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ESSENTIAL STEPS IN THE PRE-CONSTRUCTION PHASE



As part of the early planning, we'll also discuss the renovation timeline and any site-specific requirements, such as whether you may need to pack up your belongings or even move out temporarily, depending on the scope of work. Timeline/Scheduling

The timeline and scheduling of your renovation are essential to ensuring a smooth and efficient construction process. At Fairbairn Builders, Jamie and our site managers excel in the management of the site and subcontractors, ensuring that every aspect of the project is executed effectively and efficiently.

One of the tools we use to maintain clear scheduling is a Gantt chart in Buildarprice which is created for each project. This chart maps out key milestones and deadlines, helping us track when subcontractors are due on site and ensuring that work is completed on time. By keeping a clear and structured schedule, we can anticipate potential delays and adjust as needed, keeping your project on track and minimizing disruptions along the way.

Preparing Your Home

Timelines & Scheduling: Keeping Your Renovation on Track

Once your renovation plans are finalised and the contract is signed, we create a detailed schedule using a Gantt chart in Buildaprice. This schedule outlines every stage of the renovation, helping us coordinate trades, inspections, and material deliveries so that everything happens in the right order and within the expected timeframe. Before this, you'll already have received an estimated timeline, but this step refines it based on real-time factors like subcontractor availability, lead times, and council requirements.

Creating a Clear Schedule

Using a Gantt chart allows us to clearly map out the renovation process. This visual timeline tracks progress and helps avoid clashes or delays. It includes:

- Key project milestones (e.g., demolition, structural changes, cabinetry installation)
- Required inspections
- Scheduling of subcontractors

Common Causes of Delays & How to Avoid Them

- **Slow decision-making** Having your selections finalised early helps avoid supply delays. We'll keep you informed in advance of when decisions are needed.
- **Design changes mid-renovation** Alterations can affect timing, especially if plans need to be changed and council approval is required.
- **Weather or material shortages** While some delays are out of our control, we include buffer time in the schedule where possible.
- Repairing your existing home During renovations, it's not always possible to know in advance whether parts of your existing home may require repairs such as rotten framing, outdated electrical work, or other underlying issues. If these are discovered once work begins, they can impact both the timeline and scope of the project.

Contract Works Insurance for Renovations

This type of insurance covers the work being done on your property, including any damage that may occur during the renovation, and provides peace of mind should unforeseen incidents arise. We will remind you to arrange this, and we will require a copy of the insurance certificate before we can commence work.

It's important to note that the renovation timeline is often an estimate, and unexpected delays can occur due to factors such as weather, supply issues, or unanticipated repairs to your existing home. We always recommend allowing extra time beyond the estimated timeline to accommodate potential setbacks. This helps ensure that your renovation is completed without pressure and allows for any necessary adjustments.

Additionally, if your contract works insurance expires before the renovation is finished, it can be costly to renew the policy. By planning for a longer timeline upfront, you can avoid the inconvenience and expense of having to extend or renew your insurance coverage during the project.



Preparing Your Home for Renovation

2. Delivery of a Portaloo and Site Office/Storage

For health and safety compliance, we provide essential on-site facilities:

- Portaloo (Temporary Toilet): Ensures hygiene and worker welfare while meeting regulations.
- Site Office/Storage: A designated space for storing plans, documents, and equipment. This keeps the site organized and protects valuable items from weather or theft.

3. Placement of a Bin for Waste Management

Renovations can generate significant waste. To keep the site safe and tidy, we place a dedicated bin for general waste, and we also encourage waste segregation to separate recyclable materials. Regular waste removal helps maintain a clean, hazard-free work environment.



4. Ensuring Clear Access

Proper site access is critical for smooth operations. This involves:

- Ensuring driveways and pathways remain unobstructed for tradespeople, delivery vehicles, and machinery.
- Establishing designated parking and unloading zones.
- Protecting surrounding properties and public spaces from potential disruptions.

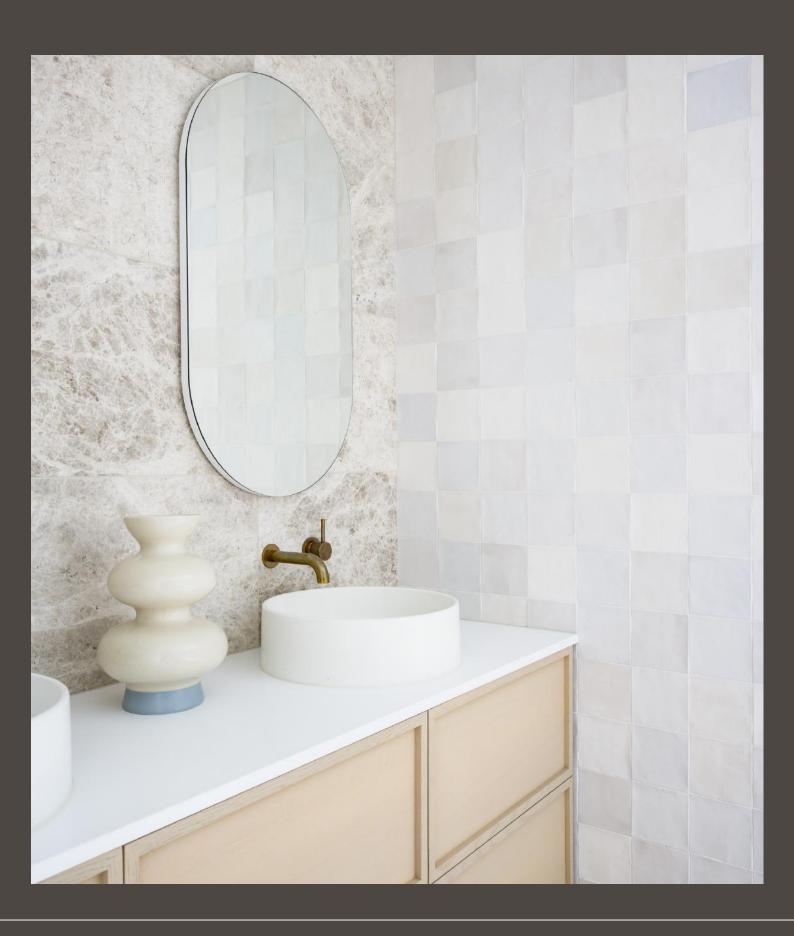


7. The Possibility of Moving Out
