## A Letter From . . .

## Greetings...

Wow! What a year. It has been a true honor and privilege to watch this network grow and take shape. Fiscal 2023 marked a year of immense growth in membership, infrastructure and programmatic offerings. We added 441 members this year and 152 new organizations putting us at 769 members and 328 organizations to date.

Last July, we implemented a new digital platform which houses all of the CSN membership, fair and guest data, workshop registration, volunteer sign up, surveys, etc. And we began using Asana, a project management tool, to help keep up with the fair growth and demand. Both were big tasks to build but their value has been immeasurable in the ability to capture, track and access data quickly. We hosted our second Nonprofit Connect in January and could not have asked for a better community response. We met capacity and had to turn folks away to keep the fire marshals happy.

We developed and launched our Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Justice and Resilience program for our membership community, hosting five trainings in partnership with YWCA's Social Justice Program and Pause at Work Resilience program. Many trainings met capacity and we'll continue this program in fiscal 2024. Our monthly education program overall saw a 66% spike in attendance with a waitlist for the opportunity to present. Our weekly email list continually receives a 10/10 read rate (compared to national data), with members emailing weekly to share their gratitude for the updated community information. In August, plans are in development to hire a Health-focused Community Engagement Specialist in partnership with CareOregon to further develop our combined health outreach, social determinants of health focused offerings at events and provide a direct connection to Medicaid members in community to ask questions, provide feedback and support. Finally, our incredible Steering Committee, which has helped to guide this ship since the beginning, has grown by two new members and has evolved into an Advisory Board. And we have added a new outside member to the CSN Board.

Growth and development are the name of the game, and we are only here because the community has voiced a need through their participation in our network. We do not take this honor lightly. We look to the future with excitement and a deep commitment to provide value-add offerings to those who directly serve our most vulnerable communities. We are honored to work in partnership with such incredible humans.





# **A New Partnership**

In Fiscal 2024, the CSN will partner with **CareOregon** to pilot the addition of a **Health Outreach Engagement Specialist** position to the CSN. This individual will add a health lens to all CSN offerings and be a liaison to community for members to help address confusion. They'll also increase education and access as it relates to the Oregon Health Plan and the social determinants of health to partners who work directly with our more vulnerable community populations.


