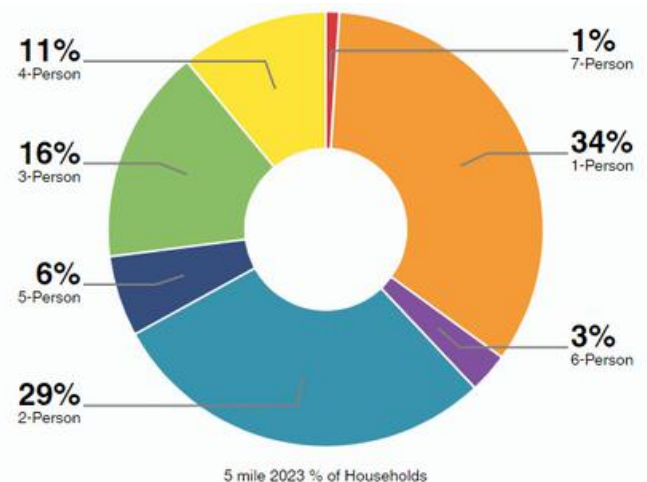

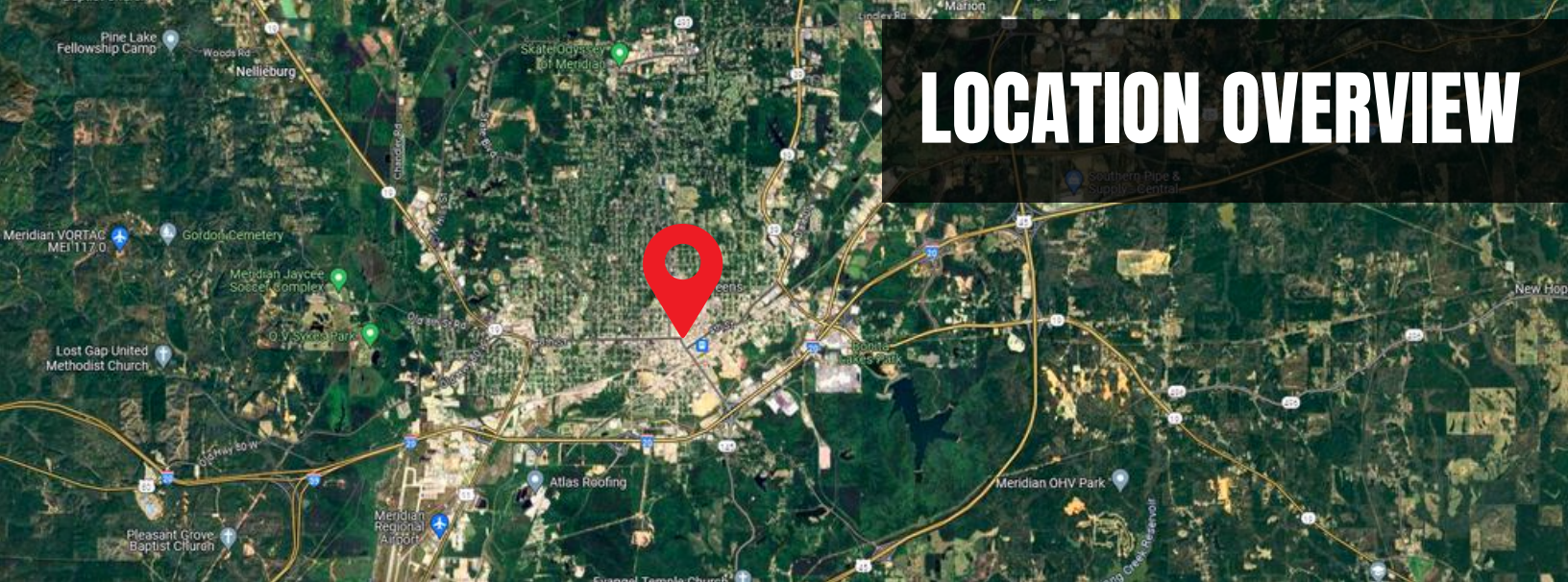

LOCATION OVERVIEW



HIGHWAY ACCESS

Interstate 20 (I-20): Runs east-west and connects Meridian to major cities such as Jackson, Mississippi (to the west), and Birmingham, Alabama (to the east). I-20 is a crucial corridor for cross-country travel and freight movement, making Meridian an important stop along the route.

Interstate 59 (I-59): Runs northeast-southwest, merging with I-20 in Meridian for a significant portion of the route. I-59 provides direct access to New Orleans, Louisiana (to the southwest), and Chattanooga, Tennessee (to the northeast), further enhancing Meridian's connectivity.

U.S. Highway 11 (US 11): Parallels I-59 and serves as an alternative route through the region. US 11 runs from New Orleans, Louisiana, to the Canadian border, passing through Meridian, and offering access to smaller towns and rural areas.

U.S. Highway 80 (US 80): Also parallels I-20 and connects Meridian to eastern and western parts of the state, extending from Texas to Georgia. US 80 historically played a vital role in regional transportation and continues to serve local traffic.



AIRPORT PROXIMITY

Meridian Regional Airport (MEI): Located approximately 3 miles southwest of downtown Meridian, MEI is the primary airport serving the city. It offers commercial flights, primarily operated by United Airlines through a regional carrier, connecting to hubs like Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport (DFW).

Jackson-Medgar Wiley Evers International Airport (JAN): Located approximately 90 miles west of Meridian in Jackson, Mississippi. As the largest airport in Mississippi, JAN offers a broader range of commercial flights to major cities across the US, including Atlanta, Houston, and Charlotte.

Birmingham-Shuttlesworth International Airport (BHM): Located approximately 150 miles east of Meridian in Birmingham, Alabama, BHM serves as a hub for multiple airlines and provides more options for travelers looking for non-stop flights to destinations across the country.

Hattiesburg-Laurel Regional Airport (PIB): Located approximately 90 miles south of Meridian, near Hattiesburg, Mississippi provides flights primarily through American Airlines to hubs like Dallas/Fort Worth International Airport.

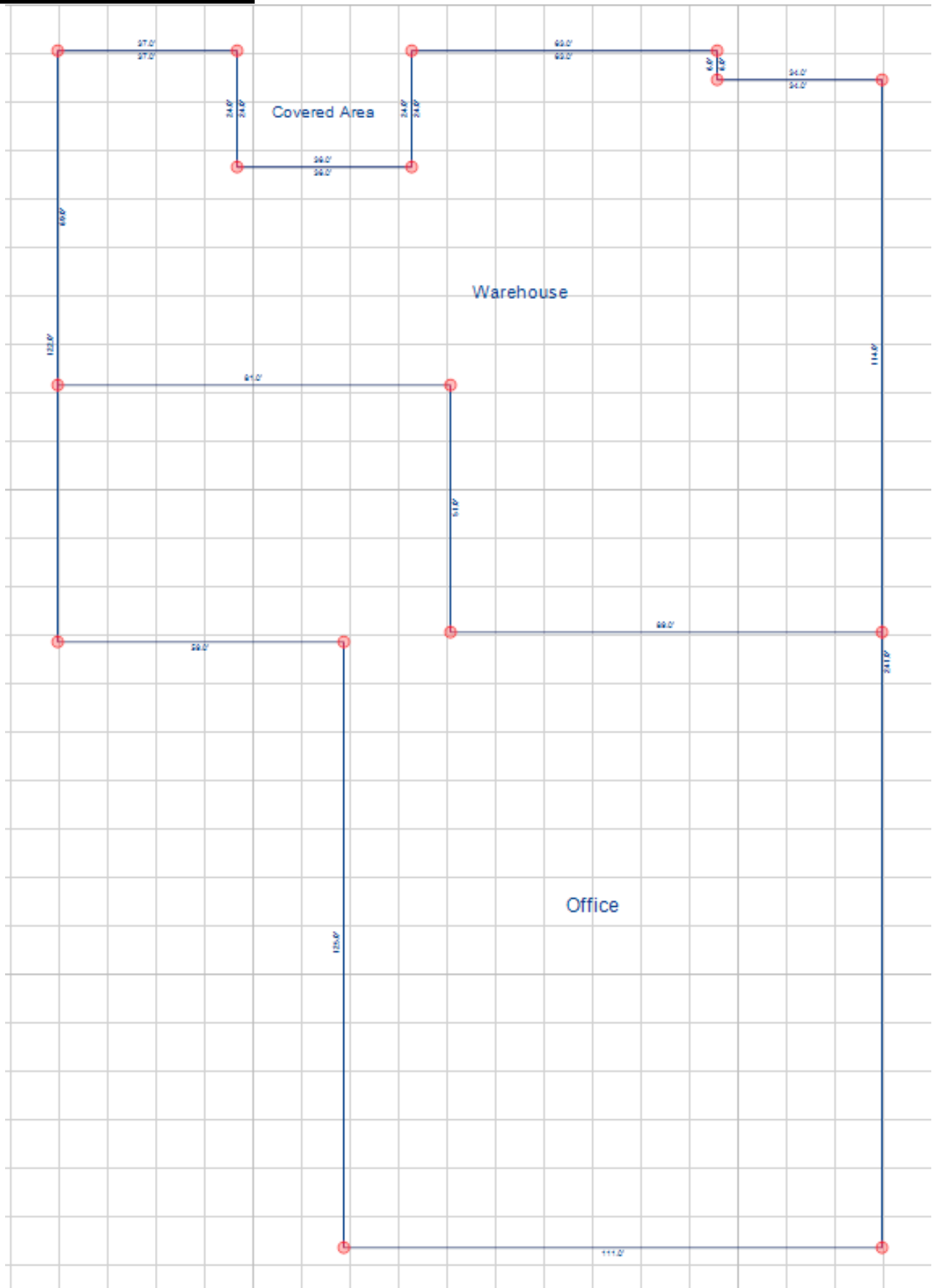

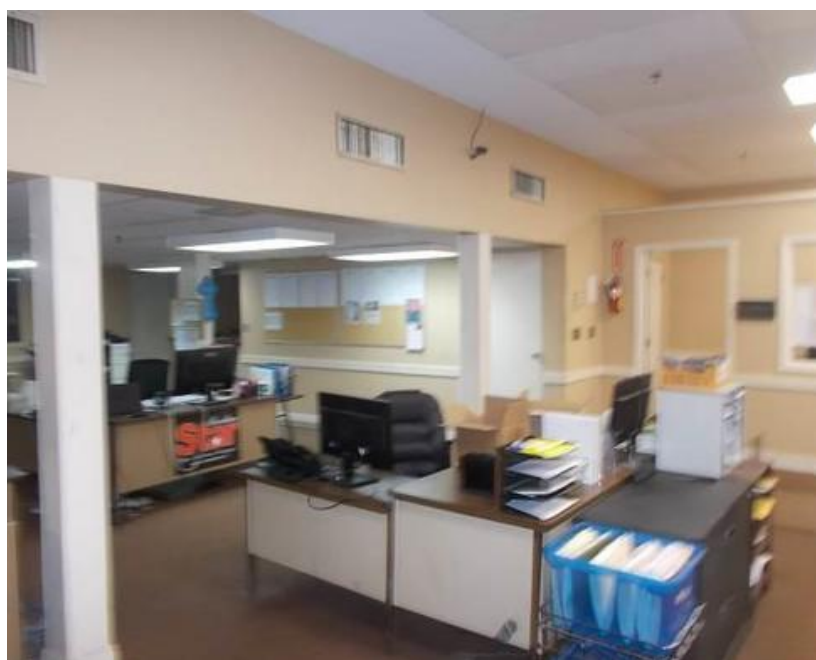
PARCEL MAP
