

Praying together is a powerful act of solidarity. It is where love becomes real, tangible, and transformative."



Dear Siblings in Christ,

As Presbyterians, we often use the language of the "connectional church" to describe our life together, but in nearly twenty years of ordained ministry I have never seen that phrase take on flesh and bones the way it has in the last month in Western North Carolina.

On September 27th Hurricane Helene brought unimagined devastation to our area. In Asheville, two major commercial districts were destroyed within hours, large areas of the city were covered with downed trees, vital infrastructure was washed away, and the water supply system sustained catastrophic damage. Before we as residents even understood the extent of the damage, help from our Presbyterian siblings was on the way. Immediate supplies like generators and water and cleaning products filled important needs while local stores were closed. Financial gifts, which have been generous beyond any expectation, are helping to meet longer-term needs such as home repair, rental assistance, and disaster-related bills.

We have been humbled by the raw natural power of Hurricane Helene. We have been even more humbled by the outpouring of support and care from neighbors near and far, and especially from the saints in Christ who are our Presbyterian siblings. Thank you for your gift to the FPC-A Helene Relief Fund.

The session is committed to using these funds in the most efficient and effective way we can. Our hope, especially, is that we can fill gaps in government and large foundation funding so that no family or community is left behind in the recovery. We give thanks to God for you, and pray that you will be enriched in every way by your generosity.

THANK YOUS

A WORD OF THANKS FROM VICTOR DESOUSA

Our lives came to an abrupt stop, when our family was just hit by a sudden tragic event that shook us to the core. This ship we call "our lives" was capsized, hit by an evil rogue wave that left us upside down in an uncharted ocean... underwater....unable to function and struggling to breathe. While still feeling its very raw impact, eroded by grief, Vania's words came drenched in tears " Dad, we need the church. We need to go to church". I must confess that I am not containing my tears as I am writing this. I am as I have many times said not fighting them anymore. Not embarrassed or ashamed of them. I agree with Paulo Coelho when he says that "tears are nothing more than just words. Poems yet to be written".

So we did. And there it was. The moment we walked in the sanctuary, we felt it even stronger than ever before. But this time the Holy Spirit manifested itself through the congregation. To them I say directly "we felt it coming through your words....through your expressed thoughts....we felt it through your prayers.....through your smiles and tears you offered for comfort.....we felt it through your hand shakes andespecially your hugs. When the weight of our grief became too heavy to bear, you allowed us to lay a piece of it upon your shoulders. That provided us with some respite". "You are indeed a great congregation, and Vania and I are so blessed that you welcomed us as family. We feel blessed to be a part of it"!

If only the expression "Thank you" was large enough to involve the depth of our gratitude....but it is not. So I choose to use the Portuguese word "Obrigado" instead. "Obrigado" in its root means that you are indebted for life to those who extend such a Grace to you. It means that you are forever obliged to return that grace to them in kind and equal measure.
