Package:

£14.36 per hour (daytime, Monday - Friday)

£21.54 per hour (before 07:30am and after 16:00pm, after 15:00pm on Fridays)

£28.72 per hour (Sundays and Bank Holidays) + £110 weekly retainer.

Working Pattern: Hours are weather dependant however, majority of gritting takes place throughout evenings and weekends, before 07:30am and after 16:00pm.

Role Purpose

Our Winter Service Gritter Drivers play a vital role in maintaining road safety across Norfolk during the coldest months of the year. When road temperatures drop, these drivers are on the front line helping to ensure safe travel for residents, businesses, and emergency services.

This is your opportunity to be part of a dedicated, responsive team delivering an essential service that directly benefits communities across the county.

- 66 gritting actions carried out across Norfolk
- 145,200 miles of road treated
- 48 gritting routes, each taking up to 3 hours to complete

Key Responsibilities

Route Checks

- Check the route pre-gritting season (October to April) to become familiar with the route and help identify any hazards relating to carriageway restrictions and turn around points.
- Ensure that the vehicle is loaded with an appropriate amount of grit so that the vehicle is not overloaded, but with enough to complete the gritting route without returning to depot.

Vehicle Safety & Maintenance

• Carry out vehicle checks ensuring that there are no defects prior to doing a gritting run. Make sure the vehicle has diesel, oil, the lights and the radio work and the spinner is attached. Responsible for making sure the vehicle is safe to drive and that any defects are identified and rectified before starting a gritting run.

Route Planning

- Making sure the route is feasible and if not pass on any recommendations for changes.
- Respond to call outs in the gritting season 24 hours a day should the roads need to be treated
- Drive the given route ensuring the right amount of grit is spread onto the roads and that any bad patches are made good to ensure the safety of other road users

Key Competencies

Experience: Proven experience as a professional LGV driver.

Qualifications: LGV licence (C+E)

Training: Prepared to attend training to achieve a City & Guilds Winter Service Operation

Certificate (if not already held)

Availability: able to respond and participate in gritting action throughout the winter season on an AM/PM shift pattern, working when weather conditions dictate.
