting sports at **BattlegroundZ**. Visit the marquee destination - **R1 Indoor Karting Entertainment Center** - to experience speed and use your mental skill at the highest levels.

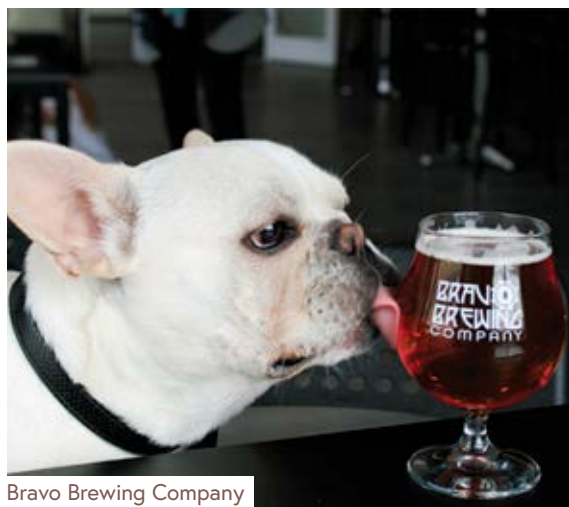


Harrisville is the central village in town, and the preservation that's taken place there has earned it a spot on the National Register of Historic Places. The trailblazer for this was Austin T. Levy, a textile industrialist and pioneer of paid vacations and profit sharing with workers. Back in the 1930s he funded a coordinated village beautification campaign to create a model American town, and you can still see this work today. The village hub has a gorgeous waterfall prime for social media captures, delicious restaurants, a weekly farmers market throughout the summer, and the historic **Assembly Theatre** that hosts dozens of events each year.

The adjacent village of **Pascoag** is connected by an easily traversed bike path making for a pleasurable experience as you wander. **Granite Mill Park** and **White Mill Park** are two must-see places to take in the tranquil beauty of this village. Also, visit the **Pascoag Riverwalk** and take a break at the nearby **Cow's Tail Deli & Creamery**. And fans of H.P. Lovecraft will note that Pascoag is one of the settings for his book, "The Horror of Red Hook" written in 1925.

The rough terrain and scenic beauty can't be beat here, and we recommend visiting **Black Hut** or **Buck Hill** Management Areas for thousands of acres of wonderful forest, wetlands and agricultural land...just make sure to wear some orange during hunting season.

Speaking of that, **Addieville East Farm** offers pheasant hunting, sporting clays, fly fishing, and trout ponds for the avid sportsperson. This is quite a popular spot, so much so that we've even heard some New England Patriots players visit here from time to time.

Burrillville also hosts some highly-regarded places to grab a bite including the sibling-run **Mapleville Farm Bakery**. They specialize in fresh-baked breads and pastries made with their own seasonal produce. Across town is the famous **Wright's Farm Restaurant** known for their "family-style chicken dinners" - a Blackstone Valley favorite. Wright's also has the largest gift shop in the area that is chock full of local Rhode Island items.

With so much to do, plan to spend a weekend in Burrillville and book a stay at **Grace Note Farm** in Pascoag. This historic 1700s homestead offers farmstays with pure New England appeal, adorable animals to spend time with, and access to hiking and horseback riding trails.

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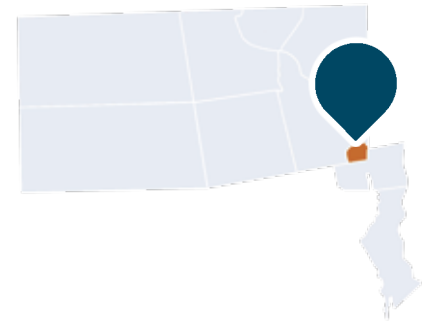


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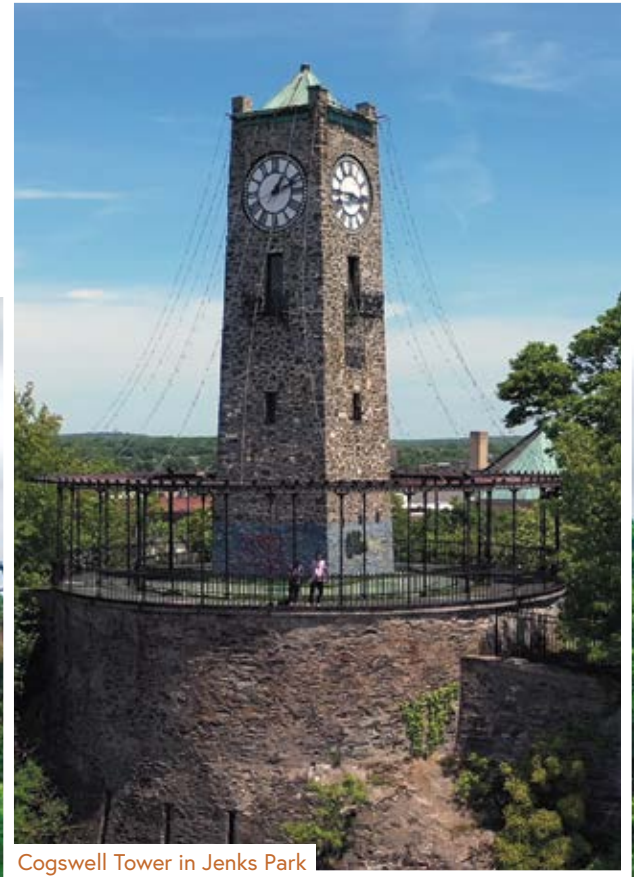

WELCOME TO CENTRAL FALLS



With a population of over 22,000 people and an area of just 1.29 square miles, Central Falls is one of the most densely-populated cities in the country. The majority of the first settlers to this area were Quakers. Following that, a diverse immigrant population of Scottish, Irish, French-Canadian, Polish and Portuguese to today's primarily Hispanic community call this place home.

With this, a plethora of flavors arrived making Central Falls a mecca for foodies. The city has dozens of authentic restaurants for you to choose from, including **El Paiza** (Colombian), **Beirão** (Portuguese), **El Paso** (Mexican), and **Costa Del Sol** (Salvadoran) only to name just a few. There are also many bakeries that line the main passages of Dexter Street and Broad Street across this pedestrian-friendly city.

At one end of Broad Street is **Central Falls Landing** - a destination situated along the Blackstone River that's full of activity and al fresco dining. The Landing, as it's referred to, boasts **Shark's Peruvian Cuisine** and **Royal Fried Chicken**; as well as **Explorer River Tours**, overnight stays on the **Samuel Slater Canal Boat**, and **kayak group tours** to get out and explore this intriguing heritage river.

In the late 1700s the town was interestingly enough known as "Chocolateville" because the smell of roasting cacao

beans from the William Wheat Chocolate Mill spread throughout the area. This mill was one of America's earliest water-powered chocolate manufacturing facilities, and it used the "middle" dam in the area for power, hence the renaming to Central Falls in the 1820s.

On the site of the mill today, you can visit the **Chocolate Mill Overlook Park** to enjoy the flow of the mighty Blackstone River and the natural surroundings that include cherry trees, RI's largest cottonwood tree, steps to the water's edge to view the beautiful historic stone bridge, and interpretive panels that tell the story of early-American chocolate.

The centerpiece of Central Falls is **Cogswell Tower** in Jenks Park. The 70-foot tower and observation deck provide a breathtaking 360-degree overlook of the region. Right next door to the park is **Viola Davis Way** named in honor of the city's most famous native resident who has achieved an EGOT (Emmy, Grammy, Oscar and Tony Award winner), making her only the 18th person to reach this esteemed status.

Cumberland has a diverse landscape that is home to large hills, rustic farmlands, and several mill villages that developed during the Industrial Revolution, including Ashton, Lonsdale, Albion, and Valley Falls.

The northern part of Cumberland is rural with farms the whole family will enjoy. **Adams Farm** in the northeastern-most part of Rhode Island is tucked away behind the impressive Diamond Hill Reservoir. They offer fun all year long with tulips and farm animal petting in the spring, a farmstand in the summer, and pumpkin patch and corn maze in the fall. **Phantom Farms** is another popular spot for their apple picking, exquisite bakery, and a gift shop stocked with local items. Also, check out their craft brewery, **Phantom Farms Brewing**, in the village of Berkeley that uses fruit from the farm in some of their tasty offerings.

Across the street from Phantom Farms is **Diamond Hill Vineyards**. Stop by for a sampling flight of handcrafted grape and fruit wines in their cozy 200-year-old vineyard house.

Not too far from the vineyards is **Diamond Hill Park**, one of Cumberland's true gems. This former ski area is now renowned for downhill mountain biking and sledding. The park is also used for large music and entertainment festivals.

Mercy Woods Preserve is just around the corner from here and a wonderful place to hike. Interestingly enough, combined with Cumberland's other nature destination, **The Monastery**, you can find over 1,000 plant, animal, insect, and bird species!

Another thing you may not know is Cumberland is the unofficial ice cream capital of Blackstone Valley. We say this because almost half of the numerous ice cream shops you can find around our region are right here in Cumberland. Some favorites to check out include **Ice Cream Machine**, **The Keep**, and **Josie's**... just to name a few.

A fun fact for mineral enthusiasts is that Cumberland has the only large deposit of a rare iron-rich mineral. "**Cumberlandite**," as it's known, is the state rock of Rhode Island.

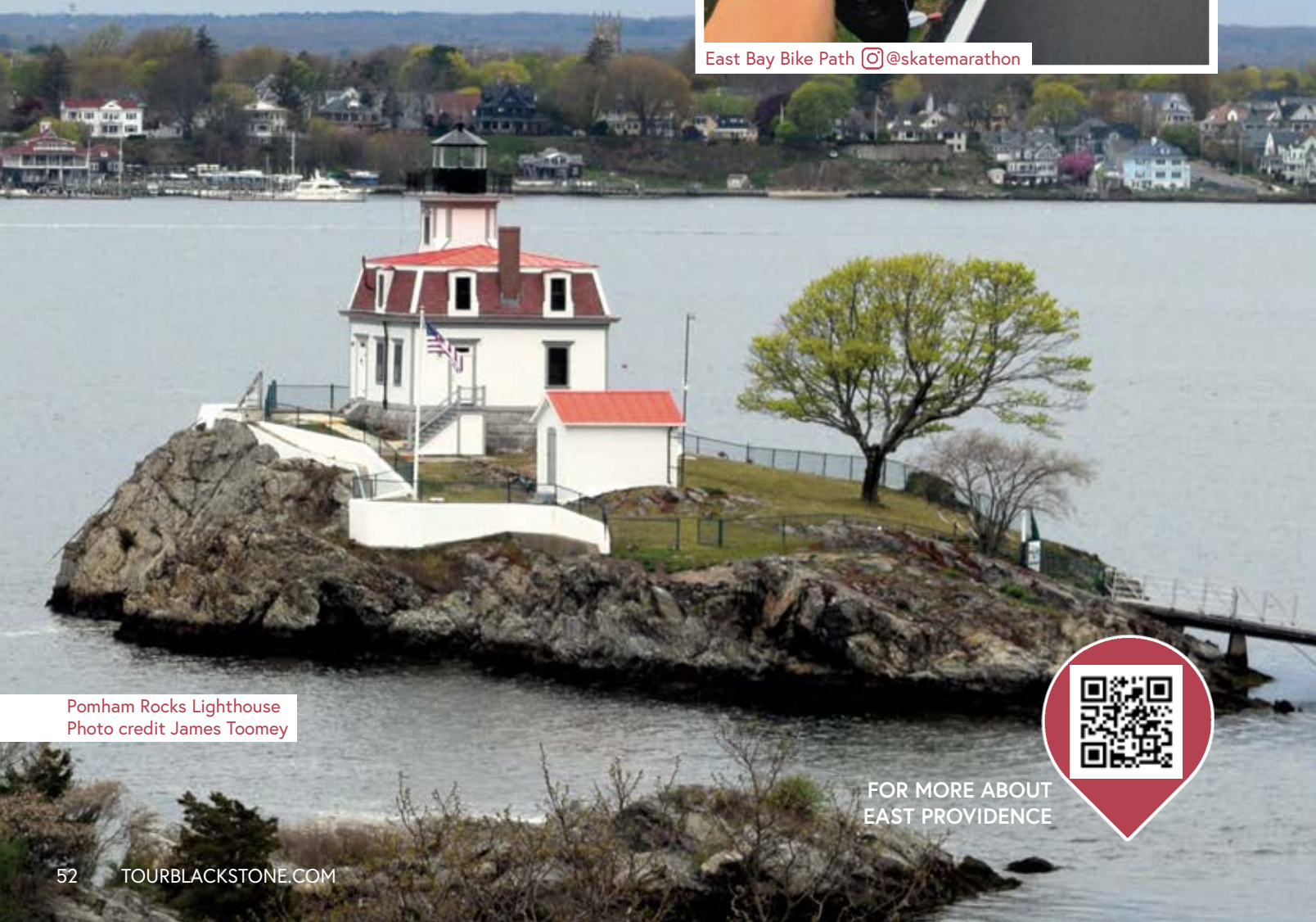


East Providence is a city rooted in culture. This area is part of the ancestral seat of the Pokanoket Nation called Sowams (the South Country) and the first settlement of Roger Williams in the Phillipsdale section at Omega Pond along the Seekonk River.

The historic 1895 **Loeff Carousel** is all that remains of the famous **Crescent Park** amusement park in Riverside, once promoted as "The Coney Island of New England." The restored carousel is open to the public from spring through fall and still provides an opportunity to catch the brass ring. Across the street from the carousel are stupendous views of Narragansett Bay.

Riverside Square is a great place to stop on the **East Bay Bike Path** and experience a freshly-roasted, flavorful cup of coffee at **Borealis Coffee Company**. The whimsical bunny sculptures, Uni, Wheelie and Racer, are a great draw for families. Just a short walk on the bike path south of Riverside Square, spectacular views of the historic **Pomham Rocks Lighthouse** await you!

And who can forget growing up with Rumford Baking Powder in the kitchen! Our next village, Rumford, still has links to food and home cooking at **Avenue N American Kitchen** and **The Pantry**. Owned and managed by Rhode Island culinary personality Nick Rabar, you will be treated to an amazing menu of locally-sourced food.

In addition to the **East Bay Bike Path**, the **Ten Mile Bike Path** connects East Providence to Pawtucket and is a great resource for wildlife watching at James Turner Reservoir. Visit the **John Hunt House Museum** and **Hunt's Mills Dam** in spring to watch the river herring climb the fish ladders over the dam or view the beautiful gardens on the grounds.

If you are interested in boating and maybe shipwrecks, East Providence is home to one of the largest ship graveyards at **Green Jacket Shoals** at the junction of the Providence and Seekonk Rivers.

The city is also a destination for authentic culture, food and arts influenced by Cape Verdean and Portuguese immigrants who settled here. Festivals held throughout the year include the **Portuguese Feasts** during June and July, and **The Loeff Arts Festival** and **Rhode Island Folk Festival** in August. Bring a picnic lunch and enjoy the views while listening to music flow where the river meets the bay.

Antiquing is synonymous with Glocester. The quaint village of **Chepachet** is one of the first villages in Rhode Island to be placed on the National Historic Register. Here you can visit the oldest continuously-operating country store in America, **Brown & Hopkins Country Store**, and the shopping doesn't stop there. Spend the day browsing the many **antique shops** along the easily walkable Putnam Pike for collectible items as well as unique art finds.

As you mosey around, grab a bite to eat at **DePetrillo's Pizza & Bakery**. This small shop is full of flavor including their popular Rhode Island red pizza strips (also known as party pizza or bakery pizza), plus calzones, hot slices and more.

If you're looking for a sitdown meal and possibly a scare, stop by **Tavern on Main**. Originally built in the early 1700s, this building has had several uses over the years. Today it's a well-known family restaurant and it's thought to be haunted. Stop in during your visit for some of their seafood and pasta specialties.

Exploring outside this hub of shopping and dining, you'll find more than a dozen hiking sites managed by the **Glocester Land Trust** as well as the **George Washington Management Area** and **Pulaski State Park**.

Bring your tents as there are a couple of options to camp along **Bowdish Lake** and enjoy a Gloucester getaway. We recommend a walk around **Hawkins Pond** and **Steere Hill Farm**, but each hiking site definitely has its own character and all are worth exploring.

For something different, head over to the village of Harmony to board the small-scale train at **Harmony Products and Railway** for a beautiful half-mile ride through their picturesque property or bring your clubs to hit the links at **Melody Hill Country Club**.

Gloucester also does an amazing job celebrating holidays, so if you find yourself in the area in October, make a point to see the annual **Scarecrow Festival**. Do some **Candlelight Shopping** in December or enjoy one of the most unique parades you'll ever see on July Fourth at the town's annual **Ancients & Horribles Parade**.



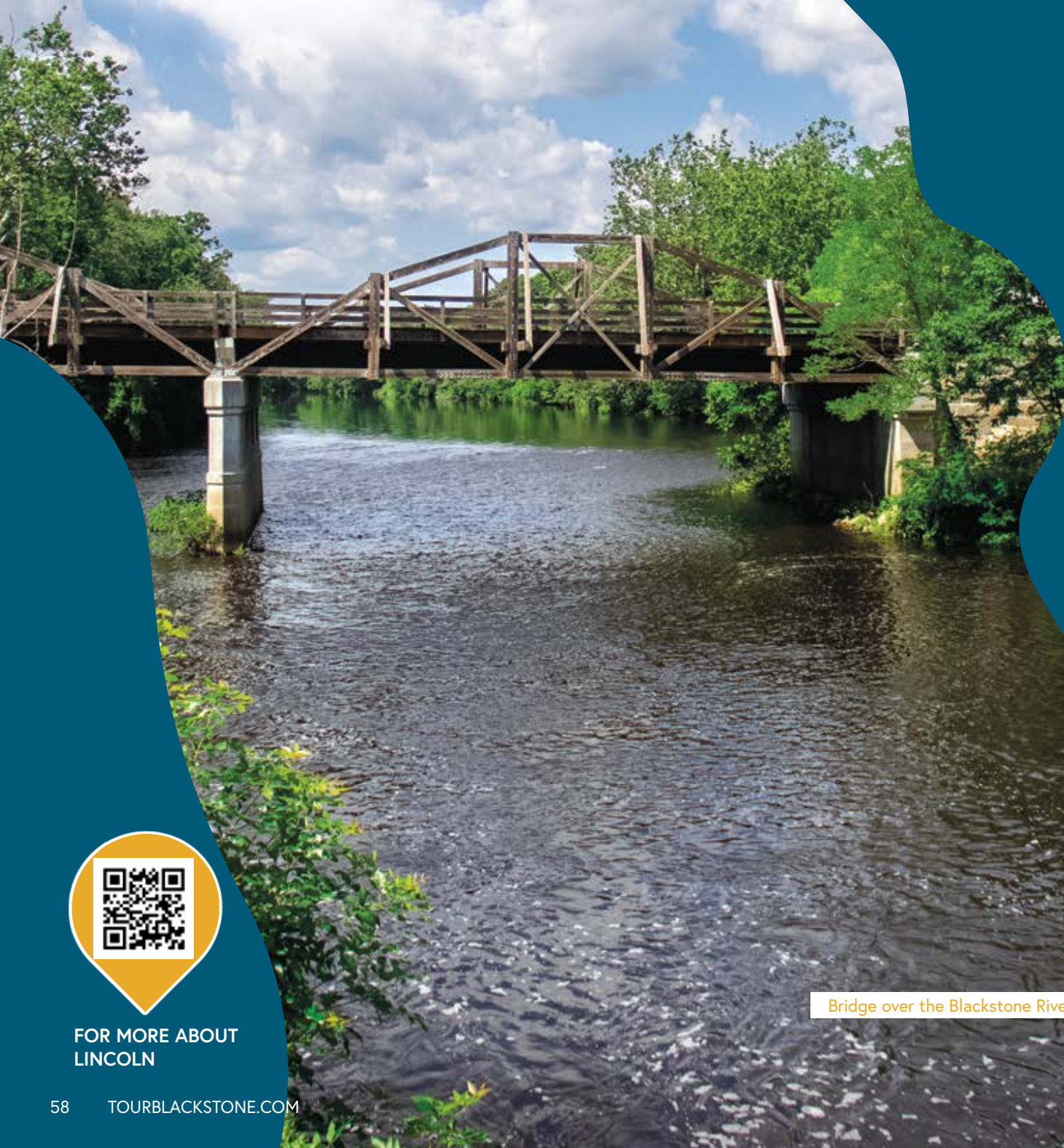

Historic tourism enthusiasts will love traversing one of the country's oldest thoroughfares, **Great Road**. This scenic byway travels three miles through three centuries. Start your trip at **Hearthsides House Museum** to be fascinated by this unique 1800s stone mansion. Then make your way around the nearby **Great Road Heritage Campus** to be enthralled by rare "stonender" homes, a Quaker meeting house, blacksmithing shop, a one-room schoolhouse and an old wooden mill that's frozen in time. Take a stroll along the **Lonsdale Gateway Trail** around this area to take it all in.

Along Great Road is **Lincoln Woods** - often referred to as "Rhode Island's Best State Park." Here you can enjoy numerous outdoor adventures, from bouldering and kayaking to fishing, hiking, mountain biking, and even horseback riding, thanks to **Sunset Stables**.

The park's focal point is **Olney Pond** which is popular with families for fresh water swimming and relaxing on summer days, as well as ice fishing during winter months.

Just 10 minutes north of Great Road is **The Aust Family Preserve**, "a flagship preserve of The Nature Conservancy." The lime rock that can be found in this area led to one of the earliest mining operations that dates back to the 1660s and a booming economy for this village. The Preserve fortunately avoided development, which allows for the vibrant forest with bountiful wildflowers and old growth trees you can see today.

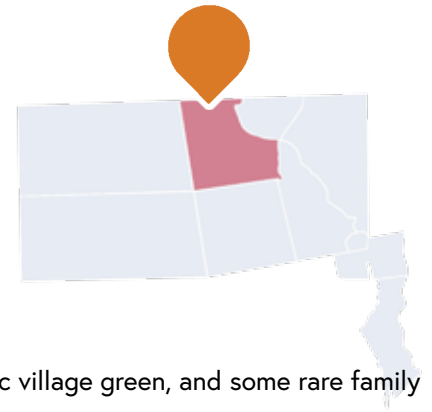

Across the street is Slatersville's quaint village green complete with a row of historic homes and a quintessential New England church, **Slatersville Congregational Church**.

This easy to get to yet secluded farm is run by Master Gardener, Ruth Pacheco, who is over 90 years old and has decades of experience growing gorgeous flowers and other wonderful plants. Take a relaxing stroll around the grounds and pick up an item or two from their farmstand.

For lunch, swing by **Beef Barn**. In operation since 1969, they slow cook their beef for 8 hours on-site and serve it fresh to you. The prices are great on everything they have to offer, and one thing you can't miss is that the restaurant looks just like a barn decked out with classic antiques, an amusing chicken coop room, and full-size silo that literally came from their family farm.

Families visiting North Smithfield will appreciate the opportunity to visit **Wright's Dairy Farm & Bakery**, a family-run farm that's been in operation since 1914. Their bakery has an incredible selection of delectable homemade pastries and desserts. And, from late spring to early fall, taste what they mean by "cow-to-cone" at **The Wright Scoop**. Their renovated Streamline trailer offers up some of the best fresh-made ice cream you can find. Don't miss a viewing of their cows being milked daily from 3:00pm - 4:30pm!

Later you can head to **Rustic Tri-View Drive-In** for a couple of movies. We invite you to enjoy this brand of nostalgic family-fun during your visit, as Rustic is one of only two remaining drive-ins in Rhode Island. They simultaneously run multiple screens of current movies and charge by the carload so it's definitely an affordable way to spend an evening.

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
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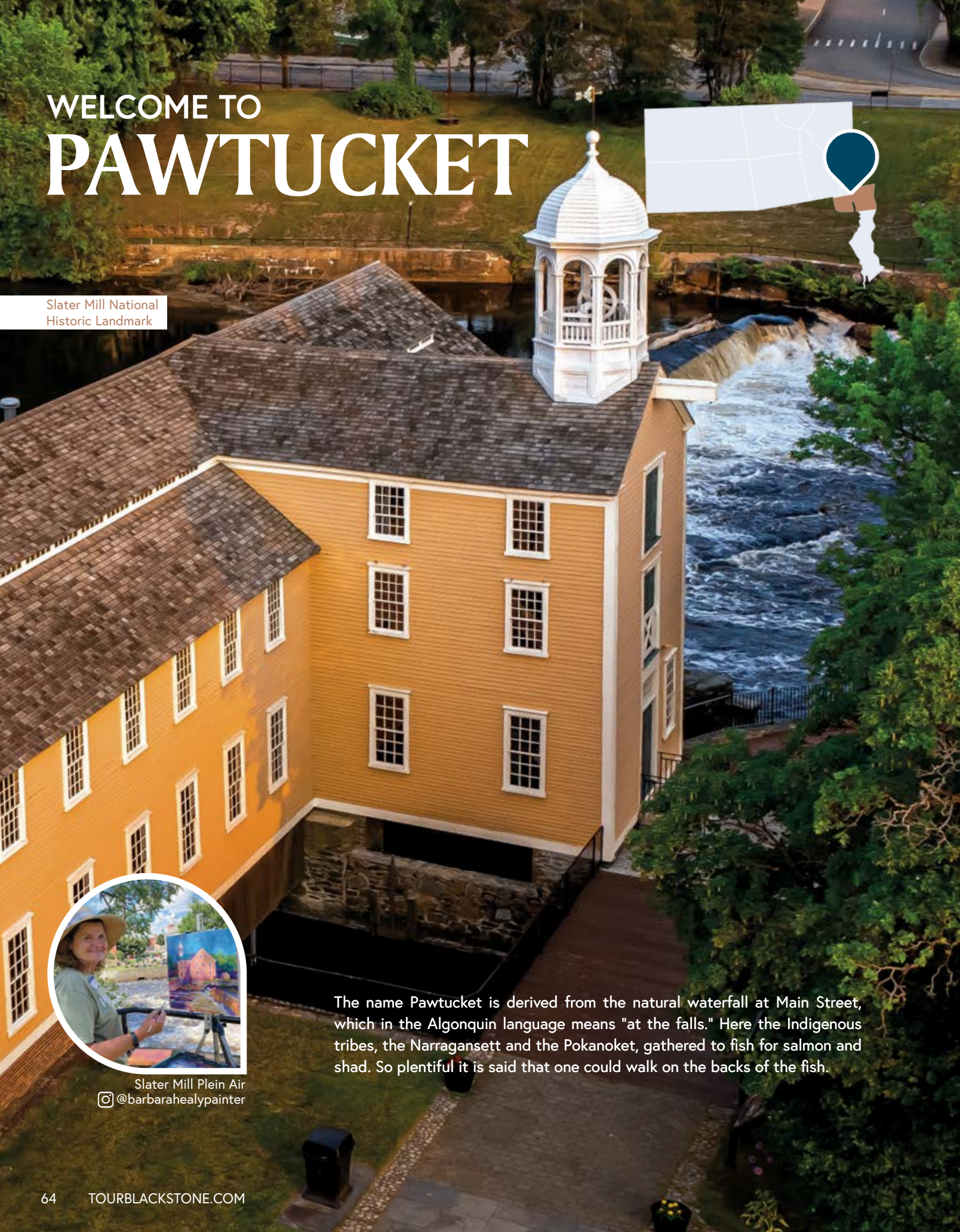

The name Pawtucket is derived from the natural waterfall at Main Street, which in the Algonquin language means "at the falls." Here the Indigenous tribes, the Narragansett and the Pokanoket, gathered to fish for salmon and shad. So plentiful it is said that one could walk on the backs of the fish.

Pawtucket has been a center for innovation through the centuries. The birthplace of the American Industrial Revolution, it was here that Samuel Slater, an English millwright, harnessed the power of the Blackstone River to establish the first successful cotton spinning mill in America back in 1793. We invite you to view the machines and learn more of our country's textile history at **Slater Mill National Historical Landmark**.

Today, this city is a popular hub for artists. Several of the former mills have found new life as artist lofts, studios, unique gift shops, and artisan markets. A prime example is **Hope Artiste Village** which boasts dozens of maker shops, entertainment venues, and the **Rhode Island Music Hall of Fame**.

Speaking of entertainment, the city is proud to be home to several theaters including **Mixed Magic Theatre**, known for the diversity of ideas they bring to the stage, and one of the oldest theater companies in New England, **The Community Players**.

What has put Pawtucket on the map these days is the flourishing craft beer and spirits scene.

Within the city limits there is both the largest brewery in the state, **The Guild**, as well as the smallest, **Crooked Current**, plus **Foolproof Brewing** and **Smug Brewery** that are both special in their own right. That's not to mention the beloved distilleries - **Rhode Island Spirits**, **White Dog Distilling**, **Working Man Distillers**, and **Dark Outpost Distilling** - that continue to create some of the best and most unique gins, vodkas, rums, and whiskeys you'll find around.

The perfect place to explore with your family is **Slater Park**, which includes a historic carousel, gorgeous biking and walking paths, a disc golf course, playground, farm animals, and **Len's Hotdog, Ice Cream, & Seafood Haven** to satisfy that summertime craving.

Smithfield is also a town within both the Blackstone River Watershed and the Woonasquatucket River Watershed. It is a town known for its farmland and natural beauty including conservation areas, cascading brooks, waterfalls and ponds.

For many people, Smithfield is synonymous with the section of town referred to as "Apple Valley." Home to over a half-dozen orchards, a visit in autumn when the apples are ripe for picking is one of the best times to visit. Fall is not the only time to visit though. Many of the farms also have summer fruits, vegetables, and berries.

Jaswell's Farm is the oldest operating orchard in Smithfield. Following an afternoon of picking your own apples or pumpkins, you have to try their fresh made pies, bakery items and apple cider donuts! **Appleland Orchard** is also a popular spot that offers many different apple varieties, plus a farmstand with cider, sweet treats, and even their own line of apple wine. You can easily spend the day meandering around the area's country roads looking for autumnal foliage and stop by any number of farms and roadside stands.

In addition to these beloved orchards, Smithfield is home to the headquarters of the **Audubon Society of Rhode Island**. They manage **Powder Mill Ledges**, a 100-acre wildlife refuge that's ideal for birding with miles of easy/moderate trails. **Mowry Conservation Area** is a great place to bring kids due to the easy trails and picnic area you'll find here, plus a very interesting rock outcropping. But if you're looking for more of a challenge, **Wolf Hill Forest Preserve** will get some elevation into your legs, especially if you make it to **Mercer Overlook** for views of the Providence skyline on clear days.

Since it's Blackstone Valley there's obviously some cool history here as well. **Smith-Appleby House** is open every 1st Sunday of the month for tours of this early-18th century home. If you find yourself in the area on a different day, you can still stroll the property that sits near the scenic **Georgiaville Pond**. With its beautifully laid out landscaped grounds of lilac trees and daffodils with a brook flowing nearby, this is a splendid place to stop in springtime.

If you're into collegiate sports, the prestigious **Bryant University** has its campus here so check their schedule to catch some Division I action. And don't worry about the time you spend in town, as there are several hotel options perfect for any budget right nearby.

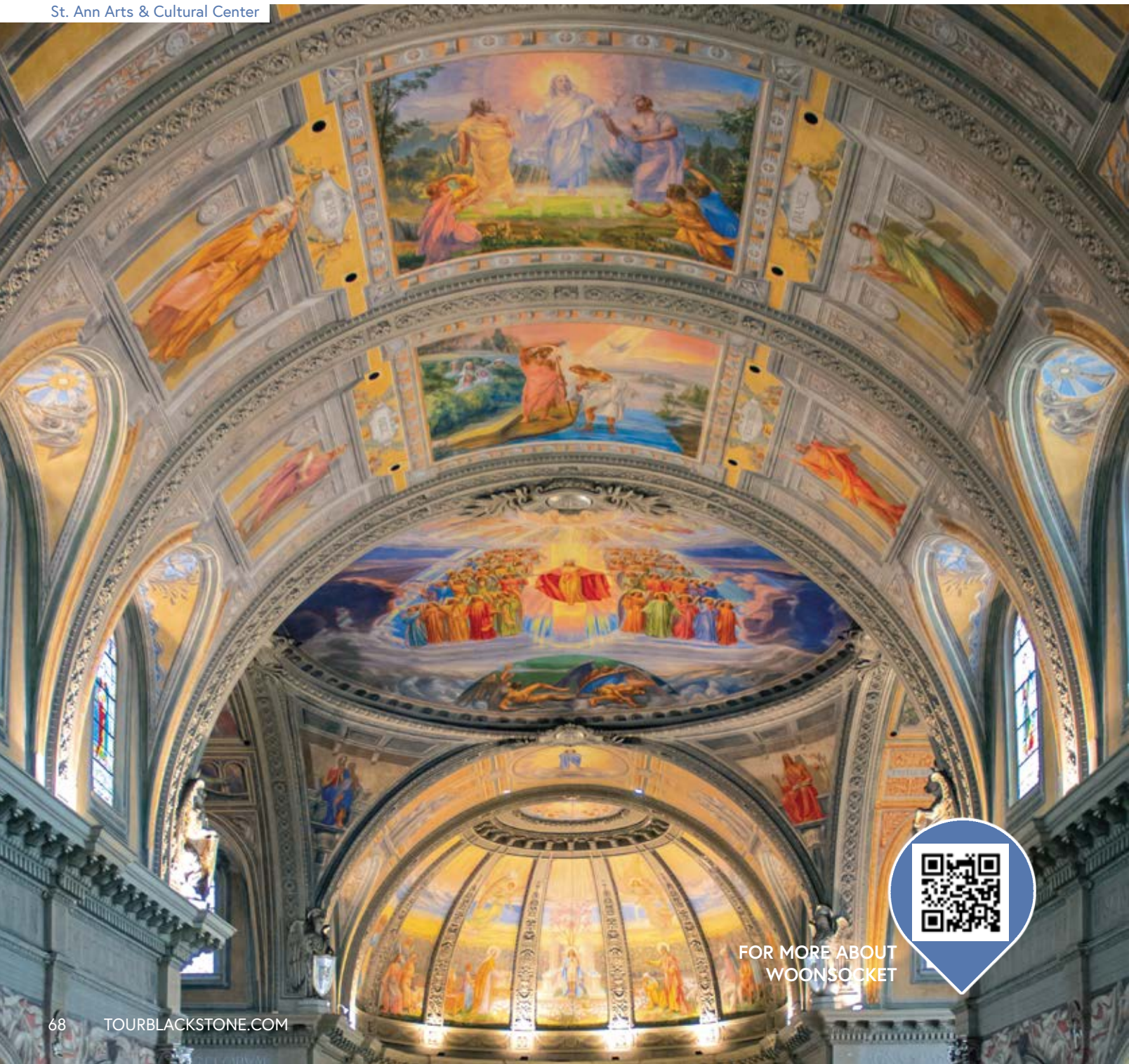

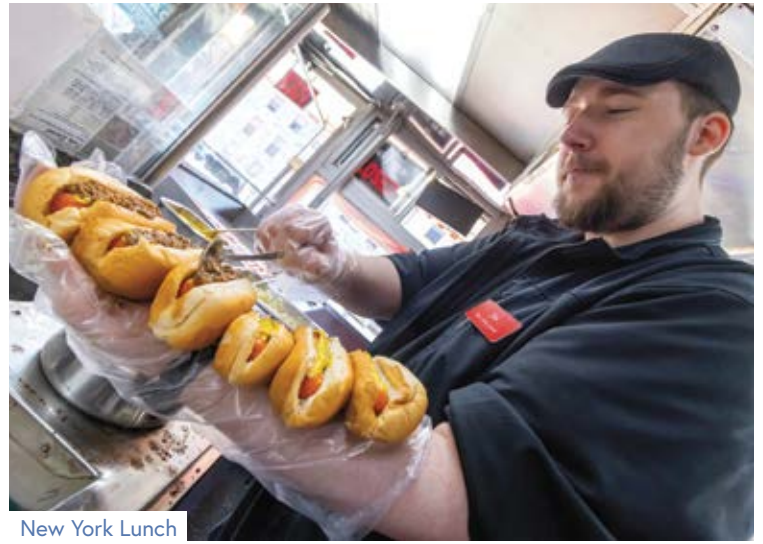

Woonsocket is a city of factories that is almost perfectly divided by the mighty Blackstone River. Many of the buildings were woolen textile mills that made uniforms for the military from the Civil War up to World War II. Today, one manufacturer - Northwest Woolen Mills - still operates and is the largest woolen blanket manufacturer in America, making army blankets and emergency relief blankets used all over the world.

Visitors interested in this type of history should note that the ingenious "Ghost Army" tanks used during World War II were, in fact, manufactured here in Woonsocket. More importantly, you will not want to miss the **Veterans Memorial Museum**. This impressive space houses one of the largest collections of military artifacts in RI and includes weapons, uniforms, medals and readiness gear from the Revolutionary War to today's military.

In the city's Market Square district, the immigrants' story is masterfully told through immersive exhibits at the **Museum of Work & Culture**. See the lives of these people from a farmhouse in Quebec to their work, school, and church life here in Blackstone Valley. Market Square also boasts several acclaimed restaurants including **River Falls**, **Christopher's Kitchen**, and the famous 100-year-old **Ye Olde English Fish & Chips**.

Cross the street and take a peek at the **Thundermist Dam**. These natural falls with a 30' drop show just how powerful the Blackstone River can be. Prior to the Industrial Revolution, this area was primarily inhabited by the Nipmuc and Pokanoket Native Americans and the term Woonsocket may be derived from a Native American term meaning "thunder in the mist."

For theater and music, head further down Main Street to see who may be playing at the famous jazz & blues club, **Chan's**, or catch a performance at either the **Stadium Theatre** or **Rhode Island Stage Ensemble**.

Your trip to Woonsocket (or Rhode Island for that matter) won't be complete without seeing the stunning fresco paintings at **St. Ann Arts & Cultural Center**. Take a tour to hear the incredible story of this decommissioned church and how it is rightfully described as "America's Sistine Chapel."
