


I wanted to start the Juvenile section of the society so that I could walk with my friends regardless of outfit, and to provide a space that shows younger members that they are an important part of the society.

To be HDBS means to be accepted and not have to suppress your uniqueness because we join together to celebrate bonfire.











VE 80 Tunnel Celebration


It was a unique, evocative and fitting occasion where once again, the members of HDBS did the community proud

Animal Welfare Tips

We want everyone to enjoy our bonfire celebrations on Saturday 11th October, including our animal friends. Local vet and animal behaviourist Vicky Payne has some advice to help you keep your animals safe this bonfire night.

Cats and Dogs

- Calming plug-in diffusers, collars with herbs or pheromones, or herbal supplements should be started before the date to help calm your dog or cat (a vet can advise you).
- Make sure you have walked your dog before dusk. Avoid letting them out for toilet breaks between 7pm and 10pm as there may be loud bangs.
- Make sure your cat is shut indoors well before dark. Prepare a cozy den where your dog can hide away, close curtains, put the lights on,
- and have music or the TV on as a distraction. Cats are more likely to hide away so prepare a snug den for them with their favourite snacks and toys. If you have a dog that is afraid of fireworks, stay in with them and try doing
- something they love to take their mind off things such as playing a game, hunting for treats, grooming, or just snuggling on the sofa. Act normally to help keep your dog calm.
- If your dog is very scared of fireworks ask your vet for medication that can be given on the night, or take a trip out of the area for the evening. **Small Pets**

Outdoor caged pets like rabbits and guinea pigs should be under cover all evening. Indoor small pets may appreciate being moved to the quietest part of the house.

Livestock and Horses

- Ensure livestock is in a paddock with safe and secure fencing, and check them before and after the display. Housed livestock may be more at risk if they panic and should be monitored.
- Horses are often safer outdoors than shut in a stable, but the paddock should have safe, secure fencing. Rugs and boots are a sensible precaution.
- A radio may help soothe stabled horses and ear plugs/muffs are available to dull the sound. Herbal calmers in the feed may be appropriate and your vet can advise on sedation if required. Horses should be monitored during the display.

Lastly, please do not bring your pets to bonfire night, it will be loud and crowded, and they will be much happier curled up at home.

By supporting organised displays, which publish the dates and location of the event, the impact on animals can be managed and reduced.

The role includes acquiring materials, such as handles, hessian, fuel, wire, staples etc. I arrange torch making sessions and oversee the volunteers as they make the torches, ensuring everyone is working safely. I also do the calculations for our night, working out how many torches are needed, how much fuel is needed and liaise with team to plan the distribution of torches to our procession members.

As well as lilaising with the Event Team, I work most closely with the Captain of Barrels. They need to know how many discarded torches there will be, and where they are likely to be dropped. We need to plan where points will be along the route, to ensure everyone involved has fun and stays safe.









The fun part for me is seeing the end result, a river of fire twisting through our High Street.

I love the social aspect of creating the torches with an army of volunteers, and it keeps us in touch through the summer months.

You'll see me as a smuggler on our night, but at some out meetings, I do like to get my Day of The Dead costume and make-up out.


