

Boarding

When students board at Sidcot School, they join a friendly, family community where they can live, work and play, secure in the knowledge that they are valued and well cared for.

We have four recently renovated boarding houses set within our 150-acre countryside campus. Our boarding houses are overseen by experienced, dedicated staff consisting of a Houseparent, Deputy Houseparent, House matrons, and tutors. They know how daunting it can be for students to live away from home and do everything they can to support our students and help them settle into life at Sidcot School.
