A subsidiary is a business that Ngāti Toa owns more than half of (over 50%). This means we have control over the company's direction and decisions. Subsidiaries are usually part of our wider group of companies, working closely with us to achieve iwi goals.







GUARDIANS OF THE MOANA

Safeguarding Ngāti Toa fisheries legacy for future generations.

Ika Toa Limited is the asset-holding company for Ngāti Toa Rangatira fisheries settlement assets. Acting on behalf of Te Rūnanga o Toa Rangatira Incorporated, the company manages Annual Catch Entitlements (ACE) from the iwi settlement quota and safeguards these taonga for future generations. While Ika Toa does not fish directly, it plays a vital role in maintaining Ngāti Toa presence and influence across the fisheries sector - ensuring our resources are used wisely and sustainably.



TWO GOALS, ONE VISION

Generating sustainable returns while upholding our cultural responsibilities.

The company's purpose is twofold: to manage the sale of ACE derived from the iwi quota, and to hold and protect these fisheries assets for the long-term benefit of Ngāti Toa. Ika Toa focuses on strong stock management and strategic industry relationships that generate sustainable commercial returns while supporting customary fishing rights. This careful balance between economic performance and cultural responsibility ensures that iwi assets continue to benefit both current and future generations.

Partnerships that connect cultural responsibility with real-world impact.

Ika Toa strength lies in its partnerships — with industry, government, and other Māori fisheries organisations. These relationships create pathways for Ngāti Toa to influence marine management, build industry credibility, and ensure our voice is heard on matters that affect the moana. The company's activities generate revenue that supports iwi development.

Shaping the future of marine management through iwi leadership and influence.

Ika Toa is strengthening its role as "watcher and protector" of Ngāti Toa iwi rights and obligations in the moana. The company's future vision is to ensure that consultation with Ngāti Toa becomes central to all policy and decision-making on maritime issues.

PULSE OF WELLBEING


Nearly 40 years of keeping our whānau strong – Ora Toa leads with care, culture, and connection.



The name Te Āhuru Mōwai — meaning "a sheltering haven" — was gifted by Tā Matiu Rei of Ngāti Toa Rangatira, who served as both Chairperson of Te Āhuru Mōwai and Chief Executive of Te Rūnanga o Toa Rangatira. His gift embodies the kaupapa of warmth, protection, and belonging — a reminder that every whare built is part of a wider vision for whānau wellbeing.



Housing is just the start. Whānau can access financial mentoring, community events, social services and other support from the likes of Pataka Kai and Te Umu ki Rangituhi. This wraparound approach builds stronger, safer neighbourhoods where everyone feels supported to succeed.



INNOVATION IN ACTION

Te Āhuru Mōwai leads with innovation - piloting solar access power, internet tamariki programmes, swimming lessons and neighbours group initiatives. Te Āhuru Mōwai developments intentionally smaller scale, weaving beautiful new social homes into existing mixed tenure communities. It's social housing, the iwi way - practical, inclusive, and future-focused.



HOMEGROWN AND PROUD

Ngāti Toa vision for housing – homes built with heart, not just hands.

Te Āhuru Mōwai is Aotearoa's largest Māori-owned Community Housing Provider – right here in Porirua. Managing nearly 1,000 homes aiming to build more in the years to come, it stands as a beacon of iwi-led housing success. Its name, meaning "a sheltering haven," perfectly captures its Kaupapa: to provide warm, dry, safe homes and empower whānau wellbeing.





BY IWI, FOR ALL

Not just houses – pathways for all whānau to grow, connect, and thrive.

Established by Te Rūnanga o Toa Rangatira in 2020, Te Āhuru Mōwai was created by iwi to serve all whānau in need. They go beyond property management – offering social housing, kaumātua housing, and discounted rentals. Every decision is grounded in Kaupapa Māori values, ensuring Manaakitanga and Aroha are woven into the heart of every home.



WHĀNAU SATISFACTION

Te Āhuru Mōwai continues demonstrate strona community trust, highlighted 2025 Whānau by the Satisfaction Survey. Of the 376 whānau who took part, an impressive 88% reported overall satisfaction with the service. Whānau also feel well-supported, with 91% knowing their Relationship Manager and 84% satisfied with the support they receive.



Communication remains a major strength, with 83% rating it as good or great. These results reflect Te Āhuru Mōwai commitment to manaakitanga, transparency, and whanaungatanga. The feedback shows that whānau value both the quality of the service and the relationships built, reinforcing the importance of iwi-led housing grounded in kaupapa Māori values.



Through their housing developments, Te Āhuru Mōwai also creates jobs and upskilling opportunities for locals and local trades. From builders, plumbers, and electricians to landscaping and maintenance crews. Te Āhuru actively supports Ngāti Toa and other local suppliers. Te Āhuru Mōwai invests in local employment and businesses to build the pride and prosperity of local whānau and tamariki.



WORKING WITH TRUSTED ADVISORS

Tiaki Toa Limited partnered with Willis Towers Watson and Melville Jessup Weaver to help set up the insurance captive. Willis Towers Watson has guided the project through the application process and will manage claims during the early stages. Melville Jessup Weaver, as the company's actuaries, carried out the pricing and risk analysis to make sure the structure is financially strong and meets all regulatory requirements.





CUTTING OUT THE MIDDLEMAN

Traditional insurance models can bleed value through layers of commission and external costs. Tiaki Toa flips the script — taking a not-forprofit approach that keeps money where it belongs: within the iwi. Every dollar saved strengthens Ngāti Toa collective resilience, making protection affordable and ethical.

Tiaki Toa gives Ngāti Toa the power to manage risk on its own terms, balancing financial know-how with cultural integrity. The result? MĀORI-LED COVER FOR MĀORI NEEDS

Insurance that speaks our language – grounded, fair, and fit-for-purpose.

By establishing its own insurance captive, Tiaki Toa aims to develop insurance solutions that better reflect iwi needs. In these early stages, the focus is on the Rūnanga's extensive property portfolio, creating a solid base before exploring wider coverage in future. It's an ambitious but grounded step, building the capability and systems needed to align financial protection with kaupapa Māori values.





FOR MĀORI, BY MĀORI

Tiaki Toa isn't just thinking locally — it's looking to the horizon. The company's model could one day support other iwi, offering tailored insurance solutions grounded in tikanga and shared values. By collaborating across Māori communities, Tiaki Toa helps build collective strength in an industry that often overlooks indigenous perspectives.





RESILIENCE, THE NGATI TOA WAY

Through this initiative, Ngāti Toa is laying foundations for an insurance approach shaped by iwi goals rather than market norms. Tiaki Toa is still beginning its journey, but this investment builds future capability and sets the iwi on a path toward greater security and confidence.



Tiaki Toa literally means "to protect with strength," and that's exactly what this entity represents. It's not just about insurance policies; it's about embodying the values of kaitiakitanga and manaakitanga in every decision. Tiaki Toa stands as both shield and quardian - a testament to what iwiled enterprise can achieve when guided by purpose and people.



A flagship development shaping the future of Porirua living.

At the heart of Toa Developments is Kenepuru Landing, a six-stage new urban community development in Porirua. Stages 1 and 2 are complete, showcasing a well-planned neighbourhood. Housing in Stages 3A and 3B are now available for purchase, offering a mix of options from modern apartments and terraced houses to stand-alone family homes.







Development and transport working together for a thriving region.

Ngāti Toa and Greater Wellington Regional Council have signed a ground lease for a 1.6-hectare site near Kenepuru Hospital to deliver a new Metlink bus depot. The partnership balances our development aspirations with the transport needs of our growing community. TDL will prepare the site with earth and stormwater works before the lease begins in 2027. The bus depot is expected to be operational in early 2028.



TOA DEVELOPMENTS





COMMUNITY-FOCUSED DEVELOPMENT

Toa Developments (TDL) was established in 2022 as a small, in-house business to manage Ngāti Toa land and building investments. From its flagship subdivision of over 700 homes at Kenepuru Landing to the refurbishment of the Waitangirua Medical Centre, TDL delivers projects that add value to the suite of community assets and through place-based community infrastructure and housing solutions.



A community-first facility rooted in iwi values and local enterprise.

Set for completion in early 2026, the new Early Childhood Centre at Kenepuru Landing represents TDL's commitment to building strong communities. Designed to accommodate up to 80 tamariki, this modern facility will provide a nurturing learning environment for local whānau. The land and building will be retained by the iwi, ensuring community benefit and ongoing rental income for Ngāti Toa. The project has proudly engaged eight iwi trades throughout its construction, an example of how development can support local enterprise.



INVESTING IN OUR LAND AND PEOPLE

The last 3 years has seen TDL form strong relationships with both Regional and City Council leadership, as well as enabling lucrative procurement opportunities for lwi trades and suppliers. TDL development approach is led by tikanga, taiao and a Ngāti Toa vision for a healthy, thriving and prosperous iwi, while ensuring delivery, strong financial returns and other benefits to our whānau.







THREE SITES, ONE KAUPAPA

Our network stretches across the lower North Island, giving whānau and builders easy access to reliable materials wherever they're working. Each branch plays a vital role in Ngāti Toa housing ecosystem, ensuring steady supply, regional coverage, and fair pricing. Together, we keep the build process moving smoothly from coast to capital.

Prenail Paraparaumu Ngāti Toa timber fabrication hub, creating high-quality frames, trusses, and mid-"cassette" floor systems for homes and commercial builds across Kapiti and Wellington. Each piece is built for speed, strength, and code compliance. With skilled staff and smart tech, the team delivers efficiency and craftsmanship in one package.

It's business done the iwi way: purposeful, sustainable, and community-first.





BUILT FOR AOTEAROA

These homes use locally sourced materials and simple, low-tech solutions, making them easy to build, maintain, and adapt. The show home in Pāuatahanui proves the concept, and the system is ready to roll out nationwide.



SMART PANELS, SIMPLE DESIGN

With a library of 16 panel types, Toa Homes offers incredible design flexibility. Each panel is pre-made and stored at the factory, ready to go the moment a design is confirmed—saving time, reducing waste, and cutting costs on every build.



SMARTER HOUSING, BETTER LIVING

Clever homes built for comfort, culture, and community.

Toa Homes is a joint venture between Ngāti Toa Rangatira and How We Live Investments Ltd, providing high-quality homes that are warm, healthy, and energy-efficient. Their homes are built using an innovative panel system designed for both performance and affordability.







BUILT FAST, BUILT RIGHT

All panels, plus highperformance windows and doors, arrive on site in a single delivery. This modular, LEGO-style system means a home can be assembled and made weather-tight within days, speeding up construction and lowering costs for whānau.



HOUSING THAT HEALS

Poor housing leads to poor health — Toa Homes flips that on its head. Their homes help reduce asthma, improve sleep, and boost learning outcomes for tamariki. Warm, dry, and quiet living improves lives, especially for whānau left behind by the traditional housing market.







SUSTAINABLE BY DESIGN

Less waste. More impact.

The panels are purposefully engineered to be low-waste and low-carbon, supporting a healthier planet as well as healthier homes. They're made from timber and recycled wood materials, insulated with recycled glass wool, and lined with versatile plywood that can be painted, stained, or plastered to achieve any look. It's a smart, sustainable system that reduces emissions while keeping quality high and costs low.







HOMES THAT SAVE YOU MONEY

Save up to 93% on heating and cooling.

Toa Homes' panels keep warmth in and the cold out, cutting heating and cooling costs by 87–93%. That means real savings every year — money that stays with whānau instead of disappearing into power bills. Better insulation and smarter design create comfortable, low-cost living that supports wellbeing and reduces financial stress. It's clever, sustainable housing that pays for itself over time.







TRIAL BY WATER

The WaiOra six-month pilot is already in motion. Based at a wastewater treatment plant, the trial uses a closed-loop system where all treated water stays within the facility — no discharge, no risk. The goal? To see how Horizon4 performs under New Zealand conditions and prove that sustainable systems can be powerful, safe, and scalable.





RETHINKING WASTEWATER

Aotearoa's wastewater infrastructure is ageing fast — and fixing it old ways will cost billions of dollars nationwide. Horizon4 flips the model: It provides a localised solution to dealing with wastewater - the quality is high enough to then discharge into storm water drains.





FUTURE HOMES, FUTURE FLOWS

If the pilot proves successful, Horizon4 could power iwiled housing projects like Kenepuru Landing, helping families and councils meet environmental goals. Down the line, treated water may irrigate gardens, biosolids could fuel local energy systems, and the model could expand across Aotearoa.







TURNING WASTE INTO WAIORA

Innovation that flows – from wastewater to WaiOra.

WaiOra Ltd is on a mission to protect our environment through smarter wastewater solutions. This new venture is a partnership with Optimos Solutions Ltd, a wastewater-technology specialist, to reshape how Aotearoa treats its wastewater. Together, we are taking a bold step toward restoring balance to the natural world guided by innovation and care for Papatūānuku.









MEET HORIZON4: TINY PLANT, MASSIVE IMPACT

A modular marvel that's redefining wastewater treatment.

WaiOra Ltd is piloting a smart, compact wastewater treatment system called Horizon4 — designed to transform how our communities manage water. Unlike traditional plants that are large and energy intensive, Horizon4 is small, energy-efficient, and low on greenhouse gases. It's clean tech that fits anywhere and works everywhere. There is potential to look at its use outside of housing, such as in rural applications.





A SMARTER WAY TO PAY

Relying on land intensive, energy hungry treatment plants will be eased by Councils adopting localised solutions like Horizon4. WaiOra calls it "Treatment as a Service" where innovation replaces infrastructure.



NEXT UP: SCALING THE DREAM

If the trial proves what WaiOra expects, the next stage is commercialisation. That means new plants, new jobs, and new revenue — all while cutting development levies and boosting social and environmental returns. It's not just a business plan; it's a movement toward cleaner, more resilient communities.





CLEAN WATER, CLEAR FUTURE

At its core, WaiOra is about harmony — between technology and nature. people and purpose. It's kaupapa that flows а with manaakitanga and kaitiakitanga, proving that the cleanest future is one where science and culture walk side by side. A cleaner tomorrow starts with what we value today.





BUILDING ON OUR LAND, STRENGTHENING OUR FUTURE

Our property assets represent the physical spaces where our iwi presence is grounded – from commercial buildings and residential housing to development blocks and business leases. These properties generate income, provide housing, and create spaces for community and enterprise.

Managing them well means protecting our whenua while ensuring it continues to serve our people for generations to come.







THE BUSINESS OF BELONGING

Every property strengthens both our people and our future.

Ngāti Toa commercial property portfolio is about building futures. Each site carries the iwi kaupapa: balancing commercial return with whānau wellbeing. From Porirua to Wellington, these spaces serve as living examples of rangatiratanga, where economic strength meets social purpose.







HEALTH AND COMMUNITY FACILITIES

Hauora made local, accessible, and grounded in iwi care.

A significant portion of the portfolio supports essential health and community services. The iwi owns three medical centres in Waitangirua, Takapūwāhia, and Cannons Creek. Alongside general practitioner services, these centres host nurse clinics and pop-up initiatives for immunisations and screening. The Cannons Creek site also includes a dental clinic.





COMMERCIAL PROPERTY











WHĀNAU HEALTH & SUPPORT HUBS

Spaces shaped for whānau, connection, and everyday wellbeing.

At 20–24 Ngatitoa Street, a cluster of iwi-owned properties provides space for a range of hauora services, including Tamariki Ora, Manawa Kaha, and community health hubs. Te Puna Wairua, a hub for hapū māmā, operates from an iwi-owned site on Mungavin Avenue, Cannons Creek. Other key sites, such as 2 Ngatitoa Street and 17 Arawhata Street, continue to host important iwi and community services.







A REFLECTION OF IWI VALUES

Our values live in every building we create.

Together, these properties are physical expressions of Ngāti Toa values and aspirations. Each site strengthens the social and economic fabric of the Porirua community, ensuring that iwi resources serve both present and future generations while embodying the kaupapa of whai mana mō te iwi.





PLAYING THE LONG GAME

Buying the DSPs wasn't cheap — Ngāti Toa borrowed funds to make it happen. That means there won't be big profits for about 25 years, but once those loans are paid off, the rental income flows for life. It's a move that's as strategic as it is cultural — building enduring wealth for future iwi generations.





WHENUA WITH WAIRUA

As one iwi leader put it, the DSP purchase is "more than a business transaction." It's about reclaiming whenua and reaffirming Ngāti Toa as kaitiaki. Each property represents a promise kept—to protect the land, uplift our people, and ensure tamariki and mokopuna continue to thrive through education and connection.



EYES ON TOMORROW

DSP Assets are a long-term play for intergenerational prosperity. While schools and other agencies use the land now, those leases will eventually end — and Ngāti Toa will decide how each space evolves. It's not just ownership; it's stewardship, ensuring the whenua continues to serve iwi and community for centuries to come.







THE POWER OF DEFERRED DREAMS

From Treaty tables to tangible whenua – DSPs turn promises into property.

The Ngāti Toa Deferred Selection Properties (DSPs) come straight from the 2014 Treaty settlement, giving the iwi the chance to buy back specific Crown-owned lands at a discounted rate. Most are then leased back to the Crown — a smart way to reclaim whenua while creating long-term stability. Each site represents more than real estate — it's about restoring mana over our lands, one property at a time.

STRATETIC PROPERTY



THE CLASSROOM CONNECTION

The Ministry might teach on it – but the whenua belongs to Ngāti Toa.

Ngāti Toa now owns the land beneath 67 schools across the Wellington region — 40 in Porirua and the northern suburbs, 27 in the Hutt Valley. The Ministry of Education still runs the schools but now leases the land from the iwi, making Ngāti Toa the Ministry's biggest landlord. A few sites outside education are still in negotiation, but the groundwork is laid for an incredible legacy.





FOR OUR MOKOPUNA

This kaupapa embodies tino rangatiratanga in action — honouring the past, empowering the present, and protecting the future. It's not just about wealth, but wellbeing — ensuring that mokopuna will one day stand tall on land that carries their whakapapa and their name.





SAFE AS HOUSES

DSP Assets gives Ngāti Toa one of the most stable income bases of any iwi business — steady, low-risk, and reliable. That consistency lets the iwi take bold steps elsewhere, investing in new ventures that carry higher growth and greater impact. It's the perfect blend of security and strategy.





CHOSEN WITH CARE

Each DSP property was hand-selected bv iwi negotiators — a blend of heart and strategy. Some sites hold deep whānau memories. others were picked purely for long-term gain. Together, they form a living map of Ngāti Toa future — whenua reclaimed, revalued, and reimagined.





AFFORDABLE HOUSING

More than houses —they're whānau foundations.

Ngāti Toa has a portfolio of residential property that supports the wellbeing of our iwi, particularly our kaumātua and whānau in need of affordable housing. These properties reflect our commitment to manaakitanga, providing affordable homes within our rohe for our people to live well with the support of their whānau and iwi.



CARING FOR OUR WHANAU IN NEED

Housing designed with aroha and intention.

By investing in these homes and offering them at subsidised rates, the iwi is actively addressing housing challenges, easing financial burdens, and creating stable environments for our people to thrive. These properties are part of a broader social infrastructure that strengthens Ngāti Toa as an iwi, ensuring our members are cared for, connected, and supported within their own rohe.





WHERE WISDOM RESIDES

Our kaumātua homes reflect deep manaakitanga in action. These whare provide warmth, comfort, and proximity to community, helping our elders remain connected to their whānau, whakapapa and marae.



A complex at 26 View Road provides 24 apartments. This development offers safe and comfortable homes. While these apartments are ultimately available for purchase, we are currently offering them to iwi members at reduced market rental rates until ownership transitions are complete.



RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY



BUILDING INFLUENCE

A housing spectrum that meets whānau where they're at.

Our aspiration is to have a meaningful presence and influence across the full housing spectrum - Transitional, Social, Affordable, and Market housing. By engaging in each of these sectors, the iwi can provide pathways that respond to the varying needs of our people, from those seeking immediate shelter and stability, to whānau ready for home ownership.





OWNING OUR FUTURE

Every Ngāti Toa home stands as a symbol of rangatiratanga — our right to self-manage, self-build, and self-care. By investing in housing that serves iwi needs first, we're building a future where economic, social, and cultural independence go hand in hand.





WHĀNAU ACROSS THE ROHE

There are a small number of other homes owned by the Rūnanga that are rented at reduced market rates to iwi whānau. These homes ensure that whānau remain close to marae, iwi networks, and local mahi — staying grounded in the places that shape their identity.





LAKE VIEWS AND GOOD COMPANY

Whitby Lakes Retirement Village sits at the centre of the Whitby community, overlooking the lake and parklands. Its mix of villas and apartments is supported by a purpose-built Lifestyle Centre with a pool, spa, gym, café, and library—creating a social hub for residents. Every detail is designed to foster independence and belonging in a serene, supportive setting.





DESIGN THAT FEELS LIKE HOME

Silverstream Lifestyle Village in Northwood, Christchurch is AEGIS's flagship community — a safe, social space with 49 premium villas. Each home features modern design, heated floors, and sun-filled layouts. At its heart is the Lifestyle Pavilion — gym, pool, spa, library, and theatre — where residents connect daily. It's independent living with a boutique touch and a sense of whanaungatanga.



Across BeGroup and AEGIS villages, residents enjoy the best of both worlds — independence and support. Amenities like heated pools, gyms, cafés, and community lounges foster social connection and active living. The design philosophy is simple: comfort, choice, and manaakitanga at every turn.





WHEN IWI AND INDUSTRY WORK AS ONE

BeGroup + AEGIS – two trusted partners in care and community.

Ngāti Toa holds a 23.25% share in BeGroup Investments II LP and a 67% stake in AEGIS Retirement Living Ltd. Together they operate and manage high-quality retirement communities that blend commercial strength with social purpose. These relationships allow the iwi to deliver trusted, resident-centred care while building long-term economic resilience.



INVESTING IN RETIREMENT

Quality, comfort, & community for an aging Aotearoa.

As Aotearoa's population ages, the demand for quality retirement options continues to grow. Ngāti Toa investment in the retirement living sector positions us to respond to this trend, contributing to the availability of well-designed, professionally operated living options for older people in our communities. This mahi reflects our long-term vision — creating spaces where wellbeing, independence, and connection thrive together.

BeGroup



Ngāti Toa involvement in aged care is as strategic as it is values-driven. Income from these ventures supports housing, education, and health projects that benefit whānau across the rohe. It's a living example of how kaitiakitanga and enterprise can work handin-hand to grow our collective future.



FROM COMMUNITY TO CAREER

Whitby Lakes and Silverstream create employment and career opportunities in care, catering, and facilities management. These pathways help build a future workforce rooted in aroha and service.



OUR LEGACY IS CARE

Ngāti Toa is helping shape how our wider communities care for elders. Through Toa Rangatira Retirement Villages, the iwi is laying foundations for sustainable, inclusive, and culturally attuned retirement living. Each investment is a commitment to kaitiakitanga — protecting wellbeing today while nurturing tomorrow's generations.





GOLDEN DOWNS FORESTS

Golden Downs East and West stretch across more than 33,000 hectares southeast of Nelson. Managed by OneFortyOne, these forests are now into their fourth rotation — a sign of sustainable, long-term care. Every harvest cycle is guided by strong environmental standards, ensuring the land stays healthy for generations to come.



QUEEN CHARLOTTE CONNECTIONS

Queen Charlotte Forest, in the Marlborough Sounds, is managed by Tāhuhu Forestry Ltd. The forest is approx. 1,500-hectares. The neighbouring forest land is owned by Te Ātiawa o te Waka-a-Māui, and both iwi have an interest in the associated barge site at Onapua bay.



TAONGA WHENUA

Ngāti Toa whenua includes a wide range of culturally significant lands returned through settlement. From Kapiti Island to Waitangirua Farm, each site represents a bond between people and place.





ROOTS OF RESPONSIBILITY

Where whenua meets mahi, we grow prosperity that lasts generations.

Ngāti Toa Rangatira forestry assets trace back to Treaty settlement lands — forests licensed to commercial operators, while iwi retain ownership of the whenua itself. This partnership model balances kaitiakitanga with smart, sustainable growth. It's a shared vision: caring for the land while creating work and wellbeing for our communities.





WHITIREIA ACQUISITION

A gift once given, now returned – the circle of mana restored.

Ngāti Toa purchased 53 hectares of whenua at Whitireia from Radio New Zealand. This milestone restores iwi ownership of whenua first gifted by Ngāti Toa in 1848 to the Anglican church for the education of their children, a promise that was never fulfilled.





GROWING MORE THAN TREES

OneFortyOne manages around 80,000 hectares across Te Tauihu, harvesting responsibly and creating hundreds of local jobs. Beyond timber, they nurture skills, training, and environmental leadership. Their partnerships with Ngāti Toa, Te Ātiawa, and Ngāti Tama show how iwi and industry can thrive side by side.



HEART OF THE PEOPLE

Ngāti Toa marae and urupā are owned by the iwi and cared for by local whānau. These spaces remind us that while the world changes, our foundations — whenua, whakapapa, and whānau — remain steady.



WHITIREIA LEASE ARRANGEMENT

While ownership of Whitireia has returned to Ngāti Toa, all existing lease arrangements will continue but have now been transferred to the iwi as part of the acquisition. This includes the leases to RNZ, DOC and part of the Titahi Bay Golf Course.



PARTNERSHIPS THAT GROW POTENTIAL



An associate is a business where Ngāti Toa owns less than half (under 50%). This means we don't have control over how the business is run, the main decisions are made by the majority owners. However, we can still share our views, and benefit from the business's success. Associates allow us to stay connected and involved in areas that support our wider iwi goals, without taking on full responsibility for day-to-day operations.



700 HOMES AT KENEPURU

One of Rangituhi Number 1's most exciting projects is helping develop land at Kenepuru Landing, with plans for more than 700 homes. It's a powerful statement of iwi leadership — building spaces where people can live, grow, and belong.

Rangituhi Number 1 is the Ngāti Toa's ESG fund — a future-focused investment platform that grows our iwi prosperity while caring for people and the planet. It's about backing good kaupapa like renewable energy, social housing, and sustainable industries, so every dollar invested helps shape a better world for our mokopuna.
