



Creating a piece of work is an organic process - a subconscious collecting of things which percolates for a long time before any making begins.


Ideas come from random combinations of materials or marks, interesting structures, patterns and textures in nature or sometimes a piece of music. New work comes from a slow assimilation of these things, layering them together as thoughts until it feels right to start work.



Drawing and mark making are really important and using combinations of paints inks dyes and other materials I make a visual vocabulary of gestures motifs and textures.

I like to improvise. It keeps things fresh and being unsure of an outcome means I can re-invent and re-assemble. It's an experimental way of working that I love. The unplanned and unexpected always throws up exciting results





I want to make work that you can re-visit and discover something different each time so I rarely have more than a sketchy plan to start with. I like to let it develop in the making and allow the process to suggest things along the way.

The floating artworks are a perfect means of expression that give me freedom to innovate and produce pieces that couldn't be created any other way. The mix of materials and the way they interact lifts the work from the surface creating depth and subtlety to the finished piece.
